3	CHAIRMAN SABIR: I call to order the meeting of
4	the Philadelphia City Commissioners Return Board for
5	Monday, September the 30th, 2024. This meeting is in
6	compliance with the Pennsylvania Sunshine Act. The
7	Philadelphia City Commissioners are a three-member
	bipartisan board of elected officials in charge of
8	elections and voter registration for the county of
9	Philadelphia. Each commissioner is elected to serve a
10	four-year term that coincides with the municipal
11	election cycle for mayor and city council.
12	The commissioner set and enforced departmental
13	policies to administer voter registration and conduct
14	elections in accordance with federal and state voter
15	registration and election laws. The city
16	commissioners were created by the Pennsylvania
17	assembly in 1711 with a focus on taxation and held
18	various regulatory powers throughout the centuries.
19	The commissioner started maintaining voter lists
20	in 1799 and took on more election related
21	responsibilities and didn't emerge into its current
22	forum until the adoption of Philadelphia's Home Rule
23	Charter in 1951. We will start off with public
24	comments. Before beginning their comments, commenter

- 13 The definition of public notice includes
- 14 publication of notice of the place, date, and time of
- 15 a meeting in a newspaper of general circulation as
- 16 defined by 45 Pa. C.S. 101. The act states that
- 17 should the court determine that the meeting did not
- 18 meet the requirements of this chapter, it may, in its
- 19 discretion, find that any or all official action taken
- 20 at the meeting shall be invalid. It has consistently
- 21 been the past advice of the law department that this
- 22 had to be followed.
- 23 Even during a canvas. Furthermore, this notice
- 24 is required by the public meeting rules. You were
