4	the meeting of the Philadelphia City Commissioners,
5	Board of Elections for Tuesday, May 7, 2024. This
6	meeting is in compliance under the Pennsylvania
7	Sunshine Act. The Philadelphia City Commissioners are
8	a three-member bipartisan Board of elected officials
9	in charge of elections and voter registration for the
10	County of Philadelphia. Each commissioner is elected
11	to serve a four-year term that coincides with the
12	municipal election cycle for mayor and City council.
13	The Commissioners set and enforce
14	departmental policies to administer voter registration
15	and conduct elections in accordance with federal and
16	state voter registration election laws. The City
17	Commissioners were created by the Pennsylvania
18	Assembly in 1711 with a focus on taxation and held
19	various regulatory powers throughout the centuries.
20	Elected Commissioners started maintaining voter list
21	in 1799 and took on more election related
22	responsibilities, but didn't emerge into its current
23	form until the adoption of the Philadelphia Home Rule
24	Charter in 1951.
25	We will start off with public comments.

- 1 Before beginning their comments, commenters shall
- 2 state where they live or if they are not a resident of
- 3 Philadelphia and that they are a Philadelphia
- 4 taxpayer. Public comment is not an opportunity for
- 5 dialogue or Q and A. It is public comment, a chance
- 6 for you to tell us what you think. Each speaker will
- 7 have two minutes to speak, however, I may extend the
- 8 time at my discretion. Public comment must concern
- 9 matters on today's meeting agenda.
- 10 Finally, it is my responsibility to preserve the
- 11 order and decorum of meetings as such profane,
- 12 slanderous, discriminatory, or personal attacks will
- 13 not be tolerated.
- If you wish to make a public objection to a
- 15 perceived Sunshine violation, please raise your hand
- 16 and I will recognize you. Outbursts will not be
- 17 tolerated. Anyone wishing to offer public comment,
- 18 please step forward. There are none. We will now
- 19 move to report from secretary for email public
- 20 comment. Secretary Bluestein, are there any email
- 21 public comments there.
- 22 SECRETARY BLUESTEIN: There were no public
