3 - - - - -

4 JUDGE CRUMLISH: Good morning. I
5 will now call this meeting to order. First of
6 all, I will remind people that it my duty and
7 obligation to preserve the order and decorum of
8 these meetings. Be advised that it is also my
9 duty and responsibility to enforce the rules of
10 decorum and civility.

11 The Sunshine Act permits anyone
12 attending a public meeting to object to a
13 proceed violation at any time during the time
14 meeting. If you choose to do so, please simply
15 state your objection. You'll be reminded that
16 the objecting is not a opportunity for
17 interrogation, litigation, or speech making.

18 We will now move to public comment.
19 Public comment is not an opportunity for dialog
20 or question and answer. It's a public comment.
21 It's a chance for you to tell us what you
22 think. Each speaker may have about two
23 minutes. However, I may extend that time at my
24 discretion. All public comments much be

1 relevant or german to the Board's business.

2 Please note, that we will be doing
3 polling place changes later in the meeting.
4 Anyone wishing to be heard on polling place
5 changes should wait until that time.

6 Is there anyone here for public
7 comment?

8 MR. LOMELI: Good afternoon,
9 Honorable Judges and the Office of City
10 Commissioners. My name is Marcos Lomeli. I'm
11 the Program Director at Ceiba. A community
12 based organization serving Philadelphia's
13 Latino and immigrant provision population.

14 Today, we want to thank the Office
15 of City Commissioners, especially the Deputy
16 Commissioners, as well as the Office of City
17 Solicitor for listening to our requests over
18 that last few weeks to expand mail-in ballot
19 drop off options for Philadelphia's mainly
20 Spanish speaking neighborhoods.

21 While we will not get a fixed
22 official mail-in ballot drop box for this
23 May's primary, we are encouraged that the
24 office has committed to setting up mobile

1 sites in the neighborhood on the last two
2 Saturdays and the last two Sundays before the
3 elections -- located at 401 West Lehigh Avenue
4 in the heart of the Latino community.

5 This commitment is hopefully the
6 first step towards ensuring that a community
7 with historically low voter turnout can make
8 sure their voices are heard giving them the
9 option of using a simple and effective
10 tool -- one of which the voices of all are
11 listened to with the same intention and same
12 respect.

13 Once again, we thank the office
14 of the City Commissioners, the Deputy
15 Commissioners themselves, and of course the
16 hard working staff for their year round
17 efforts to keep the election ran in a safe,
18 effective, and inclusive ethical manner.

19 I also want to thank specifically
20 the Honorable Judges. As a nephew of a Court
21 of Common Pleas judge, I know how busy you all
22 are. Thank you for your service in the City.
23 We look forward to continuing these
24 conversations. Gracias.

1 JUDGE CRUMLISH: Thank you very
2 much, sir.

3 Any other public comments?

4 Now, we're going to move to
5 emailed public comments.

6 Judge Furlong, do we receive any
7 emailed public comments?

8 JUDGE FURLONG: Yes, I did. All
9 comments that were emailed by 9:45 a.m. were
10 shared with the members of the Board and
11 Deputies at 10:00 a.m., and have provided to
12 each member of the Board at the beginning of
13 the meeting, and are available at the public
14 comment table.

15 We received five comments from
16 James Nicolo and Brian O'Neil. I reviewed the
17 comments and ask that they be moved into the
18 record.

19 Additionally, I don't know if this
20 is the appropriate time, Mr. Chairman, we also
21 received petitions from electors in Division
22 10 of the 63rd Ward, and also Division 12 of
23 the 63rd Ward. They can be addressed at the
24 time we vote and polling place changes.

1 JUDGE CRUMLISH: Yes, Judge. What
2 I think we'll do is we'll move our second
3 motion to receive into the record, the emailed
4 public comments -- we'll first go through the
5 Executive Directors presentation, and then
6 move to polling places.

7 When we reach that particular
8 polling place area -- if there's an objection
9 or discussion regarding the proposal, we want
10 to entertain that before we make a decision on
11 whether or not to move the polling places.

12 JUDGE FURLONG: I understand.
13 We'll also move any public comment --

14 JUDGE CRUMLISH: Yes. We'll have
15 that discussion on that specific Ward or
16 Division and then we'll make a decision as a
17 Board.

18 JUDGE FURLONG: Thank you, Judge.
19 I also received public comments that came in by
20 10:00 a.m. I think they should be moved into
21 the record.

22 JUDGE CRUMLISH: Thank you.

23 All in favor?

24 - - - - -

1 (Respond I.)

2 - - - - -

3 JUDGE CRUMLISH: They are all
4 accepted into the permanent record by the
5 Board.

6 Next, Mr. Lynch. We're moving to
7 old business which is to reach the Executive
8 Directors report.

9 MR. LYNCH: Good morning. County
10 Board of Election report, as of yesterday,
11 they have approved 82,659 vote by mail
12 applications, which is 4,004 added from last
13 weeks total. Of those, 48,518 are paper
14 applications, and 34,141 are electronic
15 applications. This includes overseas and
16 military voters.

17 We have a total of 299
18 applications waiting to be proceeded. Of
19 those, 79 are paper applications, and 220
20 electronic applications.

21 Monday, April 24th, we opened our
22 satellite office in City Hall, Room 140. So
23 far we have processed 22 over the counter
24 requests for mail-in ballots to date. Voters

1 can request a mail-in or replacement ballot
2 in person and return it on the same visit.

3 Office hours in Room 140 are
4 Monday through Friday, 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m.
5 Voter information is available on our website
6 at Vote.Phila.Gov. The deadline to apply for
7 a mail-in ballot is May 9th at 5:00 p.m.

8 The voter registration unit for
9 the election cycle to date, we have processed
10 119,816 registration applications, of which
11 6,615 were paper.

12 All applications are up to date.
13 They are currently reviewing all applications
14 for errors. The street lists are ready for
15 pick-up.

16 The Election Board Unit, the Board
17 ha trained 4,320 poll workers. They're still
18 doing makeup classes every Friday for those
19 who couldn't attend at Delaware and Spring
20 Garden in the 6th Ward.

21 To date, the Board has trained
22 2,700 poll workers for the primary elections.
23 1,502 are scheduled for the upcoming
24 training. 1,700 have signed up for online

1 training.

2 That's all I have, Your Honor.

3 JUDGE CRUMLISH: Thank you,
4 Mr. Lynch. We appreciate the professional
5 staff for their ongoing hard work on behalf on
6 the City.

7 MR. LYNCH: Thank you.

8 JUDGE CRUMLISH: Mr. Stroman,
9 moving to new business. Do you have our --
10 we're going to now address the polling
11 place --

12 MR. STROMAN: 63rd Ward --

13 JUDGE CRUMLISH: Sure. We
14 have -- we're going to move to Ward 63,
15 Divisions 4, 9, 10 and 12. So we have -- here
16 in person.

17 Can you identify yourself?

18 MR. FENERTY: Vince Fenerty,
19 Chairman of the Philadelphia GOP.

20 MR. NICOLO: James Nicolo,
21 Republican Ward Leader.

22 JUDGE CRUMLISH: Is there anyone
23 else that wishes to address the Board
24 regarding the 63 Ward, these divisions?

1 Mr. Fenerty, since you raised your
2 hand first, do you have any public comment
3 regarding the 63 Ward for those divisions?

4 MR. FENERTY: Yes. Thank you for
5 hearing my testimony. I will be brief. In
6 conjunction with the ward leader, Mr. -- who
7 is also here today, and these changes that
8 were called to my attention.

9 I know the area well. I went to
10 the rec centers. It's my understanding that
11 it's because of an electricity problem.
12 There's not enough electricity. When I went
13 into the rec centers I think it's very
14 inconvenient that for all four of them to be
15 moved. I think it can be split well to remain
16 where their at. Only two should be moved. I
17 want to --

18 JUDGE FURLONG: Just to be clear,
19 all four are -- we're voting at the Foxchase
20 School, correct?

21 MR. FENERTY; that's correct.

22 JUDGE FURLONG: And the proposal
23 is to move all four Divisions into the rec
24 center?

1 MR. FENERTY: Yes, that's the
2 proposal.

3 JUDGE FURLONG: Okay.

4 MR. FENERTY: And we're asking for
5 them to be split into -- two divisions stay
6 and two divisions to be moved.

7 JUDGE FURLONG: And historically,
8 two divisions have voted out of Foxchase
9 School, correct?

10 MR. FENERTY: Yes.

11 JUDGE FURLONG: And the other two
12 divisions were voting out of a fire house?

13 MR. FENERTY: I believe out of a
14 fire house. That stopped during the pandemic.
15 The fire -- isn't allowing any voting in any
16 fire house.

17 JUDGE CRUMLISH: Let me just ask.
18 What two divisions are you suggesting to
19 remain in the rec center -- I agree by the
20 testimony --

21 MR. FENERTY: The divisions on
22 my --

23 JUDGE FURLONG: We have moved
24 appeal indicating that Divisions 10 and 12 had

1 voted out of Foxchase School for years --

2 MR. FENERTY: That's correct.

3 JUDGE FURLONG: And Divisions 4
4 and 9 were moved from the FoxChase Firehouse
5 to the school?

6 MR. FENERTY: Not --

7 JUDGE FURLONG: So the questions
8 for the Chairman is, which two, if you
9 know --

10 MR. FENERTY: 4 and 9.

11 JUDGE FURLONG: To the playground,
12 yes. Okay.

13 JUDGE CRUMLISH: Mr. Fenerty, you
14 may continue.

15 MR. FENERTY: Your Honor -- it's
16 inconvenient for those people in those two
17 divisions to go that far. Okay. The area was
18 examined. The voting must be -- but a request
19 was made to move all four. I think that
20 request is an error.

21 We're always looking for people to
22 have the biggest advantage point and most
23 convenient point -- just splitting them would
24 be more beneficial. I'm not here for a

1 political reason. I'm here to back my Ward
2 Leader.

3 JUDGE CRUMLISH: That's a little
4 contradictory, but --

5 MR. FENERTY: -- GOP Chairman more
6 than 10 years, I am always agree with
7 everything. I just don't think this is the
8 best.

9 JUDGE CRUMLISH: Mr. Fenerty, your
10 testimony is based upon your experience and
11 knowledge of the neighborhoods and the voter
12 patterns that -- is that correct?

13 MR. FENERTY: Yes.

14 JUDGE CRUMLISH: Anything else,
15 Mr. Fenerty?

16 MR. FENERTY: No. I just thank
17 you for hearing my testimony.

18 JUDGE CRUMLISH: It's our
19 pleasure.

20 MR. NICOLO: Good afternoon,
21 Members of the Board. My name is James
22 Nicolo. I am the 63rd Ward Leader. I was
23 notified that a polling place inspector had
24 gone to the Foxchase School to investigate

1 the electrical situation.

2 He found that there were
3 insufficient outlets to accommodate the new
4 electronic poll books for those
5 divisions -- so why are we moving four? Why
6 aren't we just moving two? Moving forward,
7 it's an inconvenience --

8 JUDGE FURLONG: Can I ask you
9 something? Are you familiar with the
10 playground.

11 MR. NICOLO: Yes, I am.

12 JUDGE FURLONG: In relation to
13 school where is the playground?

14 MR. NICOLO: Right next to it.
15 That's Rockwell Ave --

16 JUDGE FURLONG: Okay.

17 MR. NICOLO: It's --

18 JUDGE FURLONG: Okay. I'm
19 familiar with the playground because I
20 coach basketball and baseball. I've been
21 there -- yes. There is parking at the school
22 which could accommodate both divisions.

23 MR. NICOLO: Yes. It's probably
24 as big as the old Veterans Stadium. There's

1 more than enough parking. There's more than
2 enough parking for the four divisions that are
3 there now.

4 JUDGE FURLONG: Okay.

5 MR. NICOLO: The situation is
6 there's four divisions at the school now. We
7 got locked out of the firehouse in 2020. So
8 with respect to the -- moving them all to the
9 Foxchase Playground, we'll have obstacles in
10 voting. The largest obstacle is parking.

11 At Foxchase School the polling
12 location and the parking location is --
13 there's a huge parking lot there. With
14 respect to the rec center there is no parking
15 lot. It's street parking.

16 The problem is, across the street
17 from the Foxchase Playground is the Regional
18 Rail Line. There's two big parking lot there.
19 The problem is, the parking authority operates
20 the parking lots. So everyone that takes the
21 train -- on street parking before going into
22 the lot and paying.

23 Adjacent to the playground there
24 is a parking lot there. A small parking lot

1 that the school people -- I recognize that
2 there's no school that day. So that parking
3 lot with the driveway in the back of the
4 school, people could park there. There are 41
5 parking spots there. Six of them are along
6 the west side. So you really have about 35
7 parking spots there.

8 So if you move all four of those
9 divisions to the playground -- so that's 20
10 workers. Potentially 20 cars. Then you have
11 four division with committee people parking
12 there. There's going to be -- you know, the
13 Democratic Party, they're going to -- everyone
14 is going to be there.

15 Parking at Foxchase School is
16 definitely -- there is no good reason or
17 justification to move all four when there is
18 electrical outlets there. The problem is when
19 you have four divisions voting in one place,
20 it's -- first of all, changing the polling
21 place from one division causes confusion.
22 Changing four just quadrupled the problem.

23 Once you're in there having four
24 divisions in one polling place, it's confusing

1 as to which table people go to. Most people
2 don't know which division -- having four
3 divisions in one polling place will increase
4 -- if one person gets in the wrong line, it
5 creates frustration amongst the other voters
6 who are in the correct line.

7 Having four divisions in one
8 polling place would give long wait time and
9 lines outside. So in summary, I would submit
10 to you that moving all four to the school
11 would cause all these problems and voter
12 frustration. I believe that would --

13 JUDGE FURLONG: Thank you.

14 MR. FENERTY: I respectfully
15 request that you keep 10 and 12 at Foxchase
16 School and move 4 and 9 to the Foxchase Rec
17 Center.

18 JUDGE CRUMLISH: Thank you very
19 much. Judge Furlong, based upon the public
20 comments in the email, and your familiarity of
21 this area, would you like to compose a polling
22 place for these four divisions?

23 JUDGE FURLONG: Yes, I would.

24 JUDGE CRUMLISH: Tell us. Give us

1 the division, and the ward, and tell us what
2 where they're going to be moved to.

3 JUDGE FURLONG: The proposal is
4 that Divisions 10 and 12 remain at the
5 Foxchase School, and that we allow Division 4
6 and 9 to move to the Foxchase Rec Center.

7 JUDGE JOHNSON: I second the
8 motion.

9 JUDGE CRUMLISH: All in favor?

10 - - - - -

11 (Respond I.)

12 - - - - -

13 MR. FENERTY: Thank you. I
14 forgot to mention this. There were signatures
15 and petition submitted by qualified electors
16 in Division 10 of the 63rd Ward. We have 24
17 signatures requesting that they keep the
18 polling place at the Foxchase School as I
19 proposed.

20 There are 20 signatures from
21 electors in Division 12 of the 63rd Ward
22 asking that -- to stay at the school. I'm
23 sorry. 10 and 12, that those two remain at
24 the school under my proposal and the other

1 two -- 63-4 and 63-9 move to the rec
2 center.

3 JUDGE CRUMLISH: We will accept
4 that.

5 MR. FENERTY: Thank you.

6 JUDGE CRUMLISH: Anything further
7 to be heard from the 63rd Ward.

8 MR. FENERTY: No, Your Honor.

9 JUDGE CRUMLISH: Thank you very
10 much. You're excused.

11 MR. FENERTY: Thank you.

12 JUDGE CRUMLISH: We will now
13 begin with number one of our -- which is the
14 10th Ward, 5th Division -- remaining polling
15 places.

16 MR. STROMAN: Thank you. The
17 first change I'm going to lump together.
18 Ward 10 Division 5, and Ward 10 Division 22.
19 Moving out of the St. Athanasius School into
20 the Paragon Banquet Hall. That is Due to
21 Refusal.

22 JUDGE CRUMLISH: I move to accept
23 that proposed change of 10-5 and 10-20.

24 All in favor?

5 MR. STROMAN: Next will be in the

6 10th Ward, the 20th Division moving out of

7 Building 21 School to the Paragon Banquet

21 going to move them all to the Shrine

22 Miraculous Medal. That is due to refusal.

23 They're back to their original location.

24 JUDGE CRUMLISH: Do I have a
