PROCEEDINGS

- - - - -

COMMISSIONER SABIR: Good morning.

I call to order of Philadelphia City Commissioners Return Board for Wednesday, May 27, 2026. This meeting is in compliance with the Pennsylvania Sunshine Act.

Philadelphia City Commissioners are a three-member bipartisan board of elected officials in charge of elections and voter registration for the City of Philadelphia. Each Commissioner is elected to serve a four-year term that coincides with the municipal election cycle for Mayor and City Council.

The Commissioners set and enforced departmental policies to administer voter registration and conduct elections in accordance with Federal and State Voter Registration and election laws.

City Commissioners were created by the Pennsylvania Assembly in 1711, but they focused on taxation and held various regulatory powers throughout the centuries. The Commissioners started maintaining voter

1 lists in 1799 and took on more
2 election-related responsibilities, didn't
3 emerge until its current form until the
4 adoption of Philadelphia's Home Loan Charter
5 in 1951.

6 We'll start off with public
7 comments. Before beginning their comments,
8 commenter's shall state where they live or
9 if they are not a resident of Philadelphia,
10 that they are Philadelphia taxpayer.

11 Public comment is not an
12 opportunity for dialog or Q and A. It is
13 public comment, a chance for you to tell us
14 what you think. Each speaker will have two
15 minutes to speak. However, I may extend the
16 time at my discretion. Public comment must
17 concern matters on today's meeting agenda.

18 Finally, it is my responsibility
19 to preserve the order and decorum of the
20 meetings. As such profane, slanderous,
21 discriminatory personal attacks will not be
22 tolerated. If you wish to make a public
23 objection to a perceived Sunshine Act
24 violation, please raise your hand and I will
25 recognize you. Outbursts will not be

1 tolerated. Anyone wishing to offer public
2 comment, please step forward.

3 Hearing none, we will now proceed
4 to email public comments.

5 Secretary Bluestein, were there
6 any email public comments?

7 COMMISSIONER BLUESTEIN: As of
8 9:45 a.m. there were no email public
9 comments.

10 COMMISSIONER SABIR: Thank you.

11 We will now proceed to old
12 business, but first we have a report from our
13 directors of election operations and
14 administration, Mr. Joseph Lynch and
15 Mr. Mark Johnson.

16 Joe, we'll start with you.

17 MR. LYNCH: Yes. Good morning,
18 Commissioners. We'll make this short but
19 sweet.

20 Today's operation report, all
21 mail-in ballots that could be open have been,
22 have been, and the rest that are going to be
23 voted on today will be open by end of
24 business today, and scanned. All provisionals
25 that can be counted are open and scanned,

1 except for the number of the ones that need to
2 go in front of the board, which will be this
3 upcoming Friday.

4 The rest of the staff, they're
5 working on the audit of the No. 2 books.
6 They're still cracking open the hoppers and
7 are working on the surrender mail-in ballots.
8 So we're gonna start working on that and enter
9 them into the system.

10 And then at the end of the
11 meeting I have the unofficial results. We had
12 the honor -- we had to send the unofficial
13 results to Department of State last night by
14 5:00 p.m., so I signed off as the clerk, and
15 then if I could just get all three
16 Commissioners to sign this today, we'll send
17 this up. We'll send this into the meeting to
18 Harrisburg. It's the unofficial results.
19 That's all I have.

20 COMMISSIONER SABIR: Thank you,
21 Joe.

22 Commissioner Deeley, do you have
23 any questions or comments.

24 COMMISSIONER DEELEY: I have none.
25 Thank you.

1 COMMISSIONER SABIR: Secretary

2 Bluestein?

3 COMMISSIONER BLUESTEIN: I have

4 none.

5 MR. JOHNSON: Good morning,

6 Commissioners. This is even going to be

7 shorter. But admin staff continued to provide

8 a direct assistance and material support to

9 election operations and move towards

10 certification.

11 I think from our financial

12 standpoint, and as we move in towards the end

13 of the fiscal year, we just making sure that

14 our vendors are providing their last invoices

15 for this past election so that we can pay them

16 in a timely manner. And outside of that, just

17 once again, I want to thank the staff for the

18 fine job that they're doing throughout this

19 whole election process.

20 COMMISSIONER SABIR: Thank you.

21 Commissioner Deeley, do you have any questions

22 or comments for Mark?

23 COMMISSIONER DEELEY: I have none.

24 Thank you.

25 COMMISSIONER SABIR: Secretary

1 Bluestein, do you have any question?

2 COMMISSIONER BLUESTEIN: I have
3 none. Thank you.

4 COMMISSIONER SABIR: Thank you.
5 We appreciate you as always. We will now
6 proceed to new business. We'll begin by
7 considering the first agenda item for the
8 new business, Mail-in Ballots Sufficiency
9 Determinations. We'll call up our Deputy
10 Executive Director of Compliance and vote by
11 mail.

12 MS. ECKROADE: Good morning,
13 commissioners.

14 COMMISSIONER SABIR: Ma'am, can
15 you please state your first and last name for
16 the record?

17 MS. ECKROADE: Dana Eckroade,
18 Dana D-A-N-A, Eckroade, E-C-K-R-O-A-D-E.

19 COMMISSIONER SABIR: Thank you.
20 Please proceed.

21 MS. ECKROADE: So the 2026 Primary
22 Mail Ballots Sufficiency Determinations.
23 Category Number 1, no signature. We have 291
24 ballots.

25 COMMISSIONER SABIR: I move that

1 this Board does not count comments in this
2 category.

3 Is there a second.

4 COMMISSIONER DEELEY: Seconded.

5 COMMISSIONER SABIR: Secretary
6 Bluestein, please call the roll.

7 COMMISSIONER BLUESTEIN: Vice
8 Chair Deeley?

9 COMMISSIONER DEELEY: I vote aye.

10 COMMISSIONER BLUESTEIN: I vote
11 aye.

12 Chairman Sibir?

13 COMMISSIONER SABIR: Aye.

14 Please proceed.

15 MS. ECKROADE: Number 2, ballots
16 not enclosed in secrecy envelope. We have 133
17 ballots.

18 COMMISSIONER SABIR: I move that
19 this Board does not count ballots in this
20 category.

21 Is there a second?

22 COMMISSIONER DEELEY:

23 Mr. Chairman, If I may, make remarks on the
24 motion.

25 COMMISSIONER SABIR: Please

1 proceed.

2 COMMISSIONER DEELEY: I believe
3 that the same arguments that were successful
4 in recent court cases would apply to the
5 so-called quote, naked ballots, as well.

6 The secrecy envelope does not
7 determine the timeliness of when a ballot is
8 received. The secrecy envelope does not
9 determine if a voter is eligible to vote.

10 Finally, when absentee ballots
11 used to be counted in the polling places,
12 and there was only a handful of them, they
13 served to prevent fraud, but this is no
14 longer the case in a post Act 77 world with
15 essential mechanized counting of mail ballots.
16 So, there is no longer a compelling government
17 interest to not count these ballots. Thank
18 you.

19 COMMISSIONER SABIR: Secretary
20 Bluestein, do you want to say anything before
21 we proceed?

22 COMMISSIONER BLUESTEIN: Yes.
23 Thank you, Chairman. I would just say that I
24 agree with Commissioner Deeley's sentiments,
25 but unfortunately, we are bound by law to not

1 count the ballots. As such, I will second
2 your motion.

3 COMMISSIONER SABIR: Please call
4 the roll.

5 COMMISSIONER BLUESTEIN: Vice
6 Chair Deeley?

7 COMMISSIONER DEELEY: No.

8 COMMISSIONER BLUESTEIN: I vote
9 aye.

10 Chairman Sibir?

11 COMMISSIONER SABIR: Aye. Please
12 proceed.

13 MS. ECKROADE: Number 3. ID
14 Verification. No social security or
15 driver's license on short file. We have two
16 ballots.

17 COMMISSIONER SABIR: I move
18 that --

19 COMMISSIONER DEELEY: Mr. Chairman
20 --

21 COMMISSIONER SABIR: Can I make
22 the motion first?

23 COMMISSIONER DEELEY: No. Can I
24 asked Dana a question first?

25 COMMISSIONER SABIR: Oh, you want

1 to ask Dana a question before we even put the
2 motion in? Sure. Proceed.

3 COMMISSIONER DEELEY: Dana,
4 these voters received our ID verification
5 letters, and they responded by filling out the
6 form that we sent them or contacting us in
7 some other way?

8 MS. ECKROADE: Yes.

9 COMMISSIONER DEELEY: So these
10 voters, it would be impossible to verify using
11 the form. They would have to send us a copy
12 of their photo ID.

13 MS. ECKROADE: Yeah. It all
14 depends. We need them to send back verifiable
15 ID. So it could be rejected for a number of
16 reasons.

17 COMMISSIONER DEELEY: Okay. Thank
18 you.

19 MS. ECKROADE: You're welcome.

20 COMMISSIONER DEELEY: Thank you,
21 Chairman.

22 COMMISSIONER SABIR: Sure.
23 Secretary, you have anything?

24 COMMISSIONER BLUESTEIN: So, I
25 would just like to ask Dana, if voters in this

1 category are at least 65 years old.

2 MS. ECKROADE: Yes, they are.

3 COMMISSIONER BLUESTEIN: Both
4 voters are?

5 MS. ECKROADE: Yes.

6 COMMISSIONER SABIR: I move that
7 this Board counts ballots in this category.
8 Is there a second?

9 COMMISSIONER DEELEY: Second.

10 COMMISSIONER SABIR: Secretary
11 Bluestein, please call the roll.

12 COMMISSIONER BLUESTEIN: Vice
13 Chair Deeley?

14 COMMISSIONER DEELEY: Aye.

15 COMMISSIONER BLUESTEIN: I vote
16 aye.

17 Chairman Sibir?

18 COMMISSIONER SABIR: Aye. Please
19 proceed.

20 MS. ECKROADE: Number 4. ID
21 verification. ID provided opposite of what is
22 on SURE file. We have three ballots.

23 COMMISSIONER SABIR: Do any of the
24 Commissioners have any question?

25 COMMISSIONER DEELEY: Yes. Thank

1 you.

2 These voters received our ID
3 verification letters, and they responded by
4 filling out the form that we sent them or
5 contacting us in another way?

6 MS. ECKROADE: Yes.

7 COMMISSIONER DEELEY: And they
8 provided the opposite of what we needed?

9 MS. ECKROADE: Yes.

10 COMMISSIONER DEELEY: Thank you.

11 COMMISSIONER SABIR: Secretary
12 Bluestein?

13 COMMISSIONER BLUESTEIN: Thank
14 you, Chairman. I have the same question for
15 Dana. Are the three voters in this category
16 at least 65 years or older?

17 MS. ECKROADE: Yes, all three
18 voters.

19 COMMISSIONER BLUESTEIN: Thank
20 you.

21 COMMISSIONER SABIR: Move that
22 this Board counts the ballots in this
23 category?

24 Is there a second?

25 COMMISSIONER DEELEY: Second.

1 COMMISSIONER SABIR:
2 Secretary Bluestein, please call the roll.

3 COMMISSIONER BLUESTEIN: Vice
4 Chair Deeley?

5 COMMISSIONER DEELEY: I vote aye.

6 COMMISSIONER BLUESTEIN: I vote
7 aye.

8 Chairman Sibir?

9 COMMISSIONER SABIR: Aye.

10 Please proceed.

11 MS. ECKROADE: Number 5. ID
12 verification. ID doesn't match SURE file. We
13 have three ballots.

14 COMMISSIONER SABIR: Any
15 Commissioners have any comments or questions?

16 COMMISSIONER DEELEY: No.

17 COMMISSIONER BLUESTEIN: No.

18 COMMISSIONER DEELEY: No. Thank
19 you.

20 COMMISSIONER SABIR: I move that
21 this Board does not count ballots in this
22 category.

23 Is there a second?

24 COMMISSIONER DEELEY: Second.

25 COMMISSIONER SABIR: Secretary

1 Bluestein, please call the roll.

2 COMMISSIONER BLUESTEIN: Vice
3 Chair Deeley?

4 COMMISSIONER DEELEY: Aye.

5 COMMISSIONER BLUESTEIN: I vote
6 aye.

7 Chairman Sibir?

8 COMMISSIONER SABIR: Aye.

9 Please proceed.

10 MS. ECKROADE: Number 6. ID
11 verification. No response. We have 101
12 ballots.

13 COMMISSIONER SABIR: Do any
14 Commissioners want to make a comments?

15 COMMISSIONER DEELEY: I have none.
16 Thank you.

17 COMMISSIONER BLUESTEIN: No.
18 Thank you.

19 COMMISSIONER SABIR: I move that
20 this Board does not count house in this
21 category. Is there a Second?

22 COMMISSIONER DEELEY: Second.

23 COMMISSIONER SABIR: Secretary

24 Bluestein, please call the roll.

25 COMMISSIONER BLUESTEIN: Vice

1 Chair Deeley?

2 COMMISSIONER DEELEY: Aye.

3 COMMISSIONER BLUESTEIN: I vote
4 aye.

5 Chairman Sibir?

6 COMMISSIONER SABIR: Aye.

7 Thank you so much. That brings us
8 to the end of our memo. Thank you so much for
9 all of your hard work. We really appreciate
10 you. Thank you.

11 MS. ECKROADE: Thank you.
