3	MR. SABIR: Good morning. I call to order
4	meeting of the Philadelphia City Commissioner's Board
5	of Elections for Friday, May 3rd. This meeting is in
6	compliance under the Pennsylvania Sunshine Act. The
7	Philadelphia City Commissioners are a three member
8	bipartisan board of elected officials in charge of
9	elections and voter registration for the County of
10	Philadelphia. Each Commissioner is elected to serve a
11	four year term that coincide with the municipal
12	election cycle for mayor and city council.
13	The Commissioners set and enforced departmental
14	policies to administer voter registration and conduct
15	the elections in accordance with federal state voter
16	registration and election laws. The City
17	Commissioners were created by the Pennsylvania
18	Assembly in 1711 with a focus on taxation and held
19	various regulatory powers throughout the centuries.
20	The Commissioners started maintaining voter lists
21	in 1799 and took on more election related
22	responsibilities, but didn't emerge in its current
23	form until the adaption of Philadelphia's Home Rule
24	Charter, 1951.
25	We will start off with public comments. Before

- 1 beginning their comments, commenter should state where
- 2 they live or if they are not a resident of
- 3 Philadelphia and that they are a Philadelphia
- 4 taxpayer. Public comment is not an opportunity for
- 5 dialog or Q and A.
- 6 It is public comment, a chance for you to tell us
- 7 what you think. Each speaker will have two minutes to
- 8 speak, however, I may extend the time at my
- 9 discretion. Public comment must concern matters on
- 10 today's meeting agenda.
- 11 Finally, it is my responsibility to preserve the
- 12 order and decorum of the meetings as such, profane,
- 13 slanderous, discriminatory, personal attacks will not
- 14 be tolerated.
- 15 If you wish to make a public objection to a
- 16 perceived Sunshine violation, please raise your hand
- 17 and I will recognize you. Outbursts will not be
- 18 tolerated. Anyone wishing to offer public comment,
- 19 please step forward. Hearing none, we will now move
- 20 to report from Secretary Bluestein.
- 21 MR. BLUESTEIN: There were no public comments
- 22 emailed by 10:45 a.m..
- 23 MR. SABIR: Thank you, Secretary Bluestein. This
- 24 completes our old business for today's meeting. We
- 25 will now move to the next agenda item, provisional

- 1 ballot sufficiency determinations made by our
- 2 Supervisor of Election, Roxanne Huff-Gross.
- 3 Before we proceed, the professional staff has
- 4 identified an additional category that was not
- 5 included on the agenda. Therefore, I make the motion
- 6 to amend the agenda to add provisional ballots that
- 7 were not signed by the board workers, is there a
- 8 second?
- 9 MR. BLUESTEIN: Second.
- 10 MR. SABIR: Roxanne, could you please provide a
- 11 report on this category?
- MS. HUFF-GROSS: Good morning, Commissioners.
- 13 Yes, we have a total of -- my name is Roxanne Huff-
- 14 Gross. I am voter registration and election board
- 15 supervisor and I'm here to serve and to inform you
- 16 about the status of the proficiency ballots. For an
- 17 example, is there some --
- 18 MR. SABIR: Vote for the motion real quick.
- 19 There was a second, we just want to vote on that
- 20 motion real quick. Vice Chair, did you have any
- 21 comments that you wanted to make on that motion?
- MS. DEELEY: I do not.
- 23 MR. SABIR: Secretary Bluestein, do you have any
- 24 comments you want to make on this?
- MR. BLUESTEIN: I do not.

Page 6 MR. SABIR: Okay. You want to call the roll on 1 this one? 2 3 MR. BLUESTEIN: Yes. Vice Chair Deeley? 4 MS. DEELEY: I vote aye. 5 MR. BLUESTEIN: I vote aye. Chairman Sabir? 6 MR. SABIR: Aye. 7 MS. HUFF-GROSS: Okay. Is there something I need 8 to do for this? 9 MR. SABIR: No. 10 MS. HUFF-GROSS: Okay. I have 49 in total that 11 are not signed by the Board. Neither the Judge of Election or the Minority Inspector signature. 12 Thank you. I motion that this Board 13 MR. SABIR: accepts provisional ballots where the board workers 14 15 did not sign the ballots, but the voter completed the 16 ballot correctly. Is there a second? Second. 17 MS. DEELEY: 18 MR. SABIR: Secretary Bluestein, please call the 19 roll. 20 MR. BLUESTEIN: Vice Chair Deeley? 21 MS. DEELEY: I vote aye. 22 MR. BLUESTEIN: I vote aye. Chairman Sabir? So now we're going to move down 23 MR. SABIR: Aye. 24 to the other categories. I motion -- okay. 25 Roxanne, you want to do the report for each one of the

Page 7 1 categories? 2 MS. HUFF-GROSS: Certainly. 3 MR. SABIR: Thank you. MS. HUFF-GROSS: First category is not in the 4 5 Sure system, we have 68. MR. SABIR: I motion that this Board does not 6 accept the ballots where the voter is not found in 8 Sure. Is there a second? 9 MS. DEELEY: Second. 10 MR. SABIR: Does anyone want to make a comment on 11 this topic? 12 MR. BLUESTEIN: No, Mr. Chairman. 13 MR. SABIR: Okay. Secretary Bluestein, you want to call the roll? 14 15 MR. BLUESTEIN: Vice Chair Deeley? 16 MS. DEELEY: I vote aye. 17 MR. BLUESTEIN: I vote aye. Chairman Sabir? 18 MR. SABIR: Aye. Roxanne, you want to do the 19 next? 20 MS. HUFF-GROSS: Canceled registrations. There 2.1 were 35. MR. SABIR: I motion that this board does not 22 accept ballots of voters with a canceled registration. 23 24 Is there a second? 25 MS. DEELEY: Second.

Page 8 1 MR. SABIR: Does anyone want to make a comment on this motion? 2 MS. DEELEY: I do not. 3 4 MR. BLUESTEIN: No, Mr. Chairman. 5 MR. SABIR: Secretary Bluestein, please call the roll. 7 MR. BLUESTEIN: Vice Chair Deeley? MS. DEELEY: I vote aye. 8 9 MR. BLUESTEIN: I vote ave. Chairman Sabir? 10 MR. SABIR: Aye. Please proceed. 11 MS. HUFF-GROSS: Next category, registered in another county, there were 71. 12 MR. SABIR: I motion that this Board does not 13 accept ballots of individuals who are registered in 14 15 another county. Is there a second? 16 MS. DEELEY: Second. 17 MR. SABIR: Does anyone have a comment on this motion? 18 19 MS. DEELEY: I do not. 20 MR. BLUESTEIN: No, Mr. Chairman. MR. SABIR: Secretary Bluestein, please call the 21 22 roll. MR. BLUESTEIN: Vice Chair Deeley? 23 24 MS. DEELEY: I vote aye. 25 MR. BLUESTEIN: I vote aye. Chairman Sabir?

- 1 MR. SABIR: Aye. Please proceed.
- 2 MS. HUFF-GROSS: Next category, not signed by the
- 3 voter. There was one.
- 4 MR. SABIR: I motion that this Board does not
- 5 accept ballots that have not been signed by the voter.
- 6 Is there a second?
- 7 MR. BLUESTEIN: Second.
- 8 MR. SABIR: Does anyone want to make a comment on
- 9 this motion?
- 10 MS. DEELEY: I do not.
- MR. BLUESTEIN: No, Mr. Chairman.
- MR. SABIR: Secretary Bluestein? Please call the
- 13 roll.
- MR. BLUESTEIN: Vice Chair Deeley?
- 15 MS. DEELEY: I vote aye.
- 16 MR. BLUESTEIN: I vote aye. Chairman Sabir?
- 17 MR. SABIR: So, what now? Aye. You want to
- 18 proceed?
- 19 MS. HUFF-GROSS: Next category. Signature
- 20 doesn't match, there were none.
- 21 MR. SABIR: Thank you.
- 22 MS. HUFF-GROSS: Next category. Voted in person,
- 23 there were seven.
- MR. SABIR: Okay. I motion that this Board does
- 25 not accept ballots where it was determined that the

- 1 voter voted in person. Is there a second?
- 2 MS. DEELEY: Second.
- 3 MR. SABIR: Does anyone have any comment on this
- 4 motion?
- 5 MS. DEELEY: I do not.
- 6 MR. BLUESTEIN: No, Mr. Chairman.
- 7 MR. SABIR: Secretary Bluestein, please call the
- 8 roll.
- 9 MR. BLUESTEIN: Vice Chair Deeley?
- 10 MS. DEELEY: I vote aye.
- 11 MR. BLUESTEIN: I vote aye. Chairman Sabir?
- 12 MR. SABIR: Aye. You can proceed.
- 13 MS. HUFF-GROSS: Next category. No ward division
- 14 on envelope, none.
- 15 MR. SABIR: I motion that this Board accept
- 16 ballots in instances where the provider provided all
- 17 of the necessary and material information except the
- 18 ward and division. Is there a second?
- 19 MS. DEELEY: There is no ballots.
- 20 MR. SABIR: Okay. So there's no second. There's
- 21 zero in that category. We'll proceed to the next one.
- 22 You want to proceed, Roxanne?
- 23 MS. HUFF-GROSS: Yes. Returned mail in or
- 24 absentee that was counted. There were 40 mail in and
- 25 one absentee.

- 1 MR. SABIR: I motion that this Board does not
- 2 accept ballots in instances where the voter did not
- 3 return a mail in or absentee ballot that was counted.
- 4 Is there a second?
- 5 MS. DEELEY: Second.
- 6 MR. SABIR: Does anyone have a comment on this
- 7 motion?
- 8 MR. BLUESTEIN: No, Mr. Chairman.
- 9 MR. SABIR: Okay. Secretary Bluestein, please
- 10 call the roll.
- 11 MR. BLUESTEIN: Vice Chair Deeley?
- 12 MS. DEELEY: I vote aye.
- 13 MR. BLUESTEIN: I vote aye. Chairman Sabir?
- MR. SABIR: Aye. You want to proceed?
- 15 MS. HUFF-GROSS: All right. Ballot not enclosed
- 16 in secrecy envelope. There were a total of 72.
- 17 MS. DEELEY: Mr. Chairman, I have a question for
- 18 Roxanne.
- 19 MS. HUFF-GROSS: Yes.
- 20 MR. SABIR: Proceed.
- MS. DEELEY: Roxanne, were these voters
- 22 determined to be registered voters?
- MS. HUFF-GROSS: Yes.
- MS. DEELEY: These voters signed the affidavit,
- 25 correct?

- 1 MS. HUFF-GROSS: Yes.
- 2 MS. DEELEY: So the only thing wrong with these
- 3 ballots is that they are missing a secrecy envelope,
- 4 correct?
- 5 MS. HUFF-GROSS: They were not in a secrecy
- 6 envelope, but there was no secrecy envelope within the
- 7 ballot.
- 8 MS. DEELEY: Thank you.
- 9 MR. SABIR: I motion that this Board does not
- 10 accept ballots that were not enclosed in the secrecy
- 11 envelope. Is there a second?
- 12 MS. DEELEY: Mr. Chairman --
- 13 MR. SABIR: Hold on. Hold on now.
- MR. BLUESTEIN: Second.
- 15 MR. SABIR: Okay.
- MS. DEELEY: Mr. Chairman, may I make a remark on
- 17 the motion?
- 18 MR. SABIR: Yes, ma'am. But just, you know, when
- 19 you talk while I'm talking one on one, it confuses
- 20 everything. But just, you know, I give every
- 21 opportunity after we second the motion. So you on
- 22 nine, is that correct? Is this the same topic?
- MS. DEELEY: Yes, Mr. Chairman.
- MR. SABIR: Good.
- 25 MS. DEELEY: I believe whether or not a ballot is

- 1 in the secrecy envelope, is not material in
- 2 determining whether or not such individual is
- 3 qualified under state law to vote in such election.
- 4 But unlike the mail ballots where the voters are
- 5 filling them out on their kitchen table, these voters
- 6 are doing this process in the polling place. The
- 7 Judge of Election should be instructing them to place
- 8 their ballot in a secrecy envelope.
- 9 So this is a poll worker error that we should not
- 10 be punishing the voter for. Furthermore, the
- 11 difference here is the provisional ballots are
- 12 outlined in the federal law, the Help America Vote
- 13 Act. And this is a federal election. State law
- 14 determines someone is eligible to vote. We determine
- 15 these voters to be registered and that they signed the
- 16 affidavit and that they have not already voted in
- 17 another way, then we must count them.
- 18 PA law has an extra -- has extra hurdles, but
- 19 putting a ballot in a secrecy envelope has no bearing
- 20 on whether or not someone is qualified to vote. I
- 21 believe the PA law is in conflict with the Help
- 22 America Vote Act. This is not -- this has not been
- 23 the subject of recent court challenges, and therefore,
- 24 I believe that these ballots should count.
- 25 MR. SABIR: Thank you. Secretary Bluestein, did

- 1 you have a comment you wanted to make?
- 2 MR. BLUESTEIN: I have none.
- 3 MR. SABIR: Okay. I'll say the motion again. I
- 4 motion that this Board does not accept the ballots
- 5 that were not included -- can you call the roll?
- 6 MR. BLUESTEIN: Yes, sir. Vice Chair Deeley?
- 7 MS. DEELEY: Nay.
- 8 MR. BLUESTEIN: I vote aye. Chairman Sabir?
- 9 MR. SABIR: Aye. Okay. Thank you, Roxanne, for
- 10 all the hard work that you and your staff do at each
- 11 election. And it's always a pleasure to see you.
- 12 It's a pleasure to see you here. It's my first time
- 13 seeing you here, you know, in this capacity. Thank
- 14 you for all the work that you do in DSG and all across
- 15 our department. The service is greatly appreciated.
- 16 MS. HUFF-GROSS: Thank you for allowing me the
- 17 opportunity to serve.
- 18 MR. SABIR: Thank you. We'll now move to the
- 19 other portion of our agenda. Vice Chair Deeley, do
- 20 you have any other business to be raised at this
- 21 meeting?
- MS. DEELEY: I do not.
- 23 MR. SABIR: Secretary Bluestein, do you have any
- 24 business to be raised at this meeting?
- MR. BLUESTEIN: I have none.
