4 JUDGE CRUMLISH: Good afternoon  
5 everyone. I'm going to call to order the  
6 March 8th, 2023 meeting of the Philadelphia  
7 County Board of Elections to order today.

8 First, it's my duty as Chair to  
9 preserve civility, and order, and decorum  
10 during these meetings. All in attendance  
11 should be on notice that shouting or  
12 interruption of the proceedings won't be  
13 tolerated. Those who do violate these rules  
14 will be asked to leave.

15 The Sunshine Act does permit  
16 anyone attending a public meeting to object to  
17 a proceed violation at any time during the  
18 meeting. If you choose to do so, please  
19 simply state your objection. I know that  
20 objecting is not an opportunity for speech  
21 making or litigation.

22 We will now move to public  
23 comments. Public commenter's shall state  
24 where they live or if they're not a resident

1 that they are a Philadelphia tax payer.

2 Public comment is not an  
3 opportunity for public dialog or a question  
4 and answer. It is a public comment. It's a  
5 chance for you to tell us what you think.  
6 Each speaker may have two minutes.

7 However, I may extend this time at  
8 my discretion. Public comments must be  
9 relevant or germane to this Board's business.

10 Is there anyone here for public  
11 comment?

12 MR. CUSTODIO: Yes.

13 JUDGE CRUMLISH: Okay. Will you  
14 identify yourself?

15 MR. GARELLA: Yes. Good morning.  
16 Thank you for your service on this Board. My  
17 name Rich Garella. I'm with Protect Our Vote  
18 Philly.

19 I'll get right to the comment  
20 which is relating to the January 11th motion  
21 of the this Board as previously constituted,  
22 voted to authorize -- to fill positions  
23 without identifying those deputies and without  
24 identifying those positions.

1           We are concerned, as members of  
2 the public, is that the Sunshine Act is -- the  
3 intent of the Sunshine Act is an official  
4 actions such as monitoring place, and public,  
5 and deliberations, and decisions -- that's why  
6 that kind of official business hasn't been  
7 placed in the Sunshine Meeting.

8           While the Board can delegate to a  
9 group, such as the deputies, they should  
10 identify who's in the group which are also  
11 being hired for. That group has to have it's  
12 own mini Sunshine meeting to do that  
13 deliberation. What we're wondering is, has  
14 that occurred? Is that something that is on  
15 the public record or not?

16           JUDGE CRUMLISH: So as I said,  
17 introducing this opportunity that this is not  
18 an interrogation or a question and answer  
19 session.

20           Please articulate your comment and  
21 it will be considered by the Board.

22           MR. GARELLA: Certainly, you're  
23 under an obligation to answer questions.

24           So the concern is --

1 JUDGE FURLONG: Excuse me. So  
2 you're making a request, correct?

3 MR. GARELLA: In essence I'm  
4 making a request to find out if this hiring  
5 has occurred, who's on this committee of  
6 deputies, exactly what the positions are, and  
7 specifically the respect that if such a group  
8 makes this decision then there should be, by  
9 law, a Sunshine Meeting announced when the  
10 City has deliberated and decided.

11 JUDGE CRUMLISH: Fair enough.  
12 Anything further on that?

13 MR. GARELLA: No. I think that  
14 covers that. We have a -- released a  
15 statement that has a few additional details --

16 JUDGE CRUMLISH: Well, we're going  
17 to rely on your articulate presentation of  
18 your comments rather than a press release. It  
19 is important that you're here. We heard you.  
20 So thank you very much for your input.  
21 Anything further on this?

22 MR. GARELLA: I'll ask the  
23 secretary on that just in case. I appreciate  
24 that. Thank you.

1 JUDGE CRUMLISH: Hearing no  
2 further comments from the public.

3 JUDGE FURLONG: Chairman, I  
4 haven't received any public comments as of  
5 9:45 a.m.

6 JUDGE CRUMLISH: Thank you, Judge  
7 Furlong. Having heard no other comments we're  
8 going to move to ask is there is any old  
9 business?

11 (No response.)

13 MR. CRUMLISH: Hearing no old  
14 business other than what I have in front of me  
15 is an opportunity for Mr. Lynch to address the  
16 Board.

17 MR. LYNCH: Good morning. Today's  
18 March 8th, 2023. The County Board of  
19 Elections as of yesterday, they have approved  
20 55,059 vote by mail applications, which is  
21 17,399 added from last week's total. Of  
22 those, 21,630 are paper applications, and  
23 33,429 are electronic applications. This is  
24 including the civilian overseas and military

1 voters.

2 We have started receiving back the  
3 annual mail-in and absentee applications  
4 leaving us with a total of 1,570 applications  
5 waiting to be proceeded. Of those 737 are  
6 paper applications, and 830 are electronic  
7 applications.

8 The last day to file an objection  
9 for nomination petitions is on March 14th.  
10 The last day for candidates who have filed  
11 nomination petitions to withdraw is on March  
12 22nd.

13 Instructions on how to file an  
14 objections are available at the Court of  
15 Common Pleas website under the Orders and  
16 Regulations page.

17 The ballot drawing for municipal  
18 candidates will be held at 11:00 a.m. on  
19 Wednesday, March 15th, 2023 in City Hall, Room  
20 202.

21 As of yesterday -- yesterday was  
22 the deadline to file petitions. We have 115  
23 democrats filed within the City including the  
24 courts. They filed for various offices and

1 I'm going to read them off to you.

2 For the Supreme Court have 2.

3 Well, the State had 2. Superior Court had 3.

4 Commonwealth Court had 2. These are all  
5 democrats. Common Pleas had 19. Municipal  
6 had 9.

7 We go to City officers, Mayor.

8 Mayor had 12. City Commissioners we had 2.

9 City controller we had 3. Register of Wills  
10 had 5. Sheriff, 4. City Counsel at-large 29.  
11 District Counsel 1, 1. District Counsel 2, 3.  
12 District Counsel 3, 2. District Counsel 4, 2.  
13 District Counsel 5, 7. District Counsel 6, 1.  
14 District Counsel 7, 2. District Counsel 8,  
15 2. District Counsel 9, 4. District Counsel 10,  
16 1.

17 On the republican side, Supreme  
18 Court we had 2. Superior Court, 2.

19 Commonwealth Court, 2. Municipal Court, 1.

20 For the City officers, Mayor had 1. City

21 Commissioner, 1. City Controller, 1.

22 Register of Wills, 1. Sheriff, 1. City

23 Counsel at-large, 6. District Counsel, 1.

24 For a grand total of 134.



1                   So the first day to file a  
2 nomination papers, minority political  
3 parties and independent candidates is March  
4 8th. Nomination papers will be available both  
5 at City Hall, Room 142 and on our website,  
6 Vote.Phila.gov. The last date to file  
7 nomination papers is on August 1st. The last  
8 day for these candidates to withdraw is  
9 August 8th.

10                   Our Voter Registration Office,  
11 520 North Columbus Boulevard has extended its  
12 hours to accommodate petition reviews for  
13 the 2023 primary. The office will be open  
14 Monday through Thursday from 8:30 a.m. to 7:30  
15 p.m. On Friday, 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. And  
16 from 7:00 to 3:00 p.m. on Saturdays and  
17 Sundays.

18                   Anyone can call (215)686-VOTE and  
19 selection 4 to schedule an appointment. Our  
20 Voter Registration Unit for the election  
21 cycle to date, they have processed 88,495  
22 applications, of which 3,450 were paper. All  
23 applications are up to date. All 3,471  
24 mail-in ballot applications that were returned

1 have been scanned in, proceeded, and sent a  
2 AVM letter.

3 They have 40 petitioners coming in  
4 to review petitions. All backed up for 5 year  
5 notices. All the backed up f year notices  
6 also have been sent in too.

7 Poling places, as of this morning  
8 the Poling Place Unit Has serving 245 places  
9 to prepare for use of electronic poll books  
10 for the May 16th Primary Election.

11 The Unit Poll Book also continued  
12 to work on changes form last election cycle.  
13 All the poling places have been notifying  
14 requesting the use of their facility for the  
15 upcoming Primary Election.

16 Our election Board to date for the  
17 spring E-poll book trainings, they have had  
18 3,398 board workers attend trainings. There  
19 are 4,597 board workers scheduled for the  
20 upcoming training. The Unit is currently  
21 scheduling people to attend the remaining  
22 seminars.

23 Thank you, Commissioners.

24 JUDGE CRUMLISH: Thank you,

1 Mr. Lynch. I'd like to move to have the Board  
2 accept the report of the Executive Director of  
3 Mr. Lynch.

4 Do I have a second? All in favor?

8 JUDGE CRUMLISH: So the report of  
9 Mr. Lynch will be made part of the permanent  
10 of the Office.

11 I know I speak on behalf of  
12 Judge Furlong and Judge Johnson, we know the

14 Commissioners and of the Board are doing on  
15 behalf of the citizens of Philadelphia. It  
16 hard work, but it is public service in the  
17 greatest fashion.

18 I speak with solemn experience in  
19 this area. I know that you all communicate  
20 for the men and women on behalf of the City  
21 and we appreciate their work.

22 Thank you very much.

23 MR. LYNCH: Thank you.

24 JUDGE CRUMLISH: Now, with respect

1 to the adjenda; is there any new business?

2 MR. LYNCH: No, sir.

3 JUDGE CRUMLISH: Having heard no  
4 new business, Judge Furlong, do you have any  
5 items to add to the adjenda?

6 JUDGE FURLONG: No, Mr. Chairman.

7 JUDGE CRUMLISH: Do you have any
