1 P R O C E E D I N G S

2 (11:00 a.m.)

3 CHAIR SABIR: Good morning.

4 MR. BLUESTEIN: Good morning.

5 CHAIR SABIR: Call to order the meeting of the  
6 Philadelphia City Commissioners Board of Elections for  
7 Wednesday, March 18th, 2026. This meeting is in  
8 compliance with the Pennsylvania Sunshine Act. The  
9 Philadelphia City Commissioners are a three member  
10 bipartisan board of elected officials in charge of  
11 elections and voter registration for the City of  
12 Philadelphia. Each commissioner is elected to serve a  
13 term that coincides with the municipal election cycle  
14 for Mayor and City Council. The commissioner set and  
15 enforce departmental policies to administer voter  
16 registration and conduct elections in accordance with  
17 federal, state voter registration and election laws.

18 The city commissioners were created by the  
19 Pennsylvania Assembly in 1711 with a focus on taxation  
20 and held various regulatory powers throughout the  
21 centuries. The commissioner started maintaining voter  
22 list in 1799 and took on more election related  
23 responsibilities but didn't emerge in its current form  
24 until the adoption of Philadelphia Home Rule Charter  
25 in 1951.

1 We will now proceed to new business. We will  
2 begin by considering our first agenda item, drawing of  
3 the ballot positions. We'll call up our deputy  
4 executive director Dana Eckroade and Liza Froncek.

5 MS. ECKROADE: Good morning, everyone. Good  
6 morning, Commissioners.

7 CHAIR SABIR: Good morning, Dana.

8 MS. ECKROADE: Everyone here that is here for the  
9 ballot lottery, did you all sign in? We will get  
10 started as soon as everybody signs in.

11 CHAIR SABIR: While we're getting ready, I'd like  
12 to say thank you for all of the people who ran for  
13 committee person. You are the foot soldiers for  
14 democracy, and we really appreciate you.

15 MS. FRONCEK: The draw for ballot positions for  
16 local offices in the 2026 general primary will  
17 commence with the following procedures. Each  
18 candidate who filed nomination petitions for a local  
19 office will have the opportunity to draw a lot to  
20 determine their ballot position on the 2026 primary  
21 ballot. For those candidates who wish to use a proxy  
22 to draw for their ballot position, the candidate must  
23 authorize the selected individual by filing a proxy  
24 form or a letter signed by the candidate with the  
25 County Board of Elections.

1 Candidates who draw number 1 will be placed first  
2 on the ballot. Those that draw number 2 will be  
3 placed second on the ballot, and so on. We will begin  
4 with the office of the Democratic member of the Ward  
5 Executive Committee and then proceed to the Republican  
6 member of the Ward Executive Committee. We will  
7 prioritize races where the candidate or a candidate's  
8 proxy is ready to draw. We will draw in ward and  
9 division order.

10 In races where a candidate or proxy is present,  
11 the candidate who has the earliest timestamp on their  
12 nomination petition will draw first regardless of  
13 whether candidate or candidate's proxy with the  
14 earlier timestamp is present. For offices drawn this  
15 way, if the candidate or candidate's proxy is not  
16 present, a County Board of Elections employee will  
17 draw on their behalf.

18 For races where there are no candidate or  
19 candidate's proxy ready to draw, we will use a random  
20 function in Excel to assign the ballot positions. The  
21 Excel function will only be used for races where no  
22 individual has already drawn. The Excel spreadsheet  
23 will randomly assign a number between zero and one to  
24 each candidate. The candidate with the largest number  
25 will be assigned the first position on the ballot.

1 The candidate with the second largest number will be  
2 assigned the second position, and so on. Once ballot  
3 positions have been drawn, either in person or through  
4 Excel, we will not redraw for any reason. Has  
5 everyone signed in here today?

6 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Everyone has signed.

7 MS. FRONCEK: We will begin with Ward 2, Division  
8 6. Theodore Schmidt. All right. Theodore has drawn  
9 ball number 1. He will take first. Mara Blake-Ward.  
10 I'll be pulling on her behalf. Okay. Three. We'll  
11 be calling Ward 3, Division 5 next. Sorrell D. Green  
12 (phonetic). Bo Gray will be pulling on behalf.  
13 Sorrell D. Green has chosen ball number 2. I will be  
14 pulling on behalf of James Sanders. James Sanders has  
15 drawn 1.

16 Next, we'll be calling Ward 5, Division 18 for  
17 Steven Datlof. Steven Datlof has drawn ball number 2.  
18 There are three candidates in this division. I will  
19 be pulling on behalf of Harvey Hurdle. Harvey Hurdle  
20 has pulled ball number 3. Next, I'll be pulling on  
21 behalf of Nancy Lanham. Nancy Lanham has drawn ball  
22 number 1. Thank you.

23 CHAIR SABIR: Thank you.

24 MS. FRONCEK: Next, we'll be calling Ward 5,  
25 Division 21 for Michael Patrick Boyle. There are four

1 candidates in this division. Michael Patrick Boyle  
2 has drawn ball number 3. I will now be pulling on  
3 behalf of Farrer Ahmed (phonetic). Farrer Ahmed has  
4 drawn ball number 1. I will be pulling on behalf of  
5 Saul Kester next. Saul Kester has pulled ball number  
6 4. Next, I'll be polling on behalf of Amy Sweeney.  
7 Amy Sweeney has drawn ball number 2.

8 CHAIR SABIR: While we're in between, I'd like to  
9 recognize Councilmember Katherine Richardson is in the  
10 building. Also the ward leader 52nd Ward.

11 MS. FRONCEK: Next, I'll be calling Ward -- I'm  
12 sorry -- Ward 12, Division 15. And we'll have Kevin  
13 Terrell Zuber. Kevin Terrell Zuber has pulled ball  
14 number 1. Next, I'll be pulling on behalf of Brenda  
15 J. Littlejohn. Brenda Littlejohn has pulled ball  
16 number 4. I will be pulling on behalf of Sylvia  
17 Henderson. Sylvia Henderson has pulled ball number 2.  
18 Last, I'll be pulling on behalf of Beatrice Johnson.  
19 Beatrice Johnson has pulled ball number 3.

20 CHAIR SABIR: That was it.

21 MS. FRONCEK: Next, we're going to call Board 16,  
22 Division 1, and there are five candidates in this  
23 division. We'll call up Antonio Williams to pull. Bo  
24 Gray will be pulling on his behalf. Antonio Williams  
25 has drawn ball number 5. I'll be pulling on behalf of

1 Bright Alexander next. Bright Alexander has pulled  
2 ball number 4. I will be pulling on behalf of Tariq  
3 Lewis next. Tariq Lewis has pulled ball number 1.  
4 Next, I will be polling on behalf of Danita Bates.  
5 Danita Bates has drawn ball number 3. Next, on  
6 behalf, I will be drawing of Brian Lewis. Brian Lewis  
7 has drawn ball number 2. Okay.

8 The next ward and division will be 22, 02. There  
9 are three candidates in this division. And we will  
10 call Michael Norman Huff. Bo Gray will be pulling on  
11 his behalf. Michael Norman Hoff has drawn ball number  
12 2. I will be pulling on behalf of Darlene M. Temple.  
13 Darlene M. Temple has drawn ball number 1. Next, I'll  
14 be polling on behalf of Alexander Reusing. Alexander  
15 Reusing has drawn ball number 3.

16 The next ward and division will be 22, 05. There  
17 are three candidates in this division. And we will  
18 call up Neysa Nevins. Neysa Nevins has pulled ball  
19 number 3. I will now pull on behalf of Patricia A.  
20 Bryant. Patricia A. Bryant has drawn ball number 2.  
21 Next, I'll be drawing on behalf of Michael L. Bryant,  
22 Jr. Michael L. Bryant, Jr. has drawn ball number 1.

23 We'll be drawing for Ward 29, Division 13. There  
24 are four candidates. And Bo Gray will be drawing on  
25 behalf of Philip Belcastro. Philip Belcastro has

1 drawn ball number 3. I will now be pulling on behalf  
2 of Tammy A. Crummy. Tammy A. Crummy has drawn ball  
3 number 2. I will be pulling on behalf of Diane  
4 Johnson next. Diane Johnson has pulled ball number 1.  
5 I will now be pulling on behalf of Jordan Anthony  
6 Holbert. Jordan Anthony Holbert has pulled ball  
7 number 4.

8 We will be drawing for Ward 48, Division -- I'm  
9 sorry -- Ward 34, Division 8. There are four  
10 candidates. And Bo Gray will be pulling on behalf of  
11 Karen W. Ford. One. Karen W. Ford has drawn ball  
12 number 1. I will now be pulling on behalf of Patricia  
13 Harris. Patricia Harris has drawn ball number 3. I  
14 will now be drawing on behalf of Robert Harris.  
15 Robert Harris has drawn ball number 2. Now I'll be  
16 pulling on behalf of Shameka Osborne. Shameka Osborne  
17 has pulled ball number 4.

18 We will be calling up Ward 46, Division 11.  
19 Thelma Peake. There are three candidates in this  
20 division. Thelma Peake has drawn ball number 3. I  
21 will now be pulling on behalf of Sergio Sea  
22 (phonetic). Sergio Sea, if you want to come up and  
23 pull your own. Sergio has drawn ball number 2. Is  
24 Dawn Williams here? I will be pulling on behalf of  
25 Dawn Williams. Dawn Williams has pulled ball number

1 1.

2 The next division is Ward -- the next ward is 57.  
3 The division is 24. There is only one candidate in  
4 this division which was Shane B. Fitzgerald. Okay.  
5 We're going to update our sign in sheet and get to  
6 whoever that we have missed that came in after.

7 We will be calling up Ward 36, Division 40.  
8 There are four candidates in this division. And we'll  
9 have Miguel K. Johnson. Miguel K. Johnson has drawn  
10 ball number 4. Is there anyone else here from  
11 Division 40, Ward 36? I will now be pulling on behalf  
12 of Jamal Anthony Barone. Jamal Anthony Barone has  
13 pulled ball number 2. I'll now be pulling on behalf  
14 of Abraham G. Green. Abraham G. Green has pulled ball  
15 number 3. I'll now be pulling on behalf of Karen D.  
16 Harris. Karen D. Harris has pulled ball number 1.

17 We will now call up Ward 58, Division 16. There  
18 are two candidates in this division. And we will have  
19 Bob Stewart come up to pull. Bob Stewart has pulled  
20 ball number 1. I will now pull on behalf of Joe Ellen  
21 Sisnitsky (phonetic). Joe Ellen Sisnitsky has pulled  
22 ball number 2. Is there anybody here that has not  
23 come forward or signed the sign in sheet? That  
24 concludes the ballot position drawing for today. Nice  
25 job, everyone.

1 CHAIR SABIR: Thank you again, everyone, for  
2 coming out. That is our last item on the agenda.  
3 Before we adjourn, Commissioner Deeley, do you have  
4 any other business to raise at this meeting?

5 MS. DEELEY: I have none. Just thank everybody  
6 for coming out and being a part of it. Thank you.

7 MR. BLUESTEIN: I have nothing to add. Thank  
8 you.

9 CHAIR SABIR: Thank you, Commissioners. A motion  
10 that we adjourn today's meeting. Is there a second?

11 MS. DEELEY: Second.

12 CHAIR SABIR: Secretary Bluestein, please call  
13 the roll.

14 MR. BLUESTEIN: Vice Chair Deeley?

15 MS. DEELEY: Aye.

16 MR. BLUESTEIN: I vote aye. Chairman Sabir?

17 CHAIR SABIR: Aye. This meeting is adjourned.

## Ballot Position Drawing Procedures March 18, 2026

### The draw for ballot positions for local offices in the 2026 General Primary will commence with the following procedures:

- Each candidate who filed nomination petitions for a local office will have the opportunity to draw a lot to determine their ballot position on the 2026 Primary ballot.
- For those candidates who wish to use a proxy to draw for their ballot position, the candidate must authorize the selected individual by filing a proxy form or a letter signed by the candidate with the County Board of Elections.
- Candidates who draw number one will be placed first on the ballot, those that draw number two will be placed second on the ballot, and so on.
- We will begin with the office of Democratic Member of the Ward Executive Committee and then proceed to the Republican Member of the Ward Executive Committee.
- We will prioritize races where the candidate, or a candidate's proxy, is ready to draw. We will draw in ward and division order. In races where a candidate or proxy is present, the candidate who has the earliest time stamp on their nomination petition will draw first, regardless of whether the candidate or candidate's proxy with the earlier timestamp is present. For offices drawn this way, if the candidate or candidate's proxy is not present, a County Board of Elections employee will draw on their behalf.
- For races where there are no candidate or candidate's proxy ready to draw, we will use a random function in Excel to assign ballot positions. The Excel function will only be used for races where no individual has already drawn. **The Excel spreadsheet will randomly assign a number between zero and one to each candidate.** The candidate with the largest number will be assigned the first position on the ballot, the candidate with the second-largest number will be assigned the second position, and so on.
- Once ballot positions have been drawn either in-person or through Excel, we will not redraw for any reason.
