MR. SABIR: Good morning. Call to order the meeting of the Philadelphia City Commissioners Board of Elections for Wednesday, March 27th, 2024. This meeting is in compliance under the Pennsylvania Sunshine Act. The Philadelphia City Commissioners are a three-member bipartisan Board of elected officials in charge of elections and voter registration for the county of Philadelphia.

Each commissioner is elected to serve a fouryear term that coincides with the municipal election cycle for mayor and city council. The Commissioners set and enforce departmental policies to administer voter registrations and conduct elections in accordance with federal and state voter registration election laws. The City Commissioners were created by the Pennsylvania assembly in 1711 with a focus on taxation that held various regulatory powers throughout the centuries.

The commissioner started maintaining voter lists in 1799 and took on more election related responsibilities, but didn't emerge into its current form until the adaptation of the Philadelphia Home Rule Charter. We will start off with public
comments. Before beginning their comments, commenter shall state where they live or if they are not a resident of Philadelphia and that they are a Philadelphia taxpayer.

Public comment is not an opportunity for dialogue or Q and A . It is public comment, a chance for you to tell us what you think. Each speaker will have two minutes to speak, however, I may extend the time at my discretion. Public comment must concern matters on today's meeting agenda. Finally, it is my responsibility to preserve the order and decorum of the meetings. As such profane, slanderous, discriminator a personal attacks will not be tolerated.

If you wish to make a public objection to a perceived Sunshine violation, please raise your hand and I will recognize you. Outbursts will not be tolerated. Anyone wishing to offer a public comment, please step forward. Now, if there's anyone here that want to make a public comment in regards to a polling change, we're going to hold that. But if it's anything other than just polling changes, if someone wants to make a public comment, you're now welcome to make the public comment. Okay.

UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: (indiscernible).
MR. SABIR: No. But, sir, that's a polling place change, right?

UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Yes, sir.
MR. SABIR: We're going to come back to that when we do the polling place changes. Anyone else here, other than a polling place change. Well, is it in regards to the change, or you just want to make a comment, just in general?

MS. JONES WIBLE: No. It's not in regards to change is actually an issue with polling location at the polling location?

MR. SABIR: Sure. You want to come up, then?
MS. JONES WIBLE: Sure. Good morning. My name is Juanita Jones Wible. I'm the judge of elections for 57-10. We're located at Pollock Elementary School, and we have an issue with the where the location of the parking lot is on one side of the building and it's at least over 500 feet from the accessible area for handicapped voters. And it seems like we are deterring our handicapped voters from coming in because the parking lot is so far away and the parking spaces are so far away.

This person has to navigate the parking lot, come up to the sidewalk, and then come all the way

1 across the front of the building, past the front 2 steps, all the way to the other end of the building to get to the ramp, which sometimes the door isn't even open for them to even access the building itself. So that's another issue. But I would like to see if we can request that there's a temporary handicapped zone in front of the building, in front of the actual handicap ramp so that these people aren't killing themselves to get in.

My division itself has a paraplegic who is using ventilator as well as a mobilized device to get in, and he struggled and that man should not have had to struggle, especially for his handicap. So if there could be that section in front of the building on Welch Road, if that could actually be designated as a handicap location, just temporary for that day, for those hours, that would be fabulous.

We wouldn't have so many people turning away because they're actually coming to the front steps, and they're already exhausted because of the struggle to get out of the parking lot. So if we could do something with that, that would be wonderful.

MR. SABIR: Thank you.

MS. JONES WIBLE: You're welcome.
MR. SABIR: Thank you. And thank you for your service.

MS. JONES WIBLE: Thank you.
MR. SABIR: I really appreciate it. And Charles Stroman is here. Charlie, raise your hand. So be up to the meeting. You all can have a conversation with Charlie.

MS. JONES WIBLE: Okay, great. Thank you.
MR. SABIR: Thank you. Was there anyone else here with public comment? Okay. Thank you. We will now move to report from the secretary for email public comments Secretary Bluestein, are there any email public comments?

MR. BLUESTEIN: All comments that were emailed by 9:45 a.m. were shared with the Commissioners and the deputies by 10:00 a.m. And have been provided to each Commissioner at the beginning of the meeting and are available at the public comment table. We received one comment after last week's meeting from Laura Morris related to a polling place change that was decided at that meeting. I have reviewed the comment and ask that it be moved into the record.

Professional staff have reached out to the commenter and provided additional feedback.

MR. SABIR: Vice Chairwoman Deeley, did you have an opportunity to review this public comment?

MS. DEELEY: I have also reviewed it and agree it should be moved into the record.

MR. SABIR: I have also reviewed it. Secretary Bluestein, please move us into the record. We will now proceed to old business. We have a report from our directors of Election Administration and Operation which will be reported by Joseph Lynch and Stephanie Reid.

MR. LYNCH: Morning Commissioners?
MR. SABIR: Good morning.
MR. LYNCH: This is our weekly Sunshine update for March 27th, 2024. For our voter registration report, we processed a total of 84,433 registration applications so far. Out of these, 8,250 were sent to us on paper. All applications are up-to-date, and we are approved reading and making any necessary corrections. 16 polling locations were changed Insurer, and 9,987 voter ID cards were mailed out because of those changes. The new street lists are scheduled to be delivered on the 27 th.

For the County Board Election report, we are still accepting mail in and absentee ballot applications and the deadline for the primary

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election mail in applications is April 16th at 5:00 p.m. Voters can apply online at vote.Phila.gov. So far, we've approved 77,956 vote by mail
applications, which is 3,229 more than last week's reported numbers. We've processed a total of 47,588 paper applications and 30,368 electronic applications.

We are currently up to date on process and mail in and absentee ballot applications. Friday, April 12th, 2024, is the deadline for filing cycle 2 second Friday pre-primary campaign finance reports. All candidates, committees, political action committees or committees contributing to candidates for office that have made expenditures to influence a city election must file a report. For our election Board report confirmation calls and emails for Board workers continue.

We have confirmed a total of 6,434 Board workers and 1,111 declines and left messages for 468. Additionally, we currently have 1,369 poll workers registered for training so far. 4,587 have attended seminar training and 1,193 have attended express poll refresher training sessions. With the online training now accessible, 811 poll workers have completed training online. Our satellite unit

1 opened district 3 to the public on Monday, March 2 25th.

Additionally, we are in the lease draft phase for six locations with one location in the letter of intent phase. We are close to pursuing the letter of intent phase for a location in district 4. For district 1, we have received approval --

MS. REID: Going hiring efforts with positions for clerks, trades helpers, and temps. We've made significant progress in hiring with the majority of positions filled or in the process of being filled. Our current workforce totals 171 employees consisting of 143 civil service employees and 28 exempts. Within the civil service roles, we have 51 clerk 1s, 21 clerk 2s, 12 clerk 3s and 15 trades helper positions.

These staffing levels represent a 25 percent increase since the reorganization of the Board. This has been a collective effort across all the Commissioners offices and our human resource department. I think everyone who's been working to achieve full staffing levels. We're focusing on continuing new hire activities and preparing for orientations as well as planning for surge staffing. in scheduling polling place liaisons and conducting training sessions.

We've seen strong participation with 70 individuals signed up for training. Our team leads are actively reaching out to staff and we're steadily confirming a car drivers and drop box lockers to ensure smooth operations during the search.

For information technology, various e-public testing has been underway and interviews are ongoing for technical support specialist in GIS positions. We aim to have these positions ready for a vote next week. We continue providing day to day IT support to facilitate our operations.

In conclusion, I'm proud of the dedication and hard work exhibited by each department. Thank you for your commitment and relentless efforts. Thank you.

MR. SABIR: Vice chair Deeley, do you have any questions?

MS. DEELEY: I do not.
MR. SABIR: Secretary Bluestein, do you have any questions?

MR. BLUESTEIN: I have none.

MR. SABIR: This completes our old business Page 12 business. We will begin by considering the first agenda item under new business. Vice Chairwoman Deeley, please put forth the motion.

MS. DEELEY: Thank you, Mr. Chairman. I was dismayed recently when \(I\) saw that our list of drop boxes and there was only one additional drop box from the 2023 general election. We have invested hundreds to thousands of dollars into a camera network to enable us to place drop boxes in additional locations. We made progress adding additional boxes before last election. I know that after November much effort was made to survey new sites. We have the cameras. We have the boxes.

I know there is a challenge of getting the people to lock them, but we need to push to recruit more city employees to volunteer and can't allow that to slow us down or our drop box expansion. We are not going to wake up tomorrow and have 75 drop boxes. But every election we need to add more so that we are working towards having them all over the city. This being a presidential election year, the voters of Philadelphia expect and deserve additional services.

As their elected Commissioners it is our obligation to ensure that they receive it.

Therefore, \(I\) motion that it is the sentiment of this Board that there should be more than one additional drop box added since the 2023 general election and the Director of Election Administration and the Director of Election Operations to install additional drop boxes before the primary election. MR. SABIR: Is there a second? Not hearing a second. We will now move to the next agenda item, polling location changes. We will hear from Mr. Charles Stroman.

MR. STROMAN: Good morning, Commissioners.
MR. SABIR: Good morning, Charles.
MR. STROMAN: The first change I have is in 6th Ward, the 17th Division, moving out of Discovery Charter School to the first African Presbyterian Church. And that's due to a refusal for state testing.

MR. SABIR: Having heard the recommendation of professional staff, I move that we accept the polling change for Ward Division. I'm sorry. Ward 6, Division 17. Is there a second?

MR. BLUESTEIN: Second.
MR. SABIR: Secretary Bluestein, please call
the roll.
MR. BLUESTEIN: Vice chair Deeley?
MS. DEELEY: Aye.
MR. BLUESTEIN: I vote aye. Chairman Sabir?
MR. SABIR: Aye. Please proceed.
MR. STROMAN: Next change I have is in the 8th Ward, in the 34th Division, moving out of the Land Title Building to the Kimmel Center, and that's due to a refusal.

MR. SABIR: Having heard the recommendation of professional staff, I move that we accept the polling place change for Ward 8, Division 34. Is there a second?

MS. DEELEY: Second.
MR. SABIR: Secretary Bluestein, please call the roll.

MR. BLUESTEIN: Vice chair Deeley?
MS. DEELEY: Aye.
MR. BLUESTEIN: I vote aye. Chairman Sabir?
MR. SABIR: Aye. Please proceed.
MR. STROMAN: The next change I have, I'm
lumping a couple Wards together. It's Ward 16,
Division 12, 13, 17, and 18 and in Ward 28, Division
1 and 18. All them moving from the Cecil B Moore Rec Center to the Dobbins Technical High School.

MR. SABIR: Having heard the recommendation of the professional staff, I move that we accept the polling place change for Ward 16, Division 12, 13, 17, Ward 18, Division 1 and 18.

MR. BLUESTEIN: Second.
MR. SABIR: Secretary Bluestein, please call the roll.

MR. BLUESTEIN: Vice Chair Deeley?
MS. DEELEY: Aye.
MR. BLUESTEIN: I vote aye. Chairman Sabir?
MR. SABIR: Aye. Please proceed.
MR. STROMAN: Next change is in the 21st Ward, the \(43 r d\) Division, moving out of the Andorra library to the Summit Park Apartments, due to construction.

MR. SABIR: Having heard the recommendation of professional staff. I move that we accept the polling place change for Ward 21, Division 43. Is there a second?

MR. BLUESTEIN: Second.
MR. SABIR: Secretary Bluestein, please call the roll.

MR. BLUESTEIN: Vice Chair Deeley?
MS. DEELEY: Aye.
MR. BLUESTEIN: I vote aye. Chairman Sabir?

MR. SABIR: Aye. Please proceed.
MR. STROMAN: Next change is in the 23rd Ward, the 14th Division moving out of the Philadelphia Preparatory Charter School to the Baptist Worship Center due to a refusal.

MR. SABIR: Having heard the recommendation of professional staff, I move that we accept the polling place change for Ward 23, Division 14. Is there a second?

MS. DEELEY: Second.
MR. SABIR: Secretary Bluestein, please call the roll.

MR. BLUESTEIN: Vice Chair Deeley?
MS. DEELEY: Aye.
MR. BLUESTEIN: I vote aye. Chairman Sabir?
MR. SABIR: Aye. Please proceed.
MR. STROMAN: Next change is in the 23rd Ward, again in the 17th Division. Moving out American Legion Post 224 to the Second Baptist Church of Frankford. And that is due to construction.

MR. SABIR: Having heard the recommendation of professional staff, I move that we accept the polling place change for Ward 23, Division 17. Is there a second?

MR. BLUESTEIN: Second.

MR. SABIR: Secretary Bluestein, please call the roll.

MR. BLUESTEIN: Vice Chair Deeley?
MS. DEELEY: Aye.
MR. BLUESTEIN: I vote aye. Chairman Sabir?
MR. SABIR: Aye. Please proceed.
MR. STROMAN: Next changes in the 33rd Ward, the 2nd Division moving out of Juniata Park Academy to the Juniata Youth Club, and that's due to voter convenience.

MR. SABIR: Having heard the recommendation of professional staff, I move that we accept the polling place change for Ward 33, Division 2.

MR. BLUESTEIN: Second.
MR. SABIR: Secretary Bluestein, please call
the roll.
MR. BLUESTEIN: Vice Chair Deeley?
MS. DEELEY: Aye.
MR. BLUESTEIN: I vote aye. Chairman Sabir?
MR. SABIR: Aye. Please proceed.
MR. STROMAN: Next change is in the 35th Ward, the 5th Division moving out of Cedar Grove Christian Academy to the Philadelphia Protestant Home. And I announced that last week. I addressed the concerns.

I spoke to the people at the Protestant Home, and
they're not going to ask voters to take a picture or sign in. And also they will not allow another Division to come in with them. It's only the Division that they're in. So I address the concerns.

MR. SABIR: Having heard the recommendation of the professional staff, I move that we accept the polling place change for Ward 35 Division 5.

MS. DEELEY: Second.
MR. SABIR: Secretary Bluestein, please call the roll.

MR. BLUESTEIN: Vice Chair Deeley?
MS. DEELEY: Aye.
MR. BLUESTEIN: I vote aye. Chairman Sabir?
MR. SABIR: Aye. So for 35, 9.
MR. STROMAN: Next change is 35th Ward, 9th Division, moving out of Lawncrest Rec Center to the Philadelphia.

MR. SABIR: Hold on one second. So did anybody want to make public comment for 35 th. You want to come up? Let them sit there. Come on up. Then come on speak on the microphone, you want to state your name for the record? And thank you for coming up and thank you for your service.

MR. MASON: Good morning.

MR. SABIR: Good morning.
MR. MASON: This is the first time I jumped in the water here. So even as far as being on the polls, again, \(I\) just jumped in. And \(I\) know I can go a little further with the guidance of the Commission Board. Again, I've been working the polls 35, 9, and I found out that they will be moving. So I'm here today just to involve myself into the new location. So I believe I'm sitting right next to the right man here.

MR. SABIR: The right person.
MR. MASON: Okay. So I feel honored today.
Thank you.
MR. SABIR: And thank you for your service. I appreciate you. It's working the polls and everything. Just a hard job, man. Democracy lies with you. So thank you.

MR. MASON: Calvin Mason.
MR. SABIR: Sorry, first name, Calvin. Thank you, Calvin. Please proceed.

MR. STROMAN: So that would be the 35th Ward, 9th Division moving out of Lawncrest Rec Center to the Philadelphia Bible Fellowship due to construction.

MR. SABIR: Having heard the recommendation of
professional staff, I move that we accept the polling place change for Ward 35, Division 9.

MR. SABIR: Second.
MR. SABIR: Secretary Bluestein, please call the roll.

MR. BLUESTEIN: Vice Chair Deeley?
MS. DEELEY: Aye.
MR. BLUESTEIN: I vote aye, Chairman Sabir?
MR. SABIR: Aye. Please proceed.
MR. STROMAN: Next change will be in the 35th Ward again, the 10th Division, the 11th Division, and the 25 th Division, all moving out of Lawncrest Rec Center to the Franklin School due to construction.

MS. DEELEY: Second. Sorry. I'm getting ahead of myself.

MR. SABIR: Having heard the recommendation of professional staff, I move that we accept the polling place change for Ward 35, Division 10, 11, and 25. Vice Chair Deeley now may second it.

MS. DEELEY: Second.
MR. SABIR: Secretary Bluestein, please call the roll.

MR. BLUESTEIN: Vice Chair Deeley?
MS. DEELEY: Aye.

MR. BLUESTEIN: I vote aye. Chairman Sabir? MR. SABIR: Aye. Please proceed.

MR. STROMAN: Next change is in the 35th Ward again, the 12th Division and the 13th Division move out of Lawncrest Rec Center to the Prince of Peace Lutheran Church due to construction.

MR. SABIR: Having heard the recommendation of professional staff, I move that we accept the polling place change for Ward 35, Division 12 and 13. Is there a second?

MR. BLUESTEIN: Second.
MR. SABIR: Secretary Bluestein, please call the roll.

MR. BLUESTEIN: Vice Chair Deeley?
MS. DEELEY: Aye.
MR. BLUESTEIN: I vote aye. Chairman Sabir?
MR. SABIR: Aye. Please proceed.
MR. STROMAN: Next set of changes is in the 40th Ward, the 10th Division, 19th Division, 20th Division and 26th Division, all moving out of Southwest CDC to the William P. Post Roche number 21 at 6400 Paschall Avenue. And that's back to the original location.

MR. SABIR: Having heard the recommendation of professional staff. I move that we accept the

1 polling place change for Ward 40, Division 10, 19,
2 20, and 26. Is there a second?

MS. DEELEY: Second.
MR. SABIR: Secretary Bluestein, please call the roll.

MR. BLUESTEIN: Vice Chair Deeley?
MS. DEELEY: Aye.
MR. BLUESTEIN: I vote aye. Chairman Sabir?
MR. SABIR: Aye. Please proceed.
MR. STROMAN: Next set of changes in the 40 th Ward. Again, the 13th Division and the 14 th

Division moving out of Straight Gate Church to the Ezekiel Baptist Church due to a refusal.

MR. SABIR: Having heard the recommendation of professional staff, I move that we accept the polling place change for Ward 40, Division 13 and
14. Is there a second?

MS. DEELEY: Second.
MR. SABIR: Secretary Bluestein, please call the roll.

MR. BLUESTEIN: Vice Chair Deeley?
MS. DEELEY: Aye.
MR. BLUESTEIN: I vote aye, Chairman Sabir?
MR. SABIR: Aye. Please proceed.
MR. STROMAN: Next changes in the 43rd Ward, 22nd Division, and 23rd Division moving out of the PGW Building to the Lenfest Center. And that is due to the building closure.

MR. SABIR: Having heard the recommendation of professional staff, I move that we accept the polling place change for Ward 43, Division 22, Division 23. Is there a second?

MS. DEELEY: Second.
MR. SABIR: Secretary, Bluestein, please call the roll. I'm sorry. You have a public comment for Ward 43, Division 22 and 23. Okay. You want to come up and identify yourself? Thank you for coming up. I appreciate you.

MS. BRADSHAW: My name is Chinita Bradshaw. I'm a committee person for that Ward. We did get the information about the closing of \(P G W\) only by walking by seeing a sticker on the door. And we received nothing from emails or anything of that nature and anything from the Ward leader. State Representative, and our Ward leader, Danilo Burgos, and I worked diligently to find places that we could go because a lot of the voters don't want to go to the Lenfest.

And with that being said, we have picked about five people that are sent to you. I mean, five

1 different places. They were all turned down. One 2 of them was turned down because of the crossing of 3 Broad Street. And I wanted to know why is that.

MR. STROMAN: I can address that. Crossing a big major street like Broad Street. It actually wasn't an improvement from the Lenfest Center, and it's actually out of the Ward. Lenfest Center is closer to them, two Divisions. As far as the other sites that \(I\) was given, they are not handicap accessible. And we cannot use a place with more than one 6-and-a-half-inch step. So it's very difficult sometimes to find a place. And that area there is extremely difficult. There's many stores and residences, not many places to pick.

MS. BRADSHAW: Well, one of the places we chose was a hall that's handicapped accessible. And they were willing to let us house there for this voting process. And that was also turned down because of the crossing of Broad Street. We did reach out to individuals in the neighborhood that were willing to assist with helping people cross the street. We purchased the green reflector jackets and all that kind of stuff.

And most of our voters are old voters that have nieces, nephews, daughters, and sons that drive them

1 over to the polling place. And then some of them,
2 this might be the only time they get out and walk the neighborhood, really and truly to come out and vote. So the Lenfest is a secluded area where you have to go down. The area where all of the women of the night and drug dealers as well as users are all on that block right across from Little Flower School. It's a very deserted area.

MR. SABIR: Yes. I'll make a motion to table this one. Is there a second?

MS. DEELEY: Second.
MR. SABIR: So we'll table the discussion for Ward 43 Division 22nd, 23rd, and we'll do a little bit more research over there.

MS. BRADSHAW: Okay.
MR. SABIR: We'll see so as of now, just let you know what happened. We didn't vote on moving it. We just moved to hold the conversation up. And then we'll have a double conversation. Then we'll vote on it --

MR. BASH: Okay.
MR. SABIR: -- And we will get more information.

MS. BRADSHAW: And I just want to quickly say the reason I'm here is because of the voters. We

1 have a great report with the Lenfest if it comes to 2 that, then it just has to be that. But with people in the neighborhood helping to help us have something closer, \(I\) just thought \(I\) would say that.

MR. SABIR: So is there any other locations other than the one that you saw?

MS. BRADSHAW: Yeah, it was four more, but --
MR. SABIR: No. I'm saying not the ones that we didn't do the investigation for. I'm saying. But is there any ones other than that we didn't do an investigation for as I'm asking?

MS. BRADSHAW: I think it may have been one, but that was on Germantown Avenue. And if they go down there, they might as well go probably to the Lenfest Center.

MR. SABIR: So we'll look at investigate this a little bit more.

MS. BRADSHAW: Thank you so much. Thank you very much.

MR. STROMAN: Next change is in the 46th Ward, the 4th Division moving out of the Global Leadership Academy to the Philadelphia Health Center on Cedar. And that's due to state testing.

MR. SABIR: I got you. That was just for 22 nd Division? So, Charlie we are going to go back to 43
for a second?
MR. STROMAN: Sure.
MR. SABIR: So that was just for the 22 nd
Division, right?
MR. STROMAN: 22nd and the 23rd Division.
MR. SABIR: Okay.
MR. STROMAN: Yeah.
MR. SABIR: So we just tabling for the 22 nd?
Correct.
MR. STROMAN: If that's what she wants, that's fine. I mean, I can address that afterwards.

MR. SABIR: So we don't have any opposition or anything for the 23rd Division. Correct. Like no one's there for the \(23 r d\).

MR. STROMAN: Correct.
MR. SABIR: I'm saying. But you came. You comment on the 22nd Division? I'm asking you.

MS. BRADSHAW: No. 23 rd
MR. SABIR: For the 23rd?
MS. BRADSHAW: Yes.
MR. SABIR: So nobody was here commented for the 22nd Division? So, Commissioners, did you all want to table 22 nd and \(23 r d\) or did you all want to vote on 22 nd?

MS. DEELEY: I could second a vote on 22 if
there's nobody here to object.
MR. SABIR: We're going to 22. So. Charlie, so is your recommendation to move Ward 43 Division 22nd. Is that correct?

MR. STROMAN: Correct.
MR. SABIR: Having heard that recommendation of the professional staff, I move that we accept the polling place change for Ward 43, Division 22. Is there a second?

MS. DEELEY: Second.
MR. SABIR: Secretary Bluestein, please call the roll.

MR. BLUESTEIN: Vice Chair Deeley?
MS. DEELEY: Aye.
MR. BLUESTEIN: I vote aye. Chairman Sabir?
