3 CHAIRMAN SABIR: Good morning.

4 MR. LYNCH: Good morning.

5 MS. REED: Good morning.

6 CHAIRMAN SABIR: I call to order the meeting of
7 the Philadelphia City Commissioners Board of Election
8 for Wednesday, September 11th, 2024. This meeting is
9 in compliance under the Pennsylvania Sunshine Act.
10 Philadelphia city commissioners are a three-member
11 bipartisan board of elected officials in charge of
12 elections and voter registration for the County of
13 Philadelphia. Each commissioner is elected to serve a
14 four-year term that coincides with the municipal
15 election for mayor and city council.

16 The commissioner set and enforced departmental
17 policies to administer voter registration and conduct
18 elections in accordance with federal state voter
19 registration and election laws. The city
20 commissioners were created by the Pennsylvania
21 Assembly 1711, but they focused on taxation and held
22 various regulatory powers throughout the centuries.

23 The commissioner started maintaining voter lists
24 1799 and took on more election leader
25 responsibilities. But didn't emerge in its current

1 form until the adaption of Philadelphia's Home Rule
2 Charter in 1951. We will start off with public
3 comments. Before beginning their comments, commenters
4 shall state where they live or if they are not a
5 resident of Philadelphia and that they are a
6 Philadelphia taxpayer.

7 Public comment is not an opportunity for dialogue
8 or Q&A. It's a public comment. A chance for you to
9 tell us what you think. Each speaker will have two
10 minutes to speak. However, I may extend the time at
11 my discretion. Public comment must concern matters on
12 today's meeting agenda. Finally, it is my
13 responsibility to preserve the order and decorum of
14 the meetings as such. Profane, slanderous,
15 discriminatory, and personal attacks will not be
16 tolerated.

17 If you wish to make a public objection to a
18 perceived Sunshine violation, please raise your hand
19 and I will recognize you. Outbursts will not be
20 tolerated. Anyone wishing to offer public comment,
21 please step forward. Fair enough. We will now move
22 to report from Secretary Bluestein for email public
23 comments. Mr. Bluestein are there any emailed public
24 comments?

25 MR. BLUESTEIN: There were no public comments

1 emailed by 9:45 a.m.

2 CHAIRMAN SABIR: Thank you very much. We will
3 now proceed to old business. We will hear a report
4 from our director of elections, operations, and
5 administration, Joe Lynch and Stephanie Reed.

6 MR. LYNCH: Good morning, commissioners.

7 CHAIRMAN SABIR: Good morning.

8 MR. BLUESTEIN: Good morning.

9 MS. REED: Good morning, Joe.

10 MR. LYNCH: This is our public meeting update for
11 September 11th, 2024. The warehouse unit has been
12 preparing to ship machines out for the special
13 election which will be held Tuesday, September 17th.
14 We are also preparing to get machines ready for the
15 general election. For our voter registration report,
16 we have processed a total of 243,379 applications to
17 date for the election cycle. Out of these, 138,700
18 were submitted in paper form.

19 All applications are up to date. There is still
20 a lot of reviewing and proofing to do. We mailed out
21 17,653 ID cards on Monday, September 9th. On a side
22 note, I want to thank all the voter registration
23 supervisors and staff for training the surge staff who
24 have been helping us keep our applications up to date
25 during the past few weeks. I would also like to thank

1 the NDO's office for assisting in scheduling the surge
2 staff for us and thanks to all the surge staff working
3 along with us.

4 As of Monday, we have approved 129,501 vote by
5 mail and absentee applications, which is 5,994 added
6 from the last week's total. Of those, 72,214 are
7 paper applications and 57,287 are electronic
8 applications. This includes military, civilian,
9 overseas, and federal voters. We currently have a
10 total of 210 electronic applications waiting to be
11 processed.

12 Voters who would like to vote by mail for the
13 November 5th general election can apply for mail-in or
14 absentee ballot at vote.phila.gov. The deadline to
15 apply is Tuesday, October 29th at 5:00 p.m. Special
16 elections have been scheduled for Tuesday, September
17 17th, 2024 for the 195th and 201st state house
18 districts. These elections are being held to fill the
19 seats left vacant by resignations.

20 We have sent out 5,690 for the mail-in ballots
21 for the 195th legislative district, with 1,373 ballots
22 being returned. And 5,907 were sent out to the 201st
23 legislative district with 1,754 ballots being
24 returned. Voters may request a replacement ballot up
25 till 8:00 p.m. on election day. Please note that the

1 general election for the next term will still occur on
2 Tuesday, November 5th, 2024.

3 If you're not sure if you're eligible to vote in
4 the special election, look up your address at
5 atlas.phila.gov/voting. Or visit our website to check
6 out all affected wards in the divisions at
7 vote.phila.gov. ID verification letters have gone out
8 to voters that either did not include their required
9 proof of identification on their absentee/mail-in
10 ballot application, or their proof of identification
11 could not be verified by the County Board of
12 Election's office.

13 Voters who have received this letter may submit
14 their of ID to the County Board of Elections via email
15 at phillyelections@philla.gov, fax, US mail,
16 telephone, or in person. Voters have till 5:00 p.m.
17 on September 23rd to return their proof of
18 identification for the special election. The polling
19 place unit is continuing to -- excuse me. The polling
20 place unit is continuing to monitor locations for the
21 September 17th election. The unit is also working on
22 changes for the November 5th election as well.

23 They will continue to work on both September 17th
24 and as well as the November 5th election. For the
25 special election board worker confirmation calls and

1 emails are going -- are ongoing with a total of 685
2 board workers confirmed and 46 declining for the
3 special election. Special election training saw 483
4 attendees. As for the general election, board worker
5 confirmation efforts are continuing as well, with 3,
6 810 workers confirmed and 70 declining.

7 Full training for the general election began last
8 week, with 164 individuals having attended so far, and
9 2,021 are scheduled for the training. Finally,
10 regarding the progress of the satellite elections
11 office, we had a grand opening of our district eight
12 satellite office at 53012 Avenue yesterday, Tuesday,
13 September 10th, ahead of the special election. The
14 grand opening press event was attended by media, media
15 elected officials and community members.

16 We will -- we will be open seven days a week
17 until election day, Tuesday, November 5th, 2024.
18 District three satellite office at 4029 Market
19 continues to be open and serving the public. We are
20 scheduled to open a total of at least five more
21 satellite election offices this month and the last few
22 in October. We look forward to sharing the, the exact
23 open dates as we confirm them. Thank you. That's all
24 I have.

25 UNKNOWN SPEAKER: Oh, sorry.

1 CHAIRMAN SABIR: Vice Chair, do you have any
2 questions?

3 MS. DEELEY: I do, Chairman. Joe, how many
4 ballots did we get back from Simon's and Gather's
5 playground events on Saturday?

6 MR. LYNCH: Zero.

7 MS. DEELEY: Okay. I know that these events are
8 not usually well attended. But do you think that the
9 lack of attendance had anything to do with the fact
10 that we only announced the event 15 hours before it
11 was scheduled to start?

12 MR. LYNCH: I requested location. So I didn't
13 get them till I would say the last -- I got them
14 probably Thursday or Friday, but we just -- and the
15 locations that we went to last week are going to be
16 the same locations this week. If the commissioners
17 have a different location, you can let me know and
18 we'll put it on the website. But right now, the
19 update -- the website's updated with the same
20 locations as last week.

21 MS. DEELEY: So having just looked, the website
22 hasn't been updated. So we don't want to keep it a
23 secret for this weekend, so --

24 MR. LYNCH: Yeah. Now it should be updated. I
25 was told to be updated by 9:17. And that's not the

1 date of the special. It was just that time, 9:17. So
2 I will check when I get back to the office.

3 MS. DEELEY: Thank you. And thank you for
4 separating those voter registration totals, too.

5 MR. LYNCH: All right. Thank you. And again, if
6 you -- if anyone wants to change those locations,
7 speak or forever hold your peace. We'll always change
8 them. Thank you.

9 CHAIRMAN SABIR: Secretary Bluestein, do you have
10 a question?

11 MR. BLUESTEIN: I do not.

12 CHAIRMAN SABIR: Joe, just to go for clarity. So
13 going to what Vice Chair was saying, it was only 15
14 hours before we made it public?

15 MR. LYNCH: To be honest -- to be honest with
16 you, Commissioner, I think it might have been Friday.
17 The Friday morning before Saturday. I don't know the
18 exact time. It was -- it was early Friday morning.

19 CHAIRMAN SABIR: It was early Friday morning?

20 MR. LYNCH: Yes.

21 CHAIRMAN SABIR: And then we made them public on
22 Saturday?

23 MR. LYNCH: No. We made them public on Friday.

24 MS. DEELEY: Excuse me, Chairman?

25 CHAIRMAN SABIR: So it was less than 15 hours?

1 MR. LYNCH: I don't know the exact time but, you
2 know.

3 CHAIRMAN SABIR: Hold on. The vice chair wants
4 to --

5 MR. LYNCH: Oh, okay.

6 MS. DEELEY: It was posted to their website on
7 Friday night about 7 o'clock.

8 CHAIRMAN SABIR: Friday night?

9 MR. LYNCH: Maybe it was. Okay.

10 CHAIRMAN SABIR: Okay. So I'll share the same
11 sentiments of the vice chair. These satellite
12 locations are about accessibility. So we have to do a
13 better job for the communication. So the things that
14 are going on --

15 MR. LYNCH: All right. Well, I need -- I need
16 the addresses --

17 CHAIRMAN SABIR: No.

18 MR. LYNCH: -- ahead of time before I could do
19 it.

20 CHAIRMAN SABIR: No. Hold on. I ain't saying
21 about no address or anything.

22 MR. LYNCH: Yeah.

23 CHAIRMAN SABIR: What I'm saying is the moment
24 that is found out --

25 MR. LYNCH: Yeah.

1 CHAIRMAN SABIR: -- whatever those locations are
2 or whatever, let the commissioners know because we
3 have outreach and we can get it out to our
4 constituents.

5 MR. LYNCH: Okay.

6 CHAIRMAN SABIR: You know, we have robust social
7 media. As soon as that is found out --

8 MR. LYNCH: Right.

9 CHAIRMAN SABIR: -- this is what we want to do.

10 MR. LYNCH: Yeah.

11 CHAIRMAN SABIR: We could do the best that we
12 could do to get the message out there.

13 MR. LYNCH: Okay. When I left the office today,
14 that should have been -- that should be updated along
15 with CFCF for Monday morning. We're going to go out
16 there also with these drop bags. But like I said, I
17 apologize. It was -- it was late but I didn't get
18 them till late, so.

19 CHAIRMAN SABIR: Is there anything else?

20 MS. DEELEY: Joe, I just want you to know that
21 the website is not updated. So we, we knew Saturday -
22 - we knew Friday when we posted this schedule that we
23 were going to be there Saturday and the following
24 Saturday, so.

25 MR. LYNCH: Well, I -- the reason I didn't update

1 this Saturday's, last Saturday, because I wasn't sure
2 if, if the commissioners were going to give me new
3 addresses. So I haven't gotten any new addresses or
4 new locations. Again, if I get the new locations,
5 I'll have Jafi (phonetic) post it. But they should --
6 they should have been posted today. Before I left, I
7 gave it to him. So we'll look into it. Sorry for the
8 inconvenience.

9 CHAIRMAN SABIR: Thank you.

10 MS. REED: Okay. Good morning, Commissioners.
11 I'm pleased to address you today and share updates
12 from our administrative report for September 11th,
13 2024. Our staff continues to be busy preparing for
14 the special election, general election, and opening of
15 the permanent satellite election offices. They
16 continue to work together solving issues as they
17 arise, ensuring all tasks are moving forward according
18 to schedule.

19 In our budget and procurement department, the
20 team has been focused on the normal processing of
21 invoices and purchase orders, addressing any related
22 issues as they arise. We continue budgetary planning
23 for the general election, including a mid-year
24 transfer. And I'd like to extend a thank you to the
25 city procurement and law department, who have been

1 working very closely with us to solve a number of
2 times since the procurement things that we want to be
3 sure we get done as quickly as possible.

4 In communications, we've been designing requested
5 materials including social media graphics, updated
6 procedures, documents, and updated poll worker
7 materials. Requested updates were also completed for
8 polling place posters, the department's atlas tool,
9 and various website pages. Additionally, we've been
10 planning for general election communications,
11 including developing a schedule for communication
12 support on and after election day.

13 Regarding engagement, we're distributing
14 materials at No. 1 Asian Supermarket, China Gourmet,
15 Everest Urgent Care, and Double Care Adult Day
16 Services. Our efforts also involve sharing flyers for
17 poll workers and interpreters, encouraging voter
18 registration, recruiting bilingual interpreters, and
19 engaging with the community through feedback and
20 questions at events.

21 We continue to reach out to local businesses,
22 senior centers and stores to distribute election
23 materials or host events. And our team has been
24 working on translations for posters needed at polling
25 places and newspaper ads. We have two voting machine

1 demonstrations scheduled for this week.

2 In human resources, we're currently hiring for 6
3 Clerk Is and 39 temps. As of now, our total workforce
4 stands at 189 employees, with 153 in civil service and
5 36 exempt. This includes 71 Clerk Is, 17 Clerk IIs,
6 17 Clerk IIIs, 10 trades helpers, 9 voting machine
7 techs and 9 temps. We are continuing with new hire
8 activities and preparing for upcoming orientations.

9 Our IT team worked with Comcast to successfully
10 move a mainline at the warehouse. They've also been
11 busy with orientation for surge staff and participants
12 from OIT and completing the epoll book validation.
13 They continue to work on setting up all IT components
14 for our satellite election offices. The Board of
15 Elections staff have been hard at work ensuring that
16 everything is in place for the special and the
17 general. I'd like to thank them for their hard work
18 and dedication to Philadelphia elections. Thank you.

19 CHAIRMAN SABIR: Vice Chair, did you have any
20 questions?

21 MS. DEELEY: Thank you, Chairman. Just a point
22 of clarity, Stephanie. The communications is in your
23 bucket, so. Although Joe is taking the heat on the,
24 the posting on the website, can you guys get together
25 and you do your part and he does his part to make sure

1 that that is communicated to the -- on the Internet,
2 to the website, for the viewer, for the voters? Thank
3 you.

4 MS. REED: Yeah. Of course. And I, I didn't
5 know that we had dates for Saturday, for this coming
6 weekend. So this is the first I heard that we
7 actually had those locations. So we'll make sure that
8 they get up ASAP.

9 MR. LYNCH: Yes. And commissioners, I was just
10 emailed that it was posted 9:17 this morning. It's up
11 live on our website, the locations. And like I said
12 earlier, it was for 9:17 and it was confirmed. It's
13 been up since 9:17. Sorry about that.

14 MS. DEELEY: I'm looking at it right now. But
15 we'll take care of that when I get down there.

16 MR. LYNCH: Yeah. I have a screenshot.

17 CHAIRMAN SABIR: So just for clarity, so y'all
18 can correct me if I'm wrong. I thought administration
19 -- I thought IT was underneath administration.

20 MR. LYNCH: What was that, sir?

21 CHAIRMAN SABIR: Sorry. I thought IT was, was
22 underneath the administration program. Y'all can
23 correct me if I'm wrong.

24 MR. LYNCH: It, it might be. But sometimes I do
25 things that Stephanie does. She does things that I

1 do, to be honest with you. So we try to work as a
2 team.

3 CHAIRMAN SABIR: Yeah, so -- and, and -- wait,
4 were you finished your report, Stephanie? Were you --
5 were you finished your report?

6 MS. REED: I was finished with the report. Yes.

7 CHAIRMAN SABIR: Yeah. See, I know the team
8 thing and all that. But people have specific
9 responsibilities for specific reasons. Administration
10 has their side. Operations has their side. So that
11 way things don't happen where we sort of look at
12 things and -- because I do have a question really --
13 that's really whoever can really kind of take it, but
14 it's an issue with satellite SEO 6.

15 And I guess with the communication, we probably
16 could have a meeting to further clarify this. But I
17 was under the impression that we received a report
18 that the repairs were going to be done for SEO 6 at
19 one day. And then I was told -- I don't know if this
20 is true -- but I was told that there was a meeting
21 with you, Stephanie --

22 MS. REED: Yeah.

23 CHAIRMAN SABIR: -- and the timeline had got
24 pushed back, like another three or four weeks?

25 MS. REED: I can't speak to why the original

1 amount of time was given. But I can say that we spoke
2 directly with the contractor. I was with public
3 property and he has continued working. He's put a
4 second crew on it so that they can work basically
5 constantly. I actually just talked to public property
6 this morning.

7 One of the permits that they were waiting on,
8 they have received. There is one more that they are
9 hoping to receive today. And he told me that he
10 expected it would take five weeks and that he was
11 doing everything he could to get it done in four. So
12 I can't just relay what the conversation was. I don't
13 -- I can't speak to the previous conversation.

14 CHAIRMAN SABIR: So I guess it goes back to my
15 question. If you're administration and we have
16 operations, why are you meeting with the construction
17 folks? I was under impression that would be Vanessa,
18 Joe, Anthony, and Cruz. And --

19 MS. REED: Well, because part of my role is to
20 work with --

21 CHAIRMAN SABIR: Hold on. Hold on. Wait a
22 second. Hold no.

23 MS. REED: -- city departments, so -- and to help
24 get things done with city departments. So I was
25 working with public property to see what we could do

1 to speed things along.

2 CHAIRMAN SABIR: Well, see, we talking about
3 construction and these sort of things, like, I was in
4 impression to be operations. And again, Vanessa,
5 Anthony Cruz, they had been moving these things pretty
6 quick. And the report that I got back from Anthony
7 Cruz from construction was that was going to be three
8 weeks.

9 And I've known Anthony Cruz to be straight. So
10 again, the communication thing, I know we do this team
11 thing, but again, we got administrations and we got
12 operations. And the satellites fall underneath the
13 operations program. So if there's meeting with
14 contractors and things of those natures, I believe
15 that should go underneath Joe and Vanessa and all of
16 those.

17 MS. REED: Okay.

18 CHAIRMAN SABIR: Now, if there's something else,
19 as far as you meeting with a contractor by
20 construction, I trust Joe, Anthony Cruz, and those
21 sort of people for that.

22 MS. REED: Okay. I'll refrain from doing
23 anything with satellites.

24 CHAIRMAN SABIR: I didn't say anything. And
25 again, I don't want you to feel that way. I was just

1 saying, just far as the construction and those sort of
2 things. Like now, as far as with the OT, with the
3 technical stuff, as far as the nifty wheelhouse, but
4 just meeting with the actual construction person and
5 contractors, that should be Joe, Vanessa, and Anthony
6 Cruz. Does anyone have an objection with that?

7 MS. DEELEY: I do not. But if I may --

8 CHAIRMAN SABIR: Sure.

9 MS. DEELEY: -- Chairman? Stephanie, your role
10 as intergovernmental would still indicate that you
11 would deal with public property. So you're not, you
12 know, off the hook for the satellite election
13 officers, per se. And I would also say, no matter
14 who's responsible for what, there should be
15 communication.

16 If -- there's no way that Anthony or Vanessa
17 should have a different time frame than, than you,
18 Stephanie. If you met with public property or whoever
19 you met with, you should have -- you would have
20 relayed that information, I would think, to the -- to
21 the team. So we, we would have all been told the same
22 amount of time.

23 MS. REED: Yeah. I did -- I did relay it to them
24 as soon as I heard it.

25 CHAIRMAN SABIR: Well, the communication that I

1 got was that you had a meeting with them and they were
2 unaware of the meeting. Vanessa and Anthony were
3 unaware of that initial meeting that you had with
4 them.

5 MS. REED: I, I don't know.

6 CHAIRMAN SABIR: Again, we could talk about,
7 again, offline if this is a bigger sort of thing, just
8 about communication. So we know we got another sort
9 of added layer to the way we're doing elections than
10 we have been doing them.

11 So it's just more communication. Like, for
12 example, you see, like, how you got, like, city
13 council branded graphics and things like that. Like,
14 it's going out to counsel members, I'm assuming. But
15 I didn't see it. I don't know if any other
16 commissioner's seen it. But things that are going
17 externally outside our office, the commissioners need
18 to see that before it goes out or it's proposed to be
19 going out.

20 MS. REED: Okay.

21 CHAIRMAN SABIR: Fair enough?

22 MR. BLUESTEIN: Mr. Chairman, may I have some
23 thoughts on this? Thank you.

24 CHAIRMAN SABIR: Sure.

25 MR. BLUESTEIN: So I think thematically, when

1 we're talking about the drop boxes, the mobile sites
2 on the website, or the SEOs, there's a very clear
3 overlap between operations and administration.
4 Communication, obviously, as you said, is important.
5 But none of those things fall into a single bucket.
6 For example, something can't get posted on the website
7 by the administrative IT staff if the operations team
8 hasn't given them the dates. Right?

9 Same thing here. Anthony Cruz, as part of
10 property management, works on the administrative side.
11 Vanessa, as a deputy executive director, works on the
12 operations side. They all have to work together and
13 they're all communicating together to get that
14 information. So I don't think it's one or the other.
15 I think it's both. A couple other quick points. The
16 mobile sites are updated. They're on atlas.

17 So anybody who is searching to find out where
18 they can return their ballots can go to the website
19 right now, put their address in, know that there are
20 mobile sites for the drop off. So that information is
21 up there. The final point I would just make related
22 to the mobile sites, it doesn't really surprise me
23 that there was no activity, regardless of whether it
24 was 15 hours or 72 hours. In a typical election where
25 we have 200,000 mail ballots going out, a mobile site

1 might get 5 or 10 ballots returned.

2 So in a special election where there are 10,000
3 ballots going out, receiving zero or one ballot back
4 at a mobile site would not be surprising. It would be
5 pretty consistent with the data we've seen in the
6 past. That's all I have. Thank you, sir.

7 CHAIRMAN SABIR: Sure. Again, there's a big
8 difference to me, 15 hours versus 72 hours.

9 MS. DEELEY: I concur, Chairman.

10 CHAIRMAN SABIR: And also, you know, our issue
11 has been with the satellites, those Dropbox that we
12 have more advertising and more access. So, you know,
13 that's why we got this RFP. You know, it's supposed
14 to be happening pretty soon, you know, but we need
15 advertisement about the great things that we're doing
16 because we're combating misinformation. We're
17 combating disinformation. You know, last night we had
18 a candidate tell a crazy lie about our election
19 system.

20 So it's very critical that every moment that we
21 have, if we have one hour, I think that's as soon as
22 we get the information, that we got to send it out,
23 you know, to our constituents to inform them about
24 other things that we need. Again, communication need
25 to be better. And again, if someone feels guilty

1 about it, I mean, I don't know what to tell you. But
2 again, communication need to be better. I expect it
3 to be better. And if no one cannot communicate, then
4 they're not going to be inside the department.

5 You know, so we need better communication. And
6 from what I was told, just for the record, and again,
7 we can correct it later or whatever, I was told that
8 it was a separate meeting with you and the
9 construction folks. And if that's not true, then
10 maybe we need to sit down and make sure everybody's on
11 the same page, but it's a big difference.

12 If I get a report from three weeks and then
13 someone tells me that you have a meeting and didn't
14 inform Cruz and Vanessa and all of them, and I heard
15 Joe didn't even know about the meeting. Did you come
16 back or did you tell me that it's six weeks? That's a
17 big-time difference. We want to get all these
18 satellites over. So again, anything I could do to be
19 of assistance. I'm a construction union guy, too. So
20 whatever I could do to be of assistance to get this
21 done, need to get this done. All right. Thank you.

22 MR. LYNCH: Thank you.

23 CHAIRMAN SABIR: Anybody have anything else?

24 MS. DEELEY: I do not.

25 CHAIRMAN SABIR: And thank you. I really

1 appreciate -- I know everybody's working hard and long
2 hours. I really appreciate you. Okay.

3 MR. LYNCH: It's a lot of moving parts.

4 CHAIRMAN SABIR: A lot of moving parts. But
5 we'll get doing --

6 MR. LYNCH: -- this isn't like from 2020 when we
7 just walked into a school and did that.

8 CHAIRMAN SABIR: I understand.

9 MR. LYNCH: It's just like building up on the
10 ground, getting furniture, everything. So it's a lot
11 of work to do.

12 CHAIRMAN SABIR: Thank you. And that's why the
13 people that know --

14 MR. LYNCH: -- get it done.

15 CHAIRMAN SABIR: We're going to get it done. I
16 know it. Thanks, Joe. We will now move to the new
17 business portion of our agenda. A motion that this
18 board deputizes and authorizes Philadelphia board
19 election staff to prepare for and conduct the pre-
20 canvas of absentee and mail-in ballots for the 2024
21 special election. Is there a second?

22 MS. REED: Second.

23 CHAIRMAN SABIR: Commissioners, do you have any
24 comments or questions about this motion before we
25 proceed to vote?

1 MS. DEELEY: I have none.

2 MR. BLUESTEIN: I have none.

3 CHAIRMAN SABIR: Secretary Bluestein, please call
4 the roll.

5 MR. BLUESTEIN: Vice Chair Deeley?

6 MS. DEELEY: I vote aye.

7 MR. BLUESTEIN: I vote aye. Chairman Sabir?

8 CHAIRMAN SABIR: Aye. Motion passes.

9 Commissioner Deeley, do you have any non-agenda items
10 to be raised at this meeting?

11 MS. DEELEY: I have none. Thank you.

12 CHAIRMAN SABIR: Mr. Bluestein, do you have any
13 non-agenda items to be raised at this meeting?

14 MR. BLUESTEIN: I do not. Thank you.

15 CHAIRMAN SABIR: So I had a little other
16 business. It's September 11th. And I know we were
17 all in our different places in September 11th. So we
18 always want to think about the hardworking law
19 enforcement officers and first responders who were --
20 lives had got lost on that tragic day. And there was
21 also a law enforcement officer who passed away.

22 Our thoughts and prayers go out to their family
23 as well. Having no other business, a motion to
24 adjourn today's meeting. Is there a second?

25 MS. DEELEY: Second.

1 CHAIRMAN SABIR: Secretary Bluestein, please call
2 the roll.

3 MR. BLUESTEIN: Vice Chair Deeley?

4 MS. DEELEY: Aye.

5 MR. BLUESTEIN: I vote aye. Chairman Sabir?

6 CHAIRMAN SABIR: Aye. Meeting's adjourned.
