CHAIR SABIR: Good evening.

MR. BLUESTEIN: Good evening.

CHAIR SABIR: Call to order the meeting of the Philadelphia City Commissioners Return Board for Tuesday, June 2nd, 2026. This meeting is in compliance with the Pennsylvania Sunshine Act. The Philadelphia City Commissioners are a three-member bipartisan board of elected officials in charge of elections and voter registration for the City of Philadelphia.

Each commissioner is elected to serve a four-year term that coincides with the municipal election cycle for mayor and city council. The commissioners set and enforce departmental policies to administer voter registration and conduct the elections in accordance with federal and state voter registration and election laws.

The city commissioners were created by the Pennsylvania Assembly 1711, but they

1 focused on taxation and held various
2 regulatory powers throughout the centuries.
3 The commissioners started maintaining voter
4 lists in 1799 and took on more election-
5 related responsibilities, but didn't emerge
6 in its current form until the adoption of
7 Philadelphia's Home Rule Charter in 1951.

8 We will start off with public
9 comments. Before beginning their comments,
10 commenters shall state where they live, or if
11 they are not a resident of Philadelphia, that
12 they are a Philadelphia taxpayer. Public
13 comment is not an opportunity for dialog or Q
14 and A. It is public comment, a chance for
15 you to tell us what you think.

16 Each speaker will have two minutes
17 to speak. However, I may extend the time at
18 my discretion. Public comment must concern
19 matters on today's meeting agenda. Finally,
20 it is my responsibility to preserve the order
21 and decorum of the meetings.

22 As such, profane, slanderous,
23 discriminatory, personal attacks will not be
24 tolerated. If you wish to make a public

1 objection to a perceived Sunshine Act
2 violation, please raise your hand and I will
3 recognize you. Outbursts will not be
4 tolerated.

5 Anyone wishing to offer public
6 comment, please step forward. Hearing none,
7 We will now proceed to email public comment.
8 Secretary Bluestein, were there any email
9 public comments?

10 MR. BLUESTEIN: As of 4:45 PM,
