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CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: Good morning,
everyone. So first I would like to welcome
everybody to our meeting here and thank the
landlord and the Philadelphia Gas Commission
for allowing us to use this space at 1515 Arch
Street.

I would also like to state that the
agenda was posted to the website 24 hours
before the meeting. I also would like to
state that I will preserve the order and
decorum of these meetings.

Everyone in attendance should be on
notice that shouting out or interrupting the
proceedings will not be tolerated. Those who
violate this will be asked to leave.

The Sunshine Act permits anyone
attending a public meeting to object to a
perceived violation at any time during the
meeting.

1 If you chose to do so, please
2 succinctly state your objection. Objecting is
3 not an opportunity for speech making.

4 We will now move to public comment.
5 Commenters shall state where they live or, if
6 they are not a resident of Philadelphia, that
7 they are a Philadelphia taxpayer.

8 Public comment is not an opportunity
9 for dialogue or Q and A; it is public comment,
10 a chance for you to tell us what you think.

11 Each speaker shall have two minutes.
12 However, I may extend this time at my
13 discretion. All public comments must be
14 relevant or germane to Board business.

15 Finally it is my responsibility to
16 preserve the order and decorum of the
17 meetings. As such, profane, slanderous,
18 discriminatory or personal attacks will not be
19 tolerated.

20 Please note that we will be doing
21 polling place changes later on in the meeting.
22 So anyone here wishing to be heard on the
23 polling place change, please wait until that
24 time.

1 Anyone wishing to offer public comment
2 please step forward. Hearing none, we'll ask
3 Secretary Sabir if there is any public comment
4 emailed.

5 COMMISSIONER SABIR: Thank you, Madam
6 Chair. Good morning. All comments that were
7 emailed by 9:45 a.m. were shared with the
8 Commissioners and the Deputies at 10 a.m. and
9 have been approved by each Commissioner at the
10 beginning of the meeting and are available at
11 the public comment table.

12 We received one comment from Julia
13 Stone. I have reviewed the comment and ask
14 that it be moved into the record.

15 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: Thank you,
16 Commissioner. I have also reviewed it.
17 Commissioner Schmidt?

18 COMMISSIONER SCHMIDT: Yes, I also
19 reviewed it and agree it should be moved into
20 the record.

21 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: Please move this
22 comment into the record. We will now proceed
23 to old business with a report from our
24 Executive Director Joe Lynch.

1 MR. LYNCH: Good morning,
2 Commissioners. Today's Sunshine report for
3 September 15, 2021.

4 County Board of Election report.
5 They're currently accepting absentee or
6 mail-in ballot applications online at
7 vote.pa.gov or by paper application.

8 As of yesterday, they have approved
9 81,821 vote-by-mail applications. Of those,
10 61,447 are paper applications and 20,374 are
11 electronic applications.

12 This is including permanent ballot
13 voters who applied in the Primary. Ballot
14 application processing is up to date.

15 Tomorrow is the last day to file
16 objections with the Pennsylvania Department of
17 State to nomination certificates and papers to
18 those nominated for vacancies created by the
19 revocation of judicial retention candidates.

20 Per state law, we will begin sending
21 absentee ballots to military and overseas
22 voters on Friday.

23 Cycle 4, also known as the Sixth
24 Tuesday Pre-Election campaign finance report,

1 are due to be filed on Tuesday the --
2 September 21st.

3 Cycle 4 campaign finance reports only
4 need to be filed by candidates of a statewide
5 office such as Justice of the Supreme Court,
6 Judge of the Superior Court and Judge of the
7 Commonwealth Court along with any political
8 committee or lobbyist influence in these
9 races.

10 The voter registration update for the
11 election cycle to date. They have processed
12 72,058 applications, of which 4,600 were
13 paper. They have mailed 68,591 ID cards.

14 All applications are up to date. The
15 data unit is still working on returned letters
16 and voter ID cards to be scanned into the
17 system. They also have been checking paper
18 applications.

19 The imaging unit is processing
20 electronic applications, return letters, and
21 doing corrections.

22 Correspondence is working on return
23 letters. Documents unit is working on return
24 letters and mailing appeals and ID cards out.

1 Update on the election board. So far,
2 4,278 board workers have been notified either
3 by email or letter asking them if they would
4 be working this election. 2,681 have
5 confirmed that they will be working.

6 We started the seminars last week. One
7 hundred and twenty people came out last week
8 for the in-person training at the Carpenter's
9 Hall.

10 This week the trainings are at
11 Masterman high school. The online training is
12 also available at
13 Training.philadelphiavotes.com.

14 So far 263 people have done the
15 training online.

16 Warehouse update. All machines were
17 post-election tested, ballots were placed in
18 the "A" machines and the guys are currently
19 laying out and recording the fields.

20 They'll be preparing to start doing
21 testing hopefully by early next week.

22 Vote by mail center. Currently they
23 are running the instruction cards for the
24 mail-in ballots along with the plain English

1 statements. That's all I have, Commissioners.

2 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: Thank you, Joe. I
3 have nothing. Commissioners?

4 We are going to move onto new business.
5 We have Charles Stroman with the polling place
6 relocations. Is there anyone here who would
7 like to speak on behalf of a moving of a
8 polling place? If so, place come forward.
9 Thank you.

10 MR. STROMAN: Good morning,
11 Commissioners. I just want to have a report
12 of the polling places thus far. We just
13 started being aggressive and calling
14 everybody.

15 So as of right now we have 390 places
16 secured. 1,055 divisions out of the 1737.
17 We're moving along pretty well.

18 We have five refusals thus far, which I
19 don't see any issue with trying to find
20 replacements for them.

21 Now I'm going to move onto the polling
22 place changes. So before I start, everyone
23 was notified that needed to be notified of the
24 hearing.

1 So the first hearing would be Ward 3,
2 Division 19. We were at Anderson School,
3 we're going to go back to Caring People
4 Alliance on Catherine Street and we're moving
5 that back into the division.

6 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: I make a motion to
7 approve that move.

8 COMMISSIONER SCHMIDT: Second.

9 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: All in favor?

10 COMMISSIONER SABIR: Aye.

11 COMMISSIONER SCHMIDT: Aye.

12 MR. STROMAN: The next three I'm going
13 to lump together. 07-01, 07-02, and 07-03.
14 Moving from Congreso Education & Training
15 Center to Casa Indiana.

16 This is a new building and we're
17 actually moving into the ward. Fantastic
18 move.

19 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: I vote to approve
20 the move in the 7th ward of the three
21 locations stated.

22 COMMISSIONER SCHMIDT: Second.

23 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: All in favor?

24 COMMISSIONER SABIR: Aye.

1 COMMISSIONER SCHMIDT: Aye.

2 MR. STROMAN: The next one I have is
3 the 7th Ward again. 16th Division move from
4 Elkins School to McVeigh Rec Center. Again
5 another excellent move. We're moving into the
6 division.

7 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: I vote to approve.
8 Do I have a second?

9 COMMISSIONER SCHMIDT: Second.

10 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: All in favor?

11 COMMISSIONER SABIR: Aye.

12 COMMISSIONER SCHMIDT: Aye.

13 MR. STROMAN: The next two moves I'm
14 going to lump together again. 43-08 and 43-19
15 moving from the Cayuga School to the Lenfest
16 Center and all that is moving back to the
17 original location.

18 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: I vote to approve
19 the move of 43-08 and 43-19. Second?

20 COMMISSIONER SCHMIDT: Second.

21 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: All in favor?

22 COMMISSIONER SABIR: Aye.

23 COMMISSIONER SCHMIDT: Aye.

24 MR. STROMAN: Next two moves I have are

1 in the 43rd ward. The 21st division and the
2 24th division. Moving from PGW to Lenfest
3 Center and again that's moving them back to
4 the original location.

5 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: I vote to approve
6 the move for 43-21, 43-24.

7 COMMISSIONER SCHMIDT: Second.

8 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: All in favor.

9 COMMISSIONER SABIR: Aye.

10 COMMISSIONER SCHMIDT: Aye.

11 MR. STROMAN: Next move I have is again
12 in the 43rd ward, 25th division. Move from
13 Hunting Park Rec Center back to the Lenfest
14 Center, again back to the original location.

15 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: I vote to approve
16 the move of 43-25.

17 COMMISSIONER SCHMIDT: Second.

18 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: All in favor?

19 COMMISSIONER SABIR: Aye.

20 COMMISSIONER SCHMIDT: Aye.

21 MR. STROMAN: The next one I have is in
22 the 44th ward, 01 division moving from
23 Conestoga Rec moving back to the Bibleway
24 Baptist Church again back to the original

1 location.

2 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: I vote to approve
3 the move for 44-01.

4 COMMISSIONER SCHMIDT: Second.

5 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: All in favor?

6 COMMISSIONER SABIR: Aye.

7 COMMISSIONER SCHMIDT: Aye.

8 MR. STROMAN: Next one I have again is
9 the 44th ward, the 5th division, moving from
10 Heston School to Bibleway Baptist Church back
11 to the original location.

12 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: I vote to move
13 44-05.

14 COMMISSIONER SCHMIDT: Second.

15 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: All in favor?

16 COMMISSIONER SABIR: Aye.

17 COMMISSIONER SCHMIDT: Aye.

18 MR. STROMAN: Next one I have again in
19 the 44th ward, 19th division.

20 Simpson-Fletcher Senior Apartments to the
21 Bibleway Baptist Church again, back to the
22 original location.

23 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: I vote to move
24 44-19.

1 COMMISSIONER SCHMIDT: Second.

2 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: All in favor?

3 COMMISSIONER SABIR: Aye.

4 COMMISSIONER SCHMIDT: Aye.

5 MR. STROMAN: The next one I have is
6 the 46th ward, 18th division, moving from the
7 Cedarworks Community Center to the Elmwood
8 Community Methodist Church and that would be
9 back to the original location.

10 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: Okay. We've
11 received an emailed public comment about this
12 move. However, it appears that they were
13 confused. The commenter appears to want it in
14 Elmwood. Charlie, can you confirm that it
15 will be moving from Cedarworks to Elmwood.

16 MR. STROMAN: Yes, that's correct.
17 They probably read the sign backwards. It
18 does happen at times.

19 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: That is where they
20 previously voted, correct?

21 MR. STROMAN: Correct.

22 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: Thank you, Charlie.
23 I vote to approve this move.

24 COMMISSIONER SCHMIDT: Second.

1 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: All in favor?

2 COMMISSIONER SABIR: Aye.

3 COMMISSIONER SCHMIDT: Aye.

4 MR. STROMAN: The next one I have is in
5 the 54th ward, 8th division. Moving from
6 Northeast Regional Library to Solis Cohen
7 School, that would be the new school that was
8 just constructed.

9 And I'm saying back to the original
10 location because we were in the schoolhouse
11 and it's right next door to the new location
12 so literally it's the same location.

13 COMMISSIONER SCHMIDT: Can I ask a
14 quick question about it?

15 MR. STROMAN: Sure.

16 COMMISSIONER SCHMIDT: Are they all
17 moving into the same room in Solis Cohen?

18 MR. STROMAN: Yes. It's a gigantic
19 cafeteria, huge, state of the art.

20 COMMISSIONER SCHMIDT: So there's not
21 going to be any issue like --

22 MR. STROMAN: -- no. What I tried to
23 do, Commissioner, instead of having five in
24 the old and five in the new, I tried to put it

1 all together to make it easier for everybody.

2 So that was my goal here.

3 COMMISSIONER SCHMIDT: Thank you,
4 Charlie.

5 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: I vote to approve
6 54-08.

7 COMMISSIONER SCHMIDT: Second.

8 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: All in favor?

9 COMMISSIONER SABIR: Aye.

10 COMMISSIONER SCHMIDT: Aye.

11 MR. STROMAN: I'm going to lump some
12 more together. 54th ward would be the 14th
13 division, 15th division, 16th division, 17th
14 division and 18th division. Solis Cohen
15 Little Schoolhouse to Solis Cohen School.
16 It's what Commissioner Schmidt just questioned
17 me on.

18 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: I vote to move
19 54-15, 16, 17 and 18.

20 COMMISSIONER SCHMIDT: Second.

21 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: All in favor?

22 COMMISSIONER SABIR: Aye.

23 COMMISSIONER SCHMIDT: Aye.

24 MR. STROMAN: Next three are all lumped

1 together. 54-19, 20 and 21 moving from
2 Northeast Regional Library to Solis Cohen
3 School.

4 COMMISSIONER SCHMIDT: And 22 also.

5 MR. STROMAN: 22, correct.

6 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: I vote to move
7 54-19, 54-20, 54-21 and 54-22.

8 COMMISSIONER SCHMIDT: Second.

9 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: All in favor?

10 COMMISSIONER SABIR: Aye.

11 COMMISSIONER SCHMIDT: Aye.

12 COMMISSIONER SABIR: Just for clarity,
13 Charlie, the whole 54 ward is going to be in
14 that cafeteria.

15 MR. STROMAN: Yes, yes. Next one I
16 have, I'm going to lump two together. I'm
17 going to jump over one. You're going to see
18 58-05 and 58-21 were in Somerton Methodist
19 Church and we're going to go back to Calvary
20 Chapel.

21 We were there originally but they had
22 some construction going on. It's complete
23 now. So division 05 and 21 will go back to
24 the original location.

4 from Ziegler School back to the Regal
5 Ballroom, the original location.

6 CHARWOMAN DEELEY: I vote to move 62-12
7 and 62-14.

8 COMMISSIONER SCHMIDT: Second.

9 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: All in favor?

10 COMMISSIONER SABIR: Aye.

11 COMMISSIONER SCHMIDT: Aye.
