4 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: Good morning. Today is Wednesday,  
5 May 5, 2021. I would like to call to order the Philadelphia  
6 City Commissioners Board of Elections meeting.

7 We will begin with public comments. Commenters shall  
8 state where they live, or if they are not a resident of  
9 Philadelphia, that they are a Philadelphia taxpayer.

10 Public comment is not an opportunity to dialogue or Q  
11 and A. It is public comment, a chance for you to tell us  
12 what you think. Each speaker shall have two minutes;  
13 however, I may extend the time at my discretion.

14 All public comments must be relevant or germane to  
15 Board business. Finally, it is my responsibility to  
16 preserve the order and decorum of the meeting. As such,  
17 profane, slanderous, discriminatory or personal attacks will  
18 not be tolerated.

19 Anyone wishing to offer public comment, please step  
20 forward.

21 MR. GARELLA: Good morning, Commissioners. My name is  
22 Rich Garella. I'm a taxpayer in Philly. For the past few  
23 weeks, you've probably noticed that I've been pointing out  
24 that the Board fails to give the public a reasonable  
25 opportunity to comment on its business by not providing any

1 kind of agenda or announcing beforehand what you will be  
2 meeting to discuss.

3 I notice that Chair Deeley, in your rules for public  
4 comment, you even mention that comments have to be germane  
5 to Board business, yet the public doesn't know what that  
6 business is going to be when the time of public comment  
7 period ends.

8 Now, last week we mentioned that the Law Department  
9 says that the notification to citizens was sufficient.  
10 Whether or not that's the case, and we don't think it is, we  
11 don't really understand why this Board would be looking for  
12 ways to give the public the least possible notification  
13 rather than trying to give the public the most possible  
14 notification.

15 I mean, why look for a way to avoid doing this, when we  
16 could be looking for ways to bring the public in, tell the  
17 public what you're up to, give them a chance to comment on  
18 the business that's at hand so that they can truly  
19 deliberate on the business that's in front of you. Thank  
20 you.

21 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: We will now move to a report from  
22 the Secretary, Commissioner Sabir for e-mailed public  
23 comments.

24 COMMISSIONER SABIR: Good morning.

25 CHAIRMAN DEELEY: Good morning.

1           COMMISSIONER SABIR: There were no public comments  
2           emailed by approximately 5:30.

3           CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: Thank you. We will now proceed to  
4           old business with a report from our executive director, Joe  
5           Lynch.

6           MR. LYNCH: Good morning, Commissioners.

7           CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: Good morning, Joe.

8           MR. LYNCH: County Board report today, absentee and  
9           mail-in ballot applications must be received by May 11th  
10          except for active military members, their spouses, and  
11          bedridden veterans. Voted ballots must be received by close  
12          of polls on Election Day, 8 pm, May 18th.

13          The County Board of Elections office at City Hall, Room  
14          130 is open for walk-in voting. Our hours are Monday  
15          through Friday, 9 am. to 5 pm through Election Day. For  
16          those interested, please enter City Hall through the south  
17          gates across from the Ritz-Carlton Hotel. Voters that need  
18          a replacement ballot can order one at  
19          ballotform.philadelphiavotes.com or pick up a replacement  
20          ballot at our City Hall office.

21          As of yesterday, we have approved 80,013 absentee and  
22          mail-in ballots for shipment for the primary. Of those,  
23          59,290 are from paper applications, and 20,723 are from  
24          electronic applications. We have produced and sent 79,173  
25          absentee and mail-in ballots so far. We have received

1 24,410 voted ballots.

2 Second Friday pre-primary reports, also known as Cycle  
3 2 campaign finance filings, are due Friday. This report  
4 should show all activity through May 3rd. Copies of reports  
5 are required to be filed with the County Board of Elections  
6 by all judicial candidates appearing on the ballot that  
7 reside in Philadelphia and all political committees and  
8 lobbyists that have made expenditures to influence the  
9 election of such candidates. Reports are also required to  
10 be filed with the County Board for District Attorney and  
11 City Controller candidates.

12 Voter Registration, for the election cycle we have  
13 processed 118,022 applications, of which 9,600 were paper.  
14 Data and Imaging are cleaning up the small amount of  
15 applications coming in from other counties as well as  
16 proofing all processed apps. Both units are processing mail  
17 in ballot applications. Correspondence unit is filing paper  
18 applications.

19 County Board of Elections, to date the unit has trained  
20 2,994 board Workers, 6,293 workers committed to working on  
21 Election Day. There are 2 make up training seminars left to  
22 do. One is Tuesday May 11th at the Carpenter's training  
23 hall. Class times are 2:00, 4:00 and 6:00 pm, located at  
24 10401 Decatur Rd. The other make up class will be held at  
25 the United Lutheran Seminary located at 7301 Germantown Ave

1 on Saturday May 15th and the hours will be 9:00 am, 11:00  
2 am, 1:00 pm and 3:00 pm. Also, the on-line training is  
3 provided to poll workers at [training.philadelphiavotes.com](http://training.philadelphiavotes.com).

4 Election activities and polling places, Election  
5 Activities unit should be receiving the sample ballot sheets  
6 today. Once they receive them, they will prepare them for  
7 the boxes along with any that have been requested by the  
8 public.

9 Polling place units are currently hanging signs  
10 throughout the City for any changes that took place this  
11 cycle. This cycle, there were 77 changes. Thank you.

12 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: Thanks, Joe. I do want to make one  
13 correction at the beginning. The County Board of Elections  
14 office at City Hall is in Room 140.

15 MR. LYNCH: Thank you.

16 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: Thank you.

17 Now we will proceed to a report from Deputy Nick  
18 Custodio.

19 MR. CUSTODIO: Good morning, Commissioners.

20 As of this morning, we have scheduled 24 staffed mobile  
21 ballot drop-off events. The times and locations are also  
22 available on [philadelphiavotes.com](http://philadelphiavotes.com).

7 These are in addition to our 24/7 mail-in ballot drop  
8 boxes and the Board of Elections Office at City Hall, Room  
9 140. Voters may only drop off their own ballot, unless the  
10 voter is physically unable to personally submit their  
11 Absentee or Mail-in Ballot and has designated an agent to  
12 deliver their ballot, and the completed forms are submitted  
13 with the ballot.

14 On Tuesday, the Court of Common Pleas approved nine  
15 emergency polling place changes. New voter registration  
16 cards will mailed to every household in the divisions which  
17 changed polling places for this primary, including these  
18 nine. Our staff will also hang signs in the division to let  
19 the public know.

20 17-1, 17-4 and 17-12 will be moved from Morris Estate  
21 Recreation to Mount Airy Church of God in Christ.

22 54-8 is moved from Solis Cohen Little Schoolhouse to  
23 Northeast Regional Library.

24 54-17 and 54-18 is moved from Solis Cohen School to  
25 the Solis Cohen Little Schoolhouse.
