The Commissioners set 11 and enforce departmental policies to administer 12 voter registration and conduct elections in 13 accordance with federal and state voter 14 15 registration election laws. 16 The City Commissioners were created by 17 the Pennsylvania Assembly in 1711, voter lists in 1799, and took on more election-related 18 19 responsibilities, but didn't emerge into its 20 current form until the adoption of the 21 Philadelphia Home Rule Charter in 1951. 22 We will start off with public comments. 23 Before beginning their comments, commenters will 24 state where they live, or if they are not a 25 resident of Philadelphia, that they are a
