4 JUDGE CRUMLISH: Good morning
5 everyone. Welcome. This is the March 15th
6 meeting of the City Commissioner. I know
7 you're all here to listen to everything I have
8 to say. Be patient. We'll get through the
9 ordinary course of business first, and then
10 we'll get to the ballet draw. Thank you.

11 So I will now call to order the
12 March 15th, 2023 meeting of the Philadelphia
13 County Board of Elections. I'm
14 Judge James Crumlish. I'm acting as Chair of
15 the Philadelphia City Commissioners. Also
16 with me today are Judges, Vincent Furlong,
17 Vincent Johnson, also sitting as City
18 Commissioners.

19 First, in this public meeting it
20 is my duty to preserve order and civility of
21 these proceedings. I'll preserve the order
22 and decorum of these meetings. Disruptive
23 conduct or interruption in these proceedings
24 won't be tolerated, nor expected. Those who

1 violate these rules will be asked to leave.

2 The Sunshine Act permits anyone
3 attending a public meeting to object to a
4 proceeding violation at any time during the
5 time of the meeting. If you choose to do so,
6 please state your objection germane to the City
7 Commissioners business. Objecting is not an
8 opportunity for speech making or filibuster.

9 We will now move to public comment.
10 Commenter's shall state where they live if
11 they're not resident of Philadelphia, but they
12 are a Philadelphia tax payer. You're reminded
13 public comment is not an opportunity to make
14 demands, or dialog, or Q & A with the
15 Commissioners.

16 It is a public comment. That is a
17 chance for you to tell us what you think. In
18 consideration of all, I ask each speaker making
19 a public comment -- shall have two minutes.
20 However, I may, on an exception, extend this
21 time. Again, all public comments must be
22 relevant or germane to the Board business.

23 Importantly, as I said before, it
24 is my responsibility to preserve the order and

1 decorum of the meetings as such, profane
2 slanderous, discriminatory, or personal attacks
3 will not be tolerated.

8 JUDGE CRUMLISH: Hearing no
9 requests for public comment.

10 Judge Furlong, has there been any
11 emailed public comment.

12 JUDGE FURLONG: As of 9:45 this
13 morning, Mr. Chairman, no public comment?

14 JUDGE CRUMLISH: So with that we
15 will move to new business which is the
16 drawing --

20 JUDGE CRUMLISH: Attend the center
21 microphone so that you can be heard.

22 MR. GARELLA: Your Honors, on
23 behalf of Protect Our Vote Philly, I object to
24 the following violation of the Pennsylvania

1 Sunshine Act. Although the Sunshine Act in
2 Section 706 requires that written minutes shall
3 be kept of all open meetings of agencies.

4 This Board has not kept or
5 approved minutes of the previous meeting, or
6 any of it's meetings for at least the past
7 four years. So there's no divinity record of
8 the Board's official actions at it's meetings.

9 We remind the Board that any member
10 of any agency who participates in a meeting
11 with the intent and purpose by that member of
12 violating the Sunshine Act commits a summary
13 offense. We respectfully suggest that the
14 Board commence to keep meetings of it's public
15 meetings starting from this meeting onward.
16 Thank you.

17 JUDGE CRUMLISH: Thank you, sir.

18 MR. GREENBERG: Thank you,
19 Mr. Chairman. My name is Kevin Greenberg. I'm
20 a resident of Philadelphia, but I'm appearing
21 as an attorney who has had had a lot of
22 business with the Board over the last few
23 weeks.

24 Just on behalf of myself and the

1 other members of the Election Bar who I feel I
2 have liberty to speak for, we want to commend
3 the Board staff for handling some very
4 difficult situations over the last three weeks
5 with great applaud. So I just wanted to
6 publicly put that on the record on behalf of
7 myself and the other members of the Bar.

8 JUDGE CRUMLISH: Thank you, sir.

9 MR. GREENBERG: Thank you.

10 JUDGE CRUMLISH: Any other public
11 comments?

15 JUDGE CRUMLISH: Thank you. With
16 that we will close public comments. Judge
17 Furlong has already reported no emailed
18 comments have been made.

19 Judge Furlong, do you have any
20 other items to add to the adjenda?

21 JUDGE FURLONG: No, Mr. Chairman.

22 JUDGE CRUMLISH: With that we'll go
23 back to drawing the ballot positions.

24 MS. ECKROADE: Good morning

1 everyone. The draw of ballot positions for the
2 May 15th, 2023 primary election will commence
3 in accordance with the ballot office order for
4 City Elective Offices.

5 We're going to proceed with Mayor,
6 City Commissioner, City Controller, Registry of
7 Wills, Sheriff, Counsel at Large, and then
8 District Counsel.

9 Each candidate who filed
10 nomination petitions for a local office will
11 opportunity to draw a lot to determine their
12 ballot position for that office. We will
13 proceed through candidate list for each office
14 in the order of the first filing date and time
15 stamp on the nomination petitions filed with
16 the County Board of Elections until all
17 candidates for the office have drawn.

18 When each candidate on the list
19 for a specific office has drawn, we will
20 proceed to the next office listed. For those
21 candidates who wish to use a proxy to draw for
22 their ballot, the candidate must authorize the
23 selected individual by filing a proxy form or a
24 letter signed by the candidate with the County

1 Board of Elections.

2 If the candidate or candidates
3 proxy is not present, a civil service employee
4 of the County Board of Elections will draw on
5 their behalf. Candidates who draw Number 1
6 will be placed first on the ballot. Those that
7 draw Number 2 will be placed second on the
8 ballot and so on. Once ballot positions have
9 been drawn we will not redraw for any reason.

10 We are going to start with
11 Major. We're going to start with
12 Maria Quinones Sanchez.

13 MR. LYNCH: Maria Quinones Sanchez.
14 For that one, civil service will draw.
