The commission is set 18 19 and enforced departmental policies to administer 20 voter registration and conduct elections in accordance with federal and state voter 21 registration and election laws. 22 23 The City Commissioners were created by 24 the Pennsylvania Assembly in 1711 with a focus on 25 taxation and held various regulatory powers

Page 3 throughout the centuries. The commissioner started 1 2 maintaining voter lists in 1799 and took on more election-related responsibility but didn't emerge 3 4 into its current form until the adoption of 5 Philadelphia Home Rule Charter in 1951.
