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2 PROCEEDINGS

4 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: Good morning. I call  
5 the meeting of May 12th, the Philadelphia City  
6 Commissioners, Board of Elections to order. We  
7 will now move to public comment.

8 Just let the record reflect that  
9 Commissioner Sabir is here via telephone.

10 We will now move to public comment.  
11 Commenters shall state where they live or if  
12 they are not a resident of Philadelphia, that  
13 they are a Philadelphia taxpayer. Public  
14 comment is not an opportunity for dialogue or Q  
15 and A. It is public comment, a chance for you  
16 to tell us what you think.

17 Each speaker shall have two minutes,  
18 however I may extend this time at my  
19 discretion.

20 All public comments must be relevant or  
21 germane to Board business.

22 Finally, it is my responsibility to  
23 preserve the order and decorum of the meeting.  
24 As such, scandalous, discriminatory or personal

1 attacks will not be tolerated.

2 Anyone wishing to offer public comment,  
3 please step forward.

4 MS. McCARTHY: Good Morning,  
5 Commissioners. My name is Murielle McCarthy  
6 with Protect Our Vote Philly. I'm a resident  
7 of Philadelphia.

11 MS. McCARTHY: Thank you.

12 Hi. I'm Murielle McCarthy with Protect  
13 Our Vote Philly. I'm a resident of  
14 Philadelphia.

15 I'm here today to ask you to abide by the  
16 Election Code regarding the duplication of  
17 ballots.

18 During the June canvass, I reported to you  
19 in a July letter that the ballots were not  
20 duplicated correctly. At the November canvass,  
21 I observed the same thing.

22 Multiple conversations took place between  
23 myself and the deputy about not following the  
24 law.

1           My colleague, Rich Garella, spoke with  
2 Commissioner Sabir who asked about that  
3 statute -- the requirements that all damaged  
4 ballots must be marked with matching serial  
5 numbers and the duplicated ballots must be  
6 marked as such.

7           I'm here to ask you to duplicate ballots  
8 correctly this time from the outset of the  
9 canvass.

10           With regard to the ballots, we noted back  
11 in June that the Board was not present when  
12 voting machines were opened and the inspection  
13 didn't take place before the canvass, as  
14 required by Department of State. This is a  
15 repeat of what happened in the June primaries.

16           These laws were passed by the legislature  
17 to protect the integrity of our elections, to  
18 make sure that every vote is counted as cast by  
19 the voter and to protect ballot secrecy. The  
20 procedures were clear. Frankly, it's testing  
21 who does not seem to want to follow them.

22           We ask that you abide by the laws and the  
23 rules so that duplicated ballots are properly  
24 documented and that the requirements for the

1 use of the voting machines are followed. Thank  
2 you.

3 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: We will now move to a  
4 report from the secretary -- I'm sorry, I  
5 apologize.

6 MS. GARELLA: Good morning. My name is  
7 Rich Garella with Protect Our Vote Philly.

8 We've noticed also that the Board is  
9 instructing poll workers in its video training  
10 and online guides to let voters vote  
11 provisionally when 50 percent or more of the  
12 machines in the division are down. That's a  
13 violation of the 2008 injunction from the U.S.  
14 District Court and NAACP of Pennsylvania,  
15 represented by Public Interest Law Center  
16 versus Secretary Pedro Cortés, resulting in a  
17 directive from the Secretary of State.

18 The court order and the Secretary directed  
19 that if 50 percent of the electronic voting  
20 machines in a precinct are inoperable, paper  
21 ballots, either printed or written, of any  
22 foreseeable form for registering votes,  
23 described here as the emergency back-up paper  
24 ballots, shall be distributed immediately to

1 eligible voters, pursuant to Section 1120 AB of  
2 the Election Code.

3 Emergency back-up paper ballots should be  
4 used after, until the County Board of Elections  
5 is able to make the necessary repairs to the  
6 machines or is able to place into operation a  
7 suitable substitute machine.

8 So here, I have copies of the court order  
9 and the directive, which is also posted on the  
10 Department's website.

11 The difference between provisional ballots  
12 and emergency back-up ballots is that emergency  
13 ballots must be marked as such in a further  
14 directive collected separately from provisions.  
15 They are not subject to disqualification,  
16 because these voters have already proved  
17 themselves eligible. Their votes must be  
18 counted automatically.

19 The heart of the case is that voters  
20 should not be disadvantaged and risk losing  
21 their franchise because of failures of the  
22 voting equipment.

23 We urge you to follow the court order and  
24 the Secretary's directive and to instruct all

1 poll workers in the proper distribution and use  
2 of emergency back-up ballots.

3 I'll leave the Secretary's directive and  
4 the court order here -- or should I drop it on  
5 the secretary's desk?

6 Thank you.

7 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: We will now move to a  
8 report from the secretary, given by Deputy  
9 Custodio.

10 DEPUTY CUSTODIO: Thank you. There was no  
11 e-mail public comments e-mailed to the Board by  
12 10:45 this morning.

13 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: Thank you.

14 We will now proceed to a deputy report by  
15 Deputy Nick Custodio.

16 DEPUTY CUSTODIO: Good morning,  
17 Commissioners. The 25th mobile ballot drop-off  
18 event after last week's meeting took place on  
19 Saturday, the 8th, from noon to 5 p.m. at  
20 Lincoln Financial, Lot K. It was announced  
21 prior to that, per the Board's motion.

22 Staff are asking the Court of Common Pleas  
23 to approve three more emergency polling place  
24 changes. Once approved, new voter registration

1 ballots will be mailed to every household in  
2 divisions, which changed polling places for  
3 this primary. Our staff is also hanging signs  
4 in the division to let the public know.

5 The divisions are Ward 44, Division 1, 44,  
6 5, 44, 19. All are moving out of the Baptist  
7 Church.

8 1 is moving to Conestoga Rec Center, 5 is  
9 moving to Heston School and 19 is moving to  
10 Simpson Fletcher Conestoga House, Social Room,  
11 2nd Floor.

12 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: Thank you, Nick.

13 We will now proceed to new business.

14 COMMISSIONER SCHMIDT: I have one item,  
15 Madam Chair.

16 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: Excuse me,  
17 Commissioner Schmidt.

18 Let's let the record reflect there's no  
19 executive director report this week, as our  
20 executive director, Joe Lynch, is dealing with  
21 Election Day preparation.

22 Proceed, Al.

23 COMMISSIONER SCHMIDT: Madam Chair, I make  
24 a motion that we approve the absentee and



1 mail-in ballot challenge procedure document  
2 that has been posted on Philadelphiavotes.com  
3 and is available at the public comment table,  
4 as well as the absentee or mail-in ballot or  
5 ballot application challenge form, which is  
6 also online.

7 It's a required procedure process and  
8 forms for challenges to applications for  
9 absentee and mail-in ballots for the 2021  
10 municipal, primary and special election.

11 Challenges that are not submitted in  
12 accordance with the procedures and/or do not  
13 utilize the form will not be considered.

14 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: Second.

15 All in favor?

16 (Ayes.)

17 COMMISSIONER SABIR: My vote is aye, in  
18 favor for the motion.

19 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: Thank you,  
20 Commissioner.

21 I make a motion that we approve the joint  
22 emergency regulations concerning rules and  
23 guidelines for COVID-19 safety at polling sites  
24 on Election Day, May 18, 2021. Document that

1 has been posted on Philadelphiavotes.com and is  
2 available at the public comment table as the  
3 polling place health and safety guidelines for  
4 the 2021 primary and special elections.

5 COMMISSIONER SCHMIDT: I second.

6 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: All in favor?

7 (Ayes.)

8 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: Commissioner Sabir?

9 COMMISSIONER SABIR: I'm in favor of the  
10 motion.

11 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: Thank you,  
12 Commissioner.

13 I also make a motion that we authorize and  
14 deputize the Philadelphia Board of Election  
15 staff to prepare for and conduct a pre-canvass  
16 and canvass of absentee and mail-in ballots at  
17 the Philadelphia Ballot Processing Center.

18 The absentee and mail-in pre-canvass is to  
19 begin on Election Day at 7 a.m. and it to be  
20 conducted in accordance with the Board's  
21 historical practices and procedures, procedures  
22 approved here today, the Election Code and  
23 other applicable law.

24 The absentee and mail-in canvass is to

1 begin on or after 8 p.m. on Election Day and is  
2 to be conducted in accordance with the Board's  
3 historical practices and procedures, procedures  
4 approved here today, the Election Code and  
5 other applicable law.

6 The canvass is to begin on Friday, May 21,  
7 2021 at 9 a.m. Philadelphia Board of Election  
8 staff shall take an oath prior to conducting  
9 the pre-canvass administered by the Board's  
10 executive director and prior to conducting  
11 canvass administered by the Board.

12 COMMISSIONER SCHMIDT: I second.

13 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: All in favor?

14 (Ayes.)

15 COMMISSIONER SABIR: I'm in favor of the  
16 motion.

17 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: I have no more new  
18 business, if anyone as any new business.

19 COMMISSIONER SCHMIDT: I have none.

20 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: Commissioner Sabir,  
21 any new business?

22 COMMISSIONER SABIR: I have none.

23 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: Thank you,  
24 Commissioner.

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1           Having no more old business and no new  
2           business, I make a motion to adjourn.

3           COMMISSIONER SCHMIDT:   Second.

4           CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY:   So moved.

5           This meeting is adjourned to the call of  
6           the Chair.   Thank you.
