5 COMMISSIONER DEELEY: Good
6 morning. I call the March 30th, 2022
7 meeting of the Philadelphia City
8 Commissioners to order.

9 First, I will preserve the
10 order and decorum of these meetings.
11 Everyone in attendance should be on
12 notice that shouting out or interrupting
13 the proceedings will not be tolerated.
14 Those who violate this will be asked to
15 leave. The Sunshine Act permits anyone
16 attending a public meeting to object to a
17 perceived violation at any time during
18 the meeting. If you choose to do so,
19 please succinctly state your objection.
20 Objecting is not an opportunity for
21 speechmaking.

22 We will now move to public
23 comment. Commenters shall state where
24 they live or, if they are not a resident

1 of Philadelphia, that they are a
2 Philadelphia taxpayer. Public comment is
3 not an opportunity for dialogue or Q&A.
4 It's public comment, a chance for you to
5 tell us what you think.

6 Each speaker shall have two
7 minutes. However, I may extend this time
8 at my discretion. All public comments
9 must be relevant or germane to board
10 business. Finally, it is my
11 responsibility to preserve the order and
12 decorum of these meetings. As such,
13 profane, slanderous, discriminatory, or
14 personal attacks will not be tolerated.
15 Please note that we will be doing polling
16 place changes later in the meeting, so
17 anyone wishing to be heard on polling
18 place changes should wait until that
19 time.

20 Is there anyone here for public
21 comment?

22 MR. GARELLA: Good morning. I
23 have a comment. It does relate to
24 polling place changes, but not to any

1 particular polling place, so...

2 COMMISSIONER DEELEY: Proceed.

3 MR. GARELLA: I just want to --
4 my name is Rich Garella. I'm from
5 Protect Your Vote Philly. I live in
6 South Philly.

7 So it seems that I think you're
8 going to vote on some polling place
9 changes today, and I know that as far as
10 I know, that you've done the legal
11 minimum of notifying, posting and so
12 forth in the divisions, but I'd like to
13 make a suggestion that you do a little
14 bit more than the legal minimum and maybe
15 post on the website when you announce
16 these meetings coming up what the polling
17 place changes are. So you put up
18 something on Twitter saying there's a
19 meeting today, but that announcement
20 doesn't link to the agenda that's posted
21 on the website.

22 So far, for example, when
23 you've been posting the agendas, they're
24 posted on a pretty obscure spot on the

1 website. As far as I've seen, you've
2 never included a link to the agenda on
3 any meeting announcements such as on
4 Twitter or anywhere else, and it's on the
5 agenda that in this case the list of
6 polling places to be changed is. So it
7 seems like it would be helpful to the
8 public to go -- to extend yourselves a
9 little bit farther to tell people what
10 polling place changes are going to be
11 voted on at a given meeting. Since you
12 do know that in advance, why not, you
13 know, go ahead and give people a little
14 better chance to find out so that they
15 could have their input.

16 COMMISSIONER DEELEY: Thank
17 you.

18 MR. GARELLA: Thank you.

19 COMMISSIONER DEELEY: We will
20 now move to Commissioner Bluestein for
21 e-mailed public comments.

22 COMMISSIONER BLUESTEIN: There
23 were no e-mailed public comments as of
24 9:45 a.m. this morning.

1 COMMISSIONER DEELEY: We will
2 now proceed to old business. I call on
3 Garrett Dietz to read the report from
4 Executive Director Joe Lynch.

5 MR. DIETZ: Good morning,
6 Commissioners.

7 COMMISSIONER DEELEY: Good
8 morning, Garrett.

9 COMMISSIONER BLUESTEIN: Good
10 morning, Garrett.

11 MR. DIETZ: First, I'll start
12 with the report from my office, the
13 County Board of Elections.

14 A Special Election has been
15 called for the office of District
16 Council, 6th District, to occur during
17 the General Primary on May 17th. For
18 those interested in running for this
19 office, pertinent nomination paperwork
20 must be filed by 5:00 p.m. on Thursday,
21 April 7th. Candidates for major and
22 minor political parties need to file a
23 nomination certificate packet and be
24 nominated by their party bylaws.

1 Candidates for political bodies need to
2 file nomination paper packets, and this
3 paperwork is available in my office, Room
4 142, and it's also been posted on our
5 website at Philadelphiovotes.com.

6 As of yesterday, we have
7 processed all paper ballot applications
8 received through Monday and are up to
9 date with electronic ballot applications.

10 We have approved 70,492
11 vote-by-mail applications for the
12 Primary, which is 2,372 added from last
13 week's total. Of those applications
14 processed so far, 43,787 are paper
15 applications and 26,705 are electronic
16 applications.

17 Next will be the report from
18 the Voter Registration Unit. For the
19 election cycle to date, we have processed
20 80,887 registration applications, of
21 which 5,459 were paper. Last week we
22 sent out 8,369 voter ID cards, for a
23 total of 50,758. All units except for
24 Documents are working primarily on the

1 mail-in apps. They are also processing
2 registration apps and what mail-in apps
3 come in. Documents are making street
4 list districts, full ward sets, and
5 working on the mail. This week we had a
6 bunch of petitioners, and they are still
7 coming in.

8 Next is the report from the
9 Election Board Unit. 607 poll workers
10 did online training. They have 5,095
11 confirmed poll workers. They left
12 messages for 723 potential poll workers.
13 There are 1,759 poll workers who they
14 have confirmed are not going to work.
15 The in-person trained overall is 907, and
16 total scheduled for in-person training is
17 1,142.

18 Finally, we have a lot of newly
19 elected poll workers with no contact
20 number, so unfortunately we are unable to
21 confirm if they are indeed working or
22 not.

23 And that's it for my report.

24 COMMISSIONER DEELEY: Thank

1 you, Garrett.

2 Is there anyone here for public
3 comment with regard to polling place
4 change?

5 (No response.)

6 COMMISSIONER DEELEY: Okay. We
7 will move on to new business. We have
8 Charlie Stroman with polling place
9 relocations.

10 MR. STROMAN: Good morning,
11 Commissioners.

12 COMMISSIONER DEELEY: Good
13 morning, Charlie.

14 MR. STROMAN: First, a little
15 update with the polling places. As of
16 right now this morning, we have 708
17 polling locations. We're waiting for 10
18 more responses, for a total of 17
19 divisions. So moving along very well in
20 that regard.

21 Now I'll move to the polling
22 place changes. The first one is in the
23 48th Ward and the 38th Division, moving
24 from Penrose School to Eastwick

1 Recreation Center.

2 COMMISSIONER DEELEY: The
3 reason?

4 MR. STROMAN: Voter
5 convenience. That was one of the
6 requests I got.

7 COMMISSIONER DEELEY: I motion
8 that we approve the proposed move for the
9 Ward 48, the Division 38.

10 COMMISSIONER SABIR: Second.

11 COMMISSIONER DEELEY:
12 Commissioner Bluestein, please call the
13 roll.

14 COMMISSIONER BLUESTEIN:
15 Commissioner Deeley.

16 COMMISSIONER DEELEY: Aye.

17 COMMISSIONER BLUESTEIN: I vote
18 aye.

19 Commissioner Sabir.

20 COMMISSIONER SABIR: Aye.

21 COMMISSIONER DEELEY: Proceed.

22 MR. STROMAN: The next two will
23 be in the 44th Ward, the 6th Division and
24 the 15th Division, moving from the

1 Salvation Army in West Philadelphia to
2 Lenexa Daily Childcare IV at 28 North 52nd
3 Street, and that they both are for voter
4 convenience. Willie Jordan, the
5 democratic ward leader, requested that.

6 COMMISSIONER DEELEY: I motion
7 that we approve the proposed moves, 44th
8 Ward, 6th Division and 44th Ward, 15th
9 Division.

10 COMMISSIONER SABIR: Second.

11 COMMISSIONER DEELEY:
12 Commissioner Bluestein, please call the
13 roll.

14 COMMISSIONER BLUESTEIN:
15 Commissioner Deeley.

16 COMMISSIONER DEELEY: Aye.

17 COMMISSIONER BLUESTEIN: I vote
18 aye.

19 Commissioner Sabir.

20 COMMISSIONER SABIR: Aye.

21 COMMISSIONER DEELEY: Proceed.

22 MR. STROMAN: The next four
23 will be in the 51st Ward. I'm going to
24 do the 51st Ward, 2nd Division and 51st

1 Ward, 7th Division. They both are going
2 to move for -- requesting a move from
3 Mastery Hardy Williams Charter School
4 back to the Kingsessing Library for voter
5 convenience. Greg Benjamin, democratic
6 ward leader, requested this change.

7 COMMISSIONER DEELEY: Charlie,
8 51-2, according to my note, is moving
9 from Mastery Hardy Williams Charter
10 School to Kingsessing?

11 MR. STROMAN: Yes.

12 COMMISSIONER DEELEY: And 51-5?

13 MR. STROMAN: Well, that's
14 coming from a different place. So I just
15 put 2 and 7 together because --

16 COMMISSIONER DEELEY: Oh, I
17 didn't see the 7 on here. I'm sorry.
18 It's at the bottom. I apologize.

19 MR. STROMAN: That's all right.

20 COMMISSIONER DEELEY: Sorry.

21 Continue.

22 MR. STROMAN: That's all right.

23 COMMISSIONER DEELEY: I motion
24 that we approve the proposed moves of

1 51st Ward, 2nd Division, 51st Ward, 7th
2 Division.

3 COMMISSIONER SABIR: Second.

4 COMMISSIONER DEELEY:

5 Commissioner Bluestein, please call the
6 roll.

7 COMMISSIONER BLUESTEIN:

8 Commissioner Deeley.

9 COMMISSIONER DEELEY: Aye.

10 COMMISSIONER BLUESTEIN: I vote
11 aye.

12 Commissioner Sabir.

13 COMMISSIONER SABIR: Aye.

14 COMMISSIONER DEELEY: Proceed.

15 MR. STROMAN: The next change
16 will be in the 51st Ward again in the 5th
17 Division, coming from Comegys School to
18 the Kingsessing Library. Again, for
19 voter convenience. Greg Benjamin,
20 democratic ward leader, requested this.

21 COMMISSIONER DEELEY: I motion
22 that we approve the proposed move, 51st
23 Ward, 5th Division.

24 COMMISSIONER SABIR: Second.

1 COMMISSIONER DEELEY:

2 Commissioner Bluestein, please call the
3 roll.

4 COMMISSIONER BLUESTEIN:

5 Commissioner Deeley.

6 COMMISSIONER DEELEY: Aye.

7 COMMISSIONER BLUESTEIN: I vote
8 aye.

9 Commissioner Sabir.

10 COMMISSIONER SABIR: Aye.

11 COMMISSIONER DEELEY: Proceed.

12 MR. STROMAN: The last one will
13 be again in the 51st Ward, the 6th
14 Division, moving from Calvary United
15 Methodist Church to the Kingsessing
16 Library, for voter convenience. Greg
17 Benjamin, the democratic ward leader,
18 requested this.

19 COMMISSIONER DEELEY: I motion
20 that we approve the proposed move, 51st
21 Ward, 6th Division.

22 COMMISSIONER SABIR: Second.

23 COMMISSIONER DEELEY:

24 Commissioner Bluestein, please call the

1 roll.

2 COMMISSIONER BLUESTEIN:

3 Commissioner Deeley.

4 COMMISSIONER DEELEY: Aye.

5 COMMISSIONER BLUESTEIN: I vote
6 aye.

7 Commissioner Sabir.

8 COMMISSIONER SABIR: Aye.

9 MR. STROMAN: That's all I
10 have, Commissioners.

11 COMMISSIONER DEELEY: So we
12 have a unanimous vote to approve the
13 following changes: 40th Ward, Division
14 38; 44th Ward, Division 6; 44th Ward,
15 Division 17 -- 15. I'm sorry. 51st
16 Ward, Division 2; 51st Ward, Division 5;
17 51st Ward, Division 6; and 51st Ward,
18 Division 7.

19 Commissioner Bluestein, do you
20 have any items to be added to today's
21 agenda?

22 COMMISSIONER BLUESTEIN: I have
23 none.

24 COMMISSIONER DEELEY:

1 Commissioner Sabir, do you have any items
2 to add to today's agenda?

3 COMMISSIONER SABIR: Yes.

4 First, I'd like to say I see my mother in
5 the crowd, my children in the crowd. I
6 used to play basketball on the basketball
7 court right there. I used to swim in the
8 swimming pool right here. So I'd like to
9 thank you, Madam Chair, for having these
10 meetings out here.

11 COMMISSIONER DEELEY: Thank you
12 so much.

13 And we're so happy to see you.
14 Just a beautiful way to start the
15 morning. Thank you so much for coming.
16 Appreciate it.

17 With no items remaining on the
18 agenda, this meeting is adjourned to the
19 call of the Chair.
