4 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: Good morning. It's
5 11 o'clock but we are trying to get the stream
6 up so I'm just going to have a brief
7 intermission until we get that resolved.
8 Thank you.

13 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: Apologize.
14 Technology is fantastic most of the time. So
15 again, welcome to the County Board of
16 Elections meeting.

17 First, I would like to state that the
18 agenda was posted to the website 24 hours
19 before the meeting. Second, I will preserve
20 the order and decorum of these meetings.

21 Everyone in attendance should be on
22 notice that shouting out or interrupting the
23 proceedings will not be tolerated. Those who
24 violate this will be asked to leave.

1 The Sunshine Act permits anyone
2 attending a public meeting to object to a
3 perceived violation at any time during the
4 meeting.

5 If you chose to do so, please
6 succinctly state your objection. Objecting is
7 not an opportunity for speech making.

8 We will now move to public comment.
9 Commentators shall state where they live or,
10 if they are not a resident of Philadelphia,
11 that they are a Philadelphia taxpayer.

12 Public comment is not an opportunity
13 for dialogue or Q and A; it is public comment,
14 a chance for you to tell us what you think.

15 Each speaker shall have two minutes.
16 However, I may extend this time at my
17 discretion. All public comments must be
18 relevant or germane to Board business.

19 Finally it is my responsibility to
20 preserve the order and decorum of the
21 meetings. As such, profane, slanderous,
22 discriminatory or personal attacks will not be
23 tolerated.

24 Please note that we will be doing

1 polling place changes later in the meeting.
2 So anyone wishing to be heard on a polling
3 place change, please wait until that time.

4 Anyone wishing to offer public comment,
5 please step forward.

6 MR. GARELLA: Good morning. My name is
7 Rich Garella from South Philly. I'm speaking
8 on behalf of Protect Our Vote Philly. We
9 appreciate first of all that you moved the
10 meetings to a more central location and hope
11 that you can keep them here.

12 It's easier for people to get to. We
13 do note that your posting agendas for the
14 meetings 24 hours in advance which, is now
15 required by the Sunshine Act.

16 However, we want to point out that the
17 agendas are not being posted in a location
18 where the public is reasonably likely to find
19 them.

20 So we suggest that you announce each
21 meeting on the front of your website and on
22 social media. I don't think there's been an
23 announcement since August 31st.

24 And when you announce the meetings,

1 just include a link to the meeting agenda with
2 each announcement so that members of the
3 public have a reasonable opportunity to find
4 the agenda and thereby to comment on the
5 business before the Board.

6 So we offer this as one of -- a number
7 of recommendations to bring this Board into
8 compliance with the Pennsylvania Sunshine Act
9 for better transparency and to encourage
10 public participation.

11 I want to give you each a copy of our
12 recommendations, which we circulated to you
13 before for each of you.

14 As always we're ready to work with the
15 Board to improve public participation in Board
16 activities. Thank you.

17 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: Commissioner Sabir,
18 Secretary Commissioner Sabir is joining the
19 meeting via his cell phone.

20 Deputy Commissioner Uqdah is here in
21 person. I will now call the Deputy
22 Commissioner for any emailed public comment.

23 DEPUTY COMMISSIONER UQDAH: Good
24 Morning. There were no emailed public

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1 comments as of 9:30 a.m. this morning. Thank
2 you.

3 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: Thank you. We will
4 now proceed to old business. Joe Lynch with a
5 report from the Executive Director.

6 MR. LYNCH: Good morning,
7 Commissioners. Today's Sunshine report for
8 September 29, 2021. The County Board of
9 Elections report they are currently accepting
10 absentee or mail-in ballots applications
11 online at vote.pa.gov or by paper application.

12 As of yesterday, they have approved
13 89,763 vote-by-mail applications. Of those,
14 61,642 were paper applications, and 28,121 are
15 electronic applications.

16 This is including permanent ballot
17 voters who applied in the primary. Ballot
18 application processing is up-to-date through
19 Monday.

20 Completed cover pages for online filers
21 of Cycle 4 campaign finance reports are due on
22 October 1st.

23 The Voter Registration unit report for
24 the election cycle -- to date they have

1 processed 79,590 applications of which 5,300
2 were paper applications.

3 All applications are up to date. The
4 Data unit is working on paper applications,
5 returned letters, and are proofing the paper
6 apps.

7 The Imaging unit is processing
8 electronic applications, returned letters, and
9 doing corrections.

10 Correspondence unit is working on
11 returned letters.

12 Document unit is working on returned
13 letters, mailing appeals and ID cards.

14 All units are also pulling deceased
15 from the duplication roll.

16 The Election Board Unit report -- last
17 week that Sheet Metal workers total from that
18 training seminar was 101 in-person training.

19 Esperanza -- we ran two classes last
20 week. One was a Sheet Metal workers that was
21 101 in-person training. Esperanza there was a
22 total of 161 in-person training.

23 Overall, there are 669 poll workers
24 attended in-person training. Online training

1 as of today is 407.

2 Total confirmed working 4,204. Total
3 messages left with board workers is 997 and
4 total of not working board workers is 339.

5 This week the classes for the election
6 seminars are being held at South Philadelphia
7 High School.

8 The Vote by Mail center -- the first
9 batch of mail-in ballots will be mailed out
10 tomorrow and will continue until all ballots
11 are mailed out.

12 The satellite office location in room
13 142 will open up tomorrow. The hours will be
14 9 a.m. to 5:00 p.m., Monday through Friday.

15 That's all I have, Commissioners.

16 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: Thanks, Joe and the
17 staff for just an incredible job getting us
18 ready to get those ballots out. We will now
19 move on to new business.

20 As such we have Charlie Stroman that is
21 going to come up and talk but before that is
22 there anyone here who would like to speak on
23 the moving of a polling place?

24 So there's no one here to speak about

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1 moving a polling place. Okay, hearing none we
2 will now go to Charlie Stroman for new
3 business.

4 MR. STROMAN: Good morning,
5 Commissioners. Little polling place update.
6 603 sites are confirmed as of this morning out
7 of 715. Confirmed divisions are 1,522 out of
8 703 for an 89.4 percent.

9 I'll move onto the hearings. I would
10 like to couple 01-07 and 39-26 because they're
11 intertwined.

12 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: Charlie, I'm just
13 going to have an objection. Can you just do
14 ward and division.

15 MR. STROMAN: There both intertwined.

16 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: Oh, I apologize.

17 MR. STROMAN: So 01-07 is requesting to
18 move from East Passyunk Community Center to
19 BOK. 39-26 is requesting to move from BOK to
20 East Passyunk. So that's the request from
21 some of the community people.

22 COMMISSIONER SCHMIDT: I would like to
23 ask if we can take those moves under
24 advisement for the moment to just take a

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1 closer look at that move from 01-07 and 39-26.

2 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: Any objection
3 taking that under advisement? Without any, we
4 will take it under advisement.

5 MR. STROMAN: The next moves are in the
6 second ward, there are several of them. Ward
7 2, division 3, from Gloria Dei Old Swedes
8 Church to Capitolo Rec Center for voter
9 convenience.

10 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: I motion that we
11 approve the move from the 2nd ward, 3rd
12 division.

13 COMMISSIONER SCHMIDT: Second.

14 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: All in favor.

15 COMMISSIONER SABIR: Aye.

16 COMMISSIONER SCHMIDT: Aye.

17 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: Aye.

18 MR. STROMAN: The next move will be in
19 the 2nd ward again in the 13th division from
20 the Settlement Music School to the Santore
21 Library again for voter convenience.

22 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: I make a motion
23 that we approve the proposed move to 02-13.

24 COMMISSIONER SCHMIDT: Second.

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1 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: All in favor.

2 COMMISSIONER SCHMIDT: Aye.

3 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: Aye.

4 COMMISSIONER SABIR: Aye.

5 MR. STROMAN: The next move, I want to
6 couple three of them together. 2nd ward, 26th
7 division, 27th division and 29th division
8 moving from St. Stanislaus Parish Hall to the
9 Shot Tower Rec Center. The reason being is
10 the St. Stanislaus Hall is refusing to do
11 elections anymore.

12 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: I motion that we
13 approve the proposed move 2nd ward, 26
14 division, 2nd ward, 27th division, 2nd ward,
15 29th division.

16 COMMISSIONER SCHMIDT: Second.

17 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: All in favor.

18 COMMISSIONER SCHMIDT: Aye.

19 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: Aye.

20 COMMISSIONER SABIR: Aye.

21 MR. STROMAN: The next three I'm going
22 to couple them together. 05-25, 05-31 and
23 ward 14, division 1, all voted at the
24 Storefront last election and I'm going to move

1 them to the Arts and Crafts Holdings.

2 That is back to the original location.
3 We moved out of that location Arts and Crafts
4 for COVID but she's comfortable enough to go
5 back to the original location for now.

6 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: I make a motion
7 that we approve the proposed move 5th ward,
8 25th division and 31st division and 14-01.

9 COMMISSIONER SCHMIDT: Second.

10 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: All in favor.

11 COMMISSIONER SCHMIDT: Aye.

12 COMMISSIONER SABIR: Aye.

13 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: Aye.

14 MR. STROMAN: The next two moves will
15 be coupled together. Ward 21, division 29,
16 and ward 21, division 40, move from Old CVS
17 Building back into the Salvation Army, which
18 is the original location.

19 COMMISSIONER SCHMIDT: Are we losing
20 the CVS Building or -- I know it's vacant.

21 MR. STROMAN: Commissioner, yeah, I
22 made a decision sooner or later that we're
23 going to lose it and I didn't want it to
24 happen last minute so on my own I went out to

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1 the original location and asked them and they
2 were all happy having us come back.

3 COMMISSIONER SCHMIDT: I know it's
4 currently being used as a FEMA Disaster
5 Recovery Center.

6 MR. STROMAN: Right, and I reached out
7 to the ward leaders and they were all happy
8 with that.

9 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: So just to
10 reiterate for the record this is a move back
11 to the original location.

12 MR. STROMAN: Correct, correct.

13 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: Thank you. So I
14 move that we approve the proposed moves 21-29
15 and 21-40.

16 COMMISSIONER SCHMIDT: Second.

17 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: All in favor.

18 COMMISSIONER SCHMIDT: Aye.

19 COMMISSIONER SABIR: Aye.

20 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: Aye.

21 MR. STROMAN: The next one will be in
22 the 21st ward again, 41st division. Moving
23 from the Old CVS Building to Roxborough YMCA,
24 again original location.

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1 COMMISSIONER SCHMIDT: It's directly
2 behind it, right?

3 MR. STROMAN: Correct, yes.

4 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: I make a motion
5 that we approve the proposed move 21-41.

6 COMMISSIONER SCHMIDT: Second.

7 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: All in favor.

8 COMMISSIONER SCHMIDT: Aye.

9 COMMISSIONER SABIR: Aye.

10 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: Aye.

11 MR. STROMAN: Another one in the 21st
12 ward, 45th division, moving from Lankenau High
13 School back to the Cathedral Village
14 Auditorium again, back to the original
15 location.

16 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: I make a motion
17 that we approve the proposed move for 21-45.

18 COMMISSIONER SCHMIDT: Second.

19 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: All in favor.

20 COMMISSIONER SCHMIDT: Aye.

21 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: Aye.

22 COMMISSIONER SABIR: Aye.

23 MR. STROMAN: The next move is in the
24 28th ward, 8th division, from Love Zion

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1 Baptist Church to the North Penn PAL. That is
2 for voter convenience.

3 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: I make a motion
4 that we approve the proposed move 28-08.

5 COMMISSIONER SCHMIDT: Second.

6 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: All in favor.

7 COMMISSIONER SCHMIDT: Aye.

8 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: Aye.

9 COMMISSIONER SABIR: Aye.

10 MR. STROMAN: Next we'll be in the 31st
11 ward, 5th division, moving from J.B. Ventures
12 to the Summerfield Church and that is a
13 refusal.

14 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: I make a motion
15 that we approve the proposed move 31-05.

16 COMMISSIONER SCHMIDT: Second.

17 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: All in favor.

18 COMMISSIONER SCHMIDT: Aye.

19 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: Aye.

20 COMMISSIONER SABIR: Aye.

21 MR. STROMAN: Next one again is in the
22 3rd ward, 15th division, J.B. Ventures to the
23 Beacon Presbyterian Church and that is of
24 course a refusal.

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1 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: I make a motion
2 that we approve the proposed move 31-15.

3 COMMISSIONER SCHMIDT: Second.

4 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: All in favor.

5 COMMISSIONER SCHMIDT: Aye.

6 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: Aye.

7 COMMISSIONER SABIR: Aye.

8 MR. STROMAN: Next one in the 58th ward
9 moving from Anne Frank School back to Randi's
10 Restaurant. It's actually a move into the
11 division.

12 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: Didn't it used to
13 be at Randi's?

14 MR. STROMAN: Yes, but the next one I
15 announce it will kind of intertwine with --
16 and I would actually like the Commissioners to
17 speak on that if there are any questions
18 because of the polls --

19 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: -- right but 58-11
20 didn't they all -- they use to vote in
21 Randi's?

22 MR. STROMAN: They did, yes, correct.

23 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: So I make the
24 motion that we move 58-11 the proposed move.

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1 COMMISSIONER SCHMIDT: Second.

2 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: All in favor.

3 COMMISSIONER SCHMIDT: Aye.

4 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: Aye.

5 COMMISSIONER SABIR: Aye.

6 MR. STROMAN: The next move is from
7 ward 58, division 19. Anne Frank School into
8 Paul's Run. That actually is in the division.

9 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: I motion that we
10 approve the proposed move 58-19.

11 COMMISSIONER SCHMIDT: Second.

12 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: All in favor.

13 COMMISSIONER SCHMIDT: Aye.

14 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: Aye.

15 COMMISSIONER SABIR: Aye.

16 MR. STROMAN: That's all I have,
17 Commissioners.

18 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: Commissioner
19 Schmidt, do you have any items to be added to
20 the agenda?

21 COMMISSIONER SCHMIDT: I have none.

22 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: Commissioner Sabir,
23 do you have any items to be added to the
24 agenda?

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1 COMMISSIONER SABIR: I have none.

2 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: Thank you. With no
3 items remaining on the agenda, this meeting is
4 adjourned to the call of the Chair. Thank you
5 everybody. Enjoy the day.
