- 9 MR. GARELLA: Yes. My name is
- 10 Rich Garella representing Protect Our Vote
- 11 Philly. The Pennsylvania Sunshine Act at
- 12 Section 709A requires notification of the
- 13 public 24 hours in advance of any special
- 14 meeting, which is a meeting scheduled by an
- agency after the agency's regularly scheduled
- 16 meetings has been established, such as this
- one. However, the notification was not posted
- until about 4:30 p.m. yesterday, only some 16
- 19 to 17 hours in advance, replacing a previous
- 20 posting that had listed the meeting at 12
- noon, so members of the public, who saw that,
- 22 would not know to be here and would not know
- 23 to check for a change because it was within 24
- hours. Therefore, this is not a legally held
- open meeting under the Sunshine Act and any

- 1 official actions will be taken in violation of
- ² the Sunshine Act, which at Section 704 states
- ³ that official actions and deliberations by a
- 4 quorum of the members of an agency shall take
- ⁵ place at a meeting open to the public unless
- 6 closed under certain couple of exceptions that
- ⁷ don't apply here.
- JUDGE CRUMLISH: Thank you, sir.
- 9 So I'll now move to any e-mailed comments that
- 10 may have been received by the city
- 11 commissioners' office.
- MR. GARELLA: I have a public
- 13 comment.
- JUDGE CRUMLISH: Okay. Why
- don't you just for efficiency sake continue
- 16 your address.
- MR. GARELLA: According to
- Pennsylvania -- again, my name is rich
- 19 Garella. I'm a resident of Philadelphia.
- According to Pennsylvania election code
- 21 Section 1403, clerks and others who assist in
- the computation and canvassing of the votes
- 23 must first be sworn in, but since this meeting
- does not meet Sunshine Act requirements for an
- open meeting, any or all business conducted

- 1 here, including the swearing in, may be
- ² determined invalid under Section 703. The
- ³ failure to properly notify the public of open
- 4 meetings repeating an error made just two days
- ⁵ ago, typifies this office's attitude towards
- 6 both the public and the law. The
- 7 commissioners and their deputies have
- 8 established a year's long pattern of
- ⁹ illegalities that the board has now
- 10 constituted is unfortunately following. These
- 11 have included failure to keep minutes, illegal
- 12 hiring practices, illegal executive sessions
- 13 failure to properly notice open meetings as we
- 14 see here today and more. I believe we all
- 15 share the goal of having elections
- administered professionally, fairly and
- transparently and conducted in accordance with
- the laws of the common law. We want the
- 19 public to be confident in the results, but to
- see our election administration ignoring or
- violating the law undermines that confidence.
- ²² After all, if it so cavalierly disregards one
- law, a law that provides transparently and
- ²⁴ accountability, what other laws might it be
- ²⁵ disregarding? Following the law is not a

- 1 matter of convenience. Democracy cannot exist
- outside the rule of law. This board has the
- ³ duty and the responsibility to correct these
- ⁴ illegalities and also has the opportunity.
- ⁵ It's as simple as following the law. Thank
- ⁶ you.
- JUDGE CRUMLISH: We'll now move
