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CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: Good morning. I've called to order the meeting of Wednesday, October the 6th of the Philadelphia Board of Elections.

First, I want to say that the staff ran into a technical obstacle with the website yesterday and was physically unable to post the agenda until about 11:30 a.m. so the addendum was posted to the website 23 and half hours before the start of the meeting.

Please note that I will be making a motion to amend the agenda per the updated Sunshine Act to allow for the polling place changes to take place, which is the only action that was scheduled for this meeting.

Second, I will preserve the order and decorum of these meetings.

Everyone in attendance should be on notice that shouting out or interrupting the proceedings will not be tolerated. Those who

1 violate this will be asked to leave.

2 The Sunshine Act permits anyone
3 attending a public meeting to object to a
4 perceived violation at any time during the
5 meeting.

6 If you chose to do so, please
7 succinctly state your objection. Objecting is
8 not an opportunity for speech making.

9 We will now move to public comment.
10 Commenters shall state where they live or, if
11 they are not a resident of Philadelphia, that
12 they are a Philadelphia taxpayer.

13 Public comment is not an opportunity
14 for dialogue or Q and A; it is public comment,
15 an opportunity for you to tell us what you
16 think.

17 Each speaker shall have two minutes.
18 However, I may extend this time at my
19 discretion. All public comments must be
20 relevant or germane to Board business.

21 Finally it is my responsibility to
22 preserve the order and decorum of the
23 meetings. As such, profane, slanderous,
24 discriminatory or personal attacks will not be

1 tolerated.

2 Please note that we will be doing
3 polling place changes later in the meeting.
4 So anyone here wishing to be heard on a
5 polling place change, kindly wait until that
6 time.

7 Anyone wishing to offer public comment
8 please step forward. Seeing none, we will
9 move to Secretary Omar Sabir for any public
10 comment.

11 COMMISSIONER SABIR: Morning. All
12 comments that were emailed by 9:45 were shared
13 with Commissioners and the deputies at
14 10:00 a.m. and have been provided to each
15 Commissioner at the beginning of the meeting
16 and are available at the public comment table.

17 We received two comments from Joseph
18 Marino and Margaret Huang. I have reviewed
19 those comments and ask that it be moved into
20 the record.

21 COMMISSIONER SCHMIDT: I also reviewed
22 those comments and ask that they be moved into
23 the record.

24 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: I have also

1 reviewed it. Please move the comments into
2 the record. Thank you. We will now proceed
3 to old business.

4 Joe Lynch as our Executive Director has
5 a report.

6 MR. LYNCH: Good morning,
7 Commissioners. Sunshine report for today
8 10/06/21 -- County Board report that as of
9 yesterday, they have received 93,362 (sic)
10 vote-by-mail applications. Of those 61,908
11 are paper application and 30,454 are
12 electronic applications.

13 This is including permanent ballot
14 voters who applied in the primary. Ballot
15 application processing is up to date through
16 Monday.

17 The deadline to petition the Court of
18 Court of Common Pleas regarding appointments
19 to vacant election board worker positions is
20 Wednesday, October 13th.

21 Petitions can be submitted in City
22 Hall, Room 295 or on the Court of Common Pleas
23 website. Court will be held the following
24 Wednesday, October 20th.

1 Report for the Vote of Registration
2 Unit -- for election cycle to date, they have
3 processed 85,001 applications, of which 6,100
4 were paper. All applications are up to date.

5 The Data unit is working on paper
6 applications, returned letters and are
7 proofing the paper apps.

8 The Imaging unit is processing
9 electronic apps, returned letters and doing
10 corrections.

11 Correspondence is working on returned
12 letters.

13 Documents unit is working on returned
14 letters, mailing appeals and ID cards. This
15 week they mailed out 11,319 ID cards.

16 All units are also pulling deceased
17 from the dupe room.

18 Report for the Election Board Unit --
19 South Philadelphia High School from last week.
20 Total confirmed number was 183 in-person that
21 we're training.

22 Overall, 852 poll workers attended
23 in-person training. Online training as of
24 today was 515. Total confirmed working 4,757.

1 Total messages left was 901.

2 Total of not working is 8,101. This
3 week, they're at United Lutheran Seminary
4 doing the trainings.

5 The Vote by Mail Center -- the Vote by
6 Mail Center was able to process and mail out
7 just over 90,000 mail-in ballots over the
8 weekend and are continuing to process them and
9 send them out on a daily basis.

10 They are also printing and folding
11 provisional ballots for the election material
12 boxes.

13 The Election Activities Unit -- we
14 received the English version of the candidate
15 sample ballots and are processing them for
16 boxes.

17 We should be receiving the Spanish
18 version today or tomorrow. In between working
19 on the samples, they are also packaging up the
20 provisional ballots.

21 That's all I have for you.

22 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: Thank you, Joe. I
23 would like to now move onto new business and
24 as such I would like a motion to amend the

1 agenda.

2 To add the polling place relocation
3 hearings for the divisions that were scheduled
4 for today and included with the agenda that
5 was posted on our website at 11:30 a.m. on
6 October the 5th.

7 COMMISSIONER SCHMIDT: Second.

8 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: As I stated
9 earlier, our staff ran into technical
10 difficulties posting the agenda to the website
11 24 hours before the meeting and were
12 physically unable to do so from about 10:30
13 a.m. until about 11:30 a.m. yesterday.

14 As Charlie will state, all notice
15 required by the election code plus our normal
16 required notice for the polling place
17 relocations has occurred.

18 Furthermore the agenda that was posted
19 on our website at 11:30 a.m. on October 5th
20 shall be considered the amended agenda.

21 Do I have a second?

22 COMMISSIONER SCHMIDT: Second.

23 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: Thank you,
24 Commissioner Schmidt. I vote aye.

1 Commissioner Sabir?

2 COMMISSIONER SABIR: Aye.

3 COMMISSIONER SCHMIDT: Aye.

4 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: Thank you. The
5 motion carries.

6 We will now move to Charlie Stroman
7 with polling place relocations. Is there
8 anyone here who would like to speak on the
9 moving of a polling place?

10 Please come forward, sir. Please state
11 your name for the record.

12 MR. RACKES: Adams Rackes. Hi. I'm
13 here about the polling place change
14 from/switch Ward 1, Division 7 from East
15 Passyunk Community Center to BOK Building in
16 corresponding switch Ward 39, Division 26,
17 from BOK Building to East Passyunk Community
18 Center.

19 I'll speak mostly on the situation in
20 the First Ward, which I'm the ward leader.

21 I've confirmed with the long-time Judge
22 of Elections, the Majority Inspector, the
23 incoming Majority Inspector, both of our
24 Democratic committee people and they all

1 strongly support this change.

2 Division 7 lies to the east of the BOK
3 Building and East Passyunk Community Center is
4 to the West of the BOK Building so people
5 currently have to walk all the way across that
6 -- it's about a five-block walk from a lot of
7 places in the area and the BOK Building is
8 about two to three blocks closer depending on
9 where you're coming from.

10 So basically all the constituencies
11 have strongly supported that. The seven
12 wasn't for Pal in the past and the move during
13 the pandemic and that got bunched in with a
14 bunch of other Ward 1 polling places at East
15 Passyunk Community Center.

16 But it's much closer to BOK so we do
17 support that change and all the people who
18 have been there year in and year out working
19 the Election Board support that change as well
20 because it will be easier to get some older
21 residents to the voting place.

22 If it's alright I can speak -- is it
23 alright if I read Joe's statement into the
24 record, Joe Marino from the perspective of

1 Ward 39.

2 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: Yes.

3 MR. RACKES: So Joe Marino sent this
4 publically and he's speaking from the
5 perspective of 39-26, which currently has to
6 walk across East Passyunk Community Center all
7 the way over to BOK. 39-26 has always been at
8 East Passyunk Community Center. It moved sort
9 of post-pandemic.

10 "My name is Joseph Marino and I am the
11 president of the Advisory Council at East
12 Passyunk Community Center. I highly support
13 the change of the polling place 39-26 back to
14 East Passyunk Community Center.

15 Moving people who belong to the
16 neighborhood nearby back to voting in BOK and
17 those who live near EPPC back to EPPC."

18 He then goes on to say all the
19 constituencies he represents and he says,
20 "I've spoken to hundreds of neighbors, mostly
21 senior citizens who are disenfranchised by the
22 current situation, which was never reviewed in
23 a public hearing."

24 Just reading verbatim here. "Unlike

1 this one when the switch was made to
2 accommodate the City and not the citizens.

3 Dozens of our seniors are unable to
4 vote because they have no access to
5 transportation to a polling place that is in
6 some cases up to seven blocks away from their
7 home or more."

8 So Joe's in support of this. He's a
9 long-time community member at the East
10 Passyunk Community Center and I should say
11 that John Carroll (ph) ran the Democratic ward
12 leader 39th ward also communicated and emailed
13 a correspondence that he was in support of
14 this.

15 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: Thank you. Anyone
16 else here to make public comment on the moving
17 of a polling place, please come forward.

18 Good morning, Councilman and welcome.
19 Please state your name for the record.

20 MR. SQUILLA: Good morning, Councilman
21 Mark Squilla. I just want to reiterate what
22 we heard Mr. Adams say. How important it is
23 to have this change of location.

24 From working with our constituent base

1 and the community people in that area, they
2 believe it's easier access for voting.

3 It will make it easier especially for
4 seniors to get to the polling place and so I
5 strongly support this change and support the
6 ward leaders who are also involved in this
7 move.

8 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: Thank you,
9 Councilman. Anyone else who would like to
10 speak on the moving of a polling place?
11 Hearing none, Charlie will proceed.

12 MR. STROMAN: Good morning,
13 Commissioners. First of all the polling
14 places, 689 confirmed sites, 18 unconfirmed.
15 Right now we're at 98 percent.

16 Polling place changes -- first one I'll
17 do is the one we just talked about. 01-07
18 moved from East Passyunk to BOK and then 39-26
19 moving from BOK to East Passyunk.

20 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: I motion that we
21 approve the proposed moves from 1st ward, 7th
22 division, 39th ward, 26th division.

23 COMMISSIONER SABIR: I second.

24 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: I vote aye.

1 Commissioner Schmidt?

2 COMMISSIONER SCHMIDT: I vote against
3 even though I have no doubt from the testimony
4 from Adams and the Councilman but because it's
5 moving out of the ward to a different ward and
6 to a division that isn't continuous with its
7 home division. I don't believe it's a move
8 that we're allowed to make so I wrote against.

9 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: Commissioner Sabir?

10 COMMISSIONER SABIR: Aye.

11 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: Motion carries.

12 Next.

13 MR. STROMAN: Next two will be in the
14 7th ward, the 4th and 5th division. Moving
15 from Villas Caribe to Salvation Army
16 Tabernacle and that's due to construction at
17 Villas Caribe.

18 COMMISSIONER SCHMIDT: That's divisions
19 4 and 5?

20 MR. STROMAN: 4 and 5, yes.

21 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: I motion that we
22 approve the move of the wards 7, divisions 4
23 and 5.

24 COMMISSIONER SCHMIDT: Second.
