4 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: Good morning. I
5 would like to call the meeting of Wednesday,
6 September 30, 2020 to order.

7 We will begin with public comment. Let
8 me first say if you are here to comment on a
9 polling place change, we will handle polling
10 place changes at a later time in the meeting.

11 So the first public comment is for
12 anybody that is here and wishes to make a
13 public comment. So I just want to -- before
14 we move to public comment -- I would just like
15 to state that commenters shall state where
16 they live or if they are not a resident of
17 Philadelphia, that they are a Philadelphia tax
18 payer. However public comment is not an
19 opportunity for dialogue or Q and A. It is
20 public comment. The chance for you to tell us
21 what you think. Each speaker shall have two
22 minutes. However I may extend this time at my
23 discretion. All public comments must be
24 relevant or germane to order of business.

1 Finally it is my responsibility to
2 preserve the order and decorum of the
3 meetings. As such profane, slanders,
4 discriminatory or personal attacks will not be
5 tolerated. Anyone wishing to make a public
6 comment, please raise your hand and come forth
7 one at time in turn.

8 MR. FITZPATRICK: Hello. My name's
9 James Fitzpatrick. I am a registered and
10 qualified voter of Philadelphia and I
11 represent Donald J. Trump for president. Your
12 satellite offices opened around Philadelphia
13 yesterday and has plans to more.

14 Your website states specifically that
15 these satellite offices voters can quote
16 "request a mail-in ballot, in person, receive
17 it, vote, and return it all at the same
18 location."

19 In addition voters can bring
20 already-voted ballots. Making the satellite
21 offices also drop off locations.

22 Because voting is occurring at these
23 satellite offices, the Trump Campaign requests
24 that we immediately be able to appoint poll

1 watchers to observe the voting at these
2 satellite offices. In the alternative, if
3 these are satellite offices of the Board of
4 Elections, we request the right to have our
5 representatives observe the process from a
6 public space within the satellite election
7 offices. Voters deserve transparency and
8 accountability. Our counsel sent all three
9 Commissioners a letter yesterday by email
10 requesting this relief. Thank you.

11 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: Thank you. Next
12 person for public comment, please come
13 forward.

14 MS. TRAMBLE: Good morning.

15 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: Good morning.

16 MS. TRAMBLE: My name is Evelyn Tramble
17 (ph). I am a Philadelphia taxpayer and
18 resident, 46 ward, 18 division, and I just
19 have a couple comments around clarification
20 around satellite centers.

21 I just want to -- at some point -- I
22 kinda live on Philadelphiavotes.com, your
23 official website. It's not clear when people
24 can -- with what the deadlines are, applying

1 for a ballot.

2 The official deadline is October 27th
3 so I'm just wondering if October 28th rolls
4 around -- people are unable to apply for the
5 ballot anymore, in essence becoming drop off
6 centers for ballots.

7 On that same date emergency ballots
8 become -- according to your website emergency
9 ballots become available to the public after
10 closure of the absentee and mail-in ballot
11 dates.

12 So October 28, so I'm asking that the
13 website be clear that starting October 28th
14 the procedures and the people who are
15 travelling ill or disabled need an emergency
16 ballot what is the process.

17 And the third thing is I did attend the
18 Commissioner's meeting last week. I did not
19 drive like a lot of Philadelphians so I had to
20 take two busses and a trolley to get here and
21 I'm mainly asking you that you make these
22 meetings accessible via Zoom or City Council
23 uses Microsoft. I can't remember what the
24 name of the software is and if security is an

1 issue then perhaps it's view only and you are
2 only allowed to submit comments through email
3 but there are secure ways that people can use
4 Zoom and I'm asking that you allow the public
5 to at least view electronically and that's it.

6 So thank you for your time.

7 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: Thank you. Anyone
8 else here for public comment? Please come
9 forward.

10 MS. JACKSON: Good morning. Can you
11 hear me?

12 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: I can hear you,
13 thank you.

14 MS. JACKSON: I'm a resident of 740 and
15 Elmwood. I did not know about this meeting
16 until two days ago. There was one sign in my
17 neighborhood for our district and they were
18 excuse me -- request a change of polling place
19 from --

20 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: -- I'm sorry.
21 We're going to talk about polling places after
22 public comment. We will get you up first
23 though. I apologize. Is there anyone else
24 here for public comment not related to polling

1 places?

2 MR. GARELLA: Good morning. My name's
3 Rich Garella. I'm speaking on behalf of
4 Protect Our Vote Philly, a non-profit group.

5 In case you didn't know it, you know it
6 since last night: Bad things happen in
7 Philadelphia. I think we've all become
8 familiar with that term that came from the
9 President.

10 We in Philadelphia and our votes are in
11 the crosshairs of what could be the biggest
12 assault on election results in U.S. history.

13 If it's close, there will be challenges
14 to try to attack Philadelphia results and
15 disqualify Philadelphia votes. We have been
16 urging you, the Philadelphia Board of
17 Elections, to address the procedural
18 shortcomings.

19 We documented many of them in our
20 July 8th letter but you refuse to address the
21 substance of that letter. Now we're asking
22 you, we're pleading with you, to address these
23 matters.

24 We need documented very final

1 procedures for ballot inventory and for chain
2 of custodial moving of ballots from end to
3 end. You need rules for watchers and
4 observers that are clear, consistent and
5 legal. You have neither.

6 You need to not only run a serious and
7 accurate election you have to be able to prove
8 it was serious and accurate. Sloppiness is
9 all too familiar. We can't afford for any
10 election and especially not this one.

11 All the fancy machines in the world are
12 not going to protect the votes of
13 Philadelphians without adequate procedures
14 that prove that our votes are counted and
15 counted right.

16 Please do what it takes to secure our
17 elections. Hire security experts, draft
18 procedures, adopt them and follow them. Our
19 election results are truly at stake now.

20 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: Is there anyone
21 else here that would like to make a public
22 comment not related to polling place changes?
23 Thank you. Now I'll ask Secretary
24 Commissioner Omar Sabir for a report on

1 emailed public comment.

2 COMMISSIONER SABIR: Good morning.
3 Commissioner's office had received all public
4 comments emailed to our office by 9:45 a.m.
5 today September 30, 2020. These comments were
6 shared with each Commissioner and their
7 Deputies at 10:00 a.m. today. These comments
8 were also provided to each Commissioner at the
9 beginning of the meeting and are available for
10 the public to view at the public comment
11 table. We have received one public comment
12 from Lawrence West.

13 COMMISSIONER SCHMIDT: I also reviewed
14 it and agree for it to be moved into the
15 record.

16 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: I also reviewed it.
17 Please move the comment into the record.

18 * * * * *

19 (Whereupon, Elections-1 was marked for
20 identification.)

21 * * * * *

22 We will now proceed to old business with a
23 report from Executive Director Joe Lynch.

24 MR. LYNCH: Good morning,

1 Commissioners.

2 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: Good morning, Joe.

3 MR. LYNCH: Today's Sunshine report:
4 We processed and approved 299,022 absentee and
5 mail-in applications.

6 28,383 of those are absentees. That's
7 1,624 in paper, 26,759 online.

8 Mail-in there's 267,363, 110,511 in
9 paper, 156,852 online.

10 Civilian overseas ballots, 870.

11 Federal voters, 2,003.

12 Military, 402.

13 Total outstanding ballot applications
14 to date is about 33,000, total outstanding
15 ballot applications excluding estimated
16 duplicate applications is about 13,500.

17 Our registration unit for the election
18 cycle to date we have processed 192,065
19 registrations of which 29,750 were paper.

20 We have a backlog of 1,200 paper
21 applications. Electronic mail-in are up to
22 September 23rd.

23 As far as polling place unit goes,
24 canvasses for relocations is 32 divisions that

1 are still remaining. Divisions that are
2 solved -- 1,671 that's 98.12 percent and this
3 district numbers of sites confirmed is 707.

4 Our election board unit to date
5 confirmed board workers is 6,527, unconfirmed
6 1,679. To date we have trained 2,297 board
7 workers. That's all I have.

8 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: Joe, I just want to
9 say thank you so much to you and the rest of
10 the staff for what looks like an amazing,
11 amazing amount of work. You know over 300,000
12 mail-in applications in addition to nearly
13 200,000 voter registration applications. It's
14 really -- it's only September so thank you so
15 very much.

16 MR. LYNCH: Thank you.

17 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: If anybody is here
18 -- hold on one second. We will now move to
19 new business with a report from Charlie
20 Stroman, our polling place inspector. After
21 Mr. Stroman gives us his report he will move
22 away from the table and we will begin to hear
23 public comment before we make a motion on his
24 report. Go ahead, Charlie.

1 MR. STROMAN: Good morning,
2 Commissioners. Can you hear me? I would like
3 to move the 105 divisions listed on the sheets
4 in front of you from the consolidated
5 locations to the new locations for the 2020
6 general election.

7 A copy has been given to each
8 Commissioner and is available at the public
9 comment table. I ask that the list be moved
10 into the record unless you want me to read all
11 105 changes.

12 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: Charlie, we will
13 pause here and we'll hear any public comment
14 from people, okay. So if you are here to
15 comment on polling place locations, please
16 step forward and state your name for the
17 record.

18 MS. STRUMAN: Good morning. My name
19 Sheryl Struman (ph) and I am one of the
20 registered voters of Philadelphia and I am the
21 Judge of Elections of ward 22, division 6.

22 Our polling place has been tentatively
23 assigned to the Lovett Branch Library
24 Community Meeting Room in company with two

1 other divisions. This room by the Board of
2 Election -- by Mr. Stroman's offices is
3 calculated to 1,040 square feet.

4 If you do the math it is six feet to
5 each person. Three divisions, that would be
6 15 poll workers, plus eight machines.

7 If you do the math of giving 36 square
8 feet to each of those 15 workers, you've
9 already taken up over half of that space and
10 then where is the space for voters to come in.
11 Further you have a real problem with the entry
12 way, which is a long narrow ramp way. You
13 would have to either have lines -- three lines
14 down past this ramp. There's problems of
15 signage, problems of access.

16 My division alone had over 700 voters
17 in the 2016 election and this is going to be a
18 record turnout even for Philadelphia. I can't
19 see no way that we can have enough voters in
20 this room to be able to process what will be
21 even conservatively 700 or 800 voters.

22 If you can only have space --
23 Mr. Stroman said up to four voters at a time.
24 There are other possibilities, I know that the

1 Board, that the workers are working very very
2 hard to investigate and assign these spaces
3 and all I can do is push that we found one of
4 those other spaces.

5 I have given Mr. Stroman some of those
6 possibilities yesterday and when I called the
7 office over a week ago.

8 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: Okay, thank you.
9 Next person.

10 MR. COALS: Good morning. My name is
11 Ruby Coals (ph) and one of the main purposes
12 for me to attend this meeting is for number
13 one, for clarity, number two, for guidance,
14 and number three, for the leadership in my
15 community to let people know that they do have
16 an issue here in terms of the voting process
17 that is about to take place, okay.

18 So number one, I am from the 43 ward,
19 24 division. So my understanding is that
20 where my original polling place has always
21 been the building was sold. I understand
22 that.

23 So now my understanding is that a
24 letter or a notice went up at 13th and Butler

1 Street. That's not my division and I am not
2 familiar with that. For this meeting someone
3 sent it to me that said do you know about
4 this, I had no idea.

5 So in the meantime it's any
6 understanding that we will have our voting --
7 new voting at Lenfest Center. I don't know
8 how that's going to pan out because it's my
9 understanding there's going to be four
10 divisions there. 22, 23, 24, and 25.

11 So I'm not sure about how much is going
12 to be there but in the meantime I'm here to
13 ensure or want to ensure that the people in my
14 division have a fair shake at voting the way
15 they want to and not be suppressed.

16 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: Thank you. Next
17 person for public comment related to polling
18 locations.

19 MR. MILLER: Good morning. My name is
20 Natasha Miller (ph) and I am the 43 ward, 23
21 division and I'm the young lady that sent
22 those files notifying about the polling
23 location.

24 We are located at (inaudible) School.

1 We have no notification of where we are to go
2 for this election.

3 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: Do you know your
4 ward and division, ma'am?

5 MR. MILLER: 43rd, 23. So we have no
6 notification, we don't have any person and we
7 get nothing. I'm the one that seen the sign
8 posted at 13th and Butler because I'm the 3800
9 at 13th Street.

10 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: 43, 23 is not on
11 the list of boards and divisions that we're
12 working on today but after the meeting you can
13 speak to Mr. Stroman about your particular
14 issue, okay and thank you.

15 I would like if I could to call the
16 lady in the back that was here first. Thank
17 you.

18 MS. JACKSON: Thank you, again. I'm a
19 resident of 740 and Elmwood.

20 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: Can you say your
21 name again?

22 MS. JACKSON: My name is Amni Jackson.
23 A-M as in Mary N as in Nancy-I. Again I
24 didn't find out about this meeting until two

1 days ago. I saw a sign on Elmwood somewhere
2 and that was the only sign that was in my
3 whole neighborhood. I talked to people in my
4 community and they didn't know about the
5 meeting as well.

6 But I vote at 3770 and Elmwood Avenue
7 at the Rec Center and they are supposed to be
8 moving it to 72nd and Woodland at the
9 Paschalville Homes Community Center. From my
10 understanding and speaking with other people
11 in my neighborhood they already have voted at
12 the Community before and the lady described it
13 as crap show. I'm not going to say the words
14 that she used.

15 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: Excuse me. I just
16 want to see if we are talking about the same.
17 So are you presently at Francis Myers Rec
18 Center?

19 MS. JACKSON: No.

20 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: Go ahead.

21 MS. JACKSON: Paschalville Rec Center.

22 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: So you were at
23 Cibotti in the primaries so that's the 40
24 ward, 41 division. Okay, thank you. I'm

1 sorry, proceed.

2 MS. JACKSON: No problem. So I was
3 concerned that we didn't get any notification
4 of this meeting in the mail. There weren't
5 enough posters in the neighborhood for us to
6 even know there was even going be a change to
7 the districts without -- I think I seen a sign
8 on a door but people don't go to the park
9 because we're all in our homes trying to stay
10 away from each other.

11 So I just want to make note that it
12 would be nice in the future that the public is
13 able to be notified about these changes
14 because we don't have no say in anything if we
15 don't know there is going to be a change and
16 that's all I have to say.

17 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: Thank you. Next
18 person to comment on polling location.

19 MS. ELIZABETH: Good morning. My name
20 is Elizabeth (inaudible) for ward six,
21 division one and I need to know if we will be
22 sharing our polling place with any other
23 division and also what time the polling place
24 will actually open -- what time someone will

1 be there to open the building.

2 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: Do you know your
3 ward and division ma'am.

4 MS. ELIZABETH: 6,1.

5 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: 6,1. Thank you.

6 MS. ELIZABETH: Will I have the answer
7 today? Thank you.

8 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: Next? Anybody else
9 here to talk on polling places? Okay,
10 Charlie. So Charlie can you tell me about
11 43,24 that is from Cayuga to Lenfest. Do we
12 have a survey with -- in regards to it
13 fitting?

14 MR. STROMAN: Oh, it will fit. It's
15 more than adequate and to start off I will be
16 glad to speak with everyone that had a problem
17 with polling places.

18 To address the 22,6 was the first one.
19 I was in touch with the library. I contacted
20 the library guy and he went out there today.
21 It's going to be my responsibility to over
22 check it and he is clearing out the space to
23 make them as big as possible so I did start to
24 address that situation.

1 The woman called me yesterday. I
2 totally jumped on it so it's in my plan to get
3 it out there to take care of that part. As
4 far as notification, we polled all the Judge
5 of Elections five days prior to the hearings.
6 We hang one sign in a division, one sign at
7 the old polling place and one sign at the new
8 polling place. That's how we notify the
9 community so that's the process as we go
10 forward as I speak today.

11 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: So I think that we
12 should hold 22, 6 until next week until the
13 library can resolve that.

14 MR. STROMAN: I will address that
15 tomorrow.

16 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: Thank you. 40, 41
17 it looks like it used to be in a residence and
18 when we did the consolidation we went to
19 Cibotti and now we're moving it to
20 Paschalville. Is Cibotti not in the division
21 or not available?

22 MR. STROMAN: Cibotti is more than
23 adequate for three divisions. If there is
24 something that somebody wants me to recheck, I

1 have no problem doing it.

2 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: It's going from
3 Cibotti to Paschalville Homes.

4 MR. STROMAN: Yes.

5 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: Is that in the
6 division?

7 MR. STROMAN: It's close to the
8 division.

9 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: I would say we will
10 hold 40, 41 and just recheck it to see what
11 the difference is between why we are leaving
12 Cibotti to go to Paschalville.

13 MR. STROMAN: Not a problem.

14 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: The voter that was
15 here to speak on 6, 1. Did you want to make
16 sure that it's open on time or do you want us
17 to hold it to resurvey it?

18 THE PUBLIC: Will the building be open
19 at 6 o'clock?

20 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: After the meeting,
21 you can speak with Charlie and we will make
22 sure to get your contact info.

23 MR. STROMAN: It is always my request
24 that the buildings be open at 6:15 a.m. on the

1 morning of election.

2 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: So Commissioners, I
3 make a motion to hold 20,26, 43,24, 40,41.
4 All in favor?

5 COMMISSIONER SCHMIDT: Aye.

6 COMMISSIONER SABIR: Aye.

7 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: I make a motion
8 that the polling place changes submitted by
9 Charlie Stroman into the record. Do I have a
10 second?

11 COMMISSIONER SCHMIDT: Second.

12 THE PUBLIC: Excuse me. Are those
13 polling locations public for us to see before
14 you vote on anything?

15 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: The list is on the
16 table and it will be updated on our website.
17 All in favor?

18 COMMISSIONER SCHMIDT: Aye.

19 COMMISSIONER SABIR: Aye.

20 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: Thank you. So let
21 the record state that these polling place
22 moves have been approved.

17 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: Yes, likewise,
18 thank you very much for pointing that out,
19 Commissioner. Anyone with new business?

20 COMMISSIONER SCHMIDT: I have none.

21 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: Hearing no new poll
22 business and no new business, I make a motion
23 to adjourn.

24 COMMISSIONER SCHMIDT: Second.

External Email Notice. This email comes from outside of City government. Do not click on links or open attachments unless you recognize the sender.

On September 16, 2020, I appeared before this board to voice my frustration over the lack of transparency in the moving on the polling place for the 22nd Ward, 26th Division so shortly before the election and the lack of notification for not only myself as Judge of Elections, but for the residents of the community that are largely affected. I pointed out that only one sign was posted in the area, the meeting was at 11 AM on a Wednesday, and that the meeting was in a warehouse in the middle of East Falls over 3 miles away from the change.

As a result of this meeting, the results have not been very satisfactory.

While I applaud the Election Board for moving the location of these meetings to the Convention Center, a central location that is far easier for everyone to get to, there was no notice posted about this meeting that will affect the polling place of over 500 voters in the area that will take place September 30, 2020. I've done my best to inform people, but I have limited means to do so.

While myself, and everyone in this city, is sympathetic to the plight Covid-19 is having on this election board, the lack of transparency in this process and proper notification is a serious concern and a serious problem. Postcards about this change may only go out 2 weeks before the election, and that will likely result in many people going to the wrong polling station on Election Day. May this series of events be the exception to the rule and not the standard.

Finally, the President of the United States, after weeks of alleging voter fraud via mail in ballots, last night during the First Presidential Debate on September 29, 2020 stated the following:


"As you know today, there was a big problem in Philadelphia. They went in to watch, they're called poll watchers. They're very safe, very nice thing. They were thrown out, they weren't allowed to watch. You know why? 'Cuz bad things happen in Philadelphia, bad things,"

This statement is absolutely baseless and designed only to scare voters and attempt to delegitimize the results of this election. The Election Board needs to make it clear, more than ever, what the rules and laws are related to Poll Watchers in the City of Philadelphia. This includes who can be a poll watcher, when they work, presenting certificates, and what their responsibilities are.

I thank you for your time and consideration into these matters, and wish you the best in this upcoming election.
