1 CHAIR SABIR: Good morning.

2 MULTIPLE SPEAKERS: Morning.

3 CHAIR SABIR: I call to order the meeting
4 of the Philadelphia City Commissioners Board
5 of Elections for Wednesday, October 1st, 2025.
6 This meeting is in compliance with the
7 Pennsylvania Sunshine Act.

8 The Philadelphia City Commissioners are a
9 three-member, bipartisan board of elected
10 officials in charge of elections and voter
11 registration for the City of Philadelphia.
12 Each commissioner is elected to serve a four-
13 year term that coincides with the municipal
14 election cycle for mayor and city council.

15 The commissioners set and enforce
16 departmental policies to administer voter
17 registration and conduct elections in
18 accordance with federal and state voter
19 registration and election laws.

20 The city commissioners were created by
21 the Pennsylvania Assembly in 1711 with a focus
22 on taxation and held various regulatory powers
23 throughout the centuries. The commissioners
24 started maintaining voter lists in 1799 and
25 took on more election-related

1 responsibilities, but didn't emerge in its
2 current form until the adoption of the
3 Philadelphia Home Rule Charter in 1951.

4 We will start off with public comments.
5 Before beginning their comments, commenters
6 shall state where they live, or if they are
7 not a resident of Philadelphia, and that they
8 are a Philadelphia taxpayer.

9 Public comment is not an opportunity for
10 dialogue or Q&A. It is public comment, a
11 chance for you to tell us what you think.
12 Each speaker will have two minutes to speak.
13 However, I may extend the time at my
14 discretion. Public comment must concern
15 matters on today's meeting agenda.

16 Finally, it is my responsibility to
17 preserve the order and decorum of meetings.
18 As such, profane, slanderous, discriminatory,
19 or personal attacks will not be tolerated. If
20 you wish to make a public objection to a
21 perceived Sunshine Act violation, please raise
22 your hand and I will recognize you. Outbursts
23 will not be tolerated.

24 Anyone wishing to offer public comment,
25 please step forward. Having none, we will

1 move to our email public comments. Secretary
2 Bluestein.

3 MR. BLUESTEIN: As of 9:45 a.m., there
4 were no email public comments.

5 CHAIR SABIR: Thank you very much. We
6 will now proceed to our old business. First,
7 we have a report from our director of
8 operations, Mr. Joe Lynch.

9 MR. LYNCH: Good morning, Commissioners.

10 MULTIPLE SPEAKERS: Good morning.

11 MR. LYNCH: So this is our public meeting
12 update for October 1st, 2025. At the Election
13 Warehouse, the Voting Machine Services Unit is
14 finalizing a final test and completing
15 necessary repairs so we can distribute them to
16 the technicians and trades helpers
17 accordingly.

18 The E-Poll Book Unit is working to ensure
19 that the electronic poll books are fully
20 prepared and operational for election day.
21 The Election Materials Unit has been working
22 to ensure that the supplies needed for our
23 poll workers are ordered, organized, and ready
24 for packing.

25 As of the current election cycle, we have

1 processed 101,234 voter registration
2 applications. Of those, 4,250 are paper
3 applications, and 96,984 are electronic
4 applications. All applications are up to
5 date.

6 We sent out 58,136 voter ID cards.
7 Delaware and Spring Garden is currently
8 reviewing all applications, correcting errors
9 as needed, and assisting with mail-in ballot
10 applications. The county board of elections,
11 as of Tuesday, approved 81,858 vote-by-mail
12 and absentee applications, which is 3,415
13 added from last week's total.

14 Of those, 46,274 are paper applications,
15 and 35,584 are electronic applications. This
16 includes military and civilian overseas
17 voters. We currently have a total of 1,019
18 applications pending processing. Of those,
19 523 are paper applications, and 496 are
20 electronic applications.

21 A total of 81,514 ballots have been sent
22 out. So far, we've received 2,351 valid
23 ballots through the USPS, and 553 through the
24 drop boxes for a total of 2,904 valid ballots.
25 This total does not include UOCAVA ballots.

1 Voters who would like to vote by mail for the
2 November 4th municipal election can apply for
3 a mail-in or absentee ballot at
4 vote.phila.gov. The deadline to apply is
5 October 28th at 5:00 p.m.

6 ID verification letters have gone out to
7 voters that either did not include the
8 required proof of identification on their
9 absentee/mail-in ballot applications, or their
10 proof of identification could not be verified
11 by the county board of elections office.

12 Voters who have received this letter may
13 submit their proof of ID to the county board
14 of elections via email at
15 phillyelection@phila.gov, fax, U.S. mail,
16 telephone, or in person. Voters have until
17 midnight, November 10th, to return their proof
18 of identification for the municipal election.

19 The Board Worker Unit is holding its fall
20 training seminars with 1,042 participants
21 already in attendance. The schedule is posted
22 on our website. Online training will be
23 available on October 6th, 2025. So far, we
24 have confirmed 5,685 poll workers.

25 Weekly reminders are being sent to poll

1 workers who have not yet confirmed their
2 attendance. Confirmation calls for all wards
3 began on September 22nd, 2025.

4 We are hosting pizza and poll worker
5 events in each council district at the SEOs --
6 satellite election offices. To date, 400 poll
7 workers have attended events in District 1
8 through District 8. Events at satellites 9
9 and 10 will be held over the next few weeks.
10 RSVP is required to attend, which can be done
11 on our website.

12 Speaking of satellite offices, they are
13 open to the public with staff available from
14 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m., Monday through Friday.
15 Locations are listed on our website,
16 vote.phila.gov. Drop boxes throughout the
17 city are open for voters to drop off their
18 ballots.

19 Last week, it was reported that the
20 camera for the drop box located at the
21 Eastwick Library was down. The drop box is
22 currently up and running, and the website has
23 been updated. We received a call yesterday
24 stating that our drop box at SEO 5 was struck
25 by a vehicle and knocked off of its perch. We

1 were able to pick it up and place it inside
2 the SEO for the time being.

3 We updated the website to inform people
4 that the box was inside the SEO. And the box
5 will be replaced today by the end of business.
6 A police report has been filed from the
7 accident. Thanks. That's all I have for
8 today.

9 CHAIR SABIR: Thanks, Joe. Vice Chair
10 Deeley, did you have any questions for Joe?

11 MS. DEELEY: Thank you. I have none.

12 CHAIR SABIR: Secretary?

13 MR. BLUESTEIN: I have none. Thank you.

14 CHAIR SABIR: Thank you, Joe.

15 MR. LYNCH: Thank you.

16 CHAIR SABIR: We will now proceed to new
17 business. We will begin by considering our
18 first agenda item; motion to hire director of
19 election administration. I move to hire Mark
20 Johnson as the director of election
21 administration. Is there a second?

22 MR. BLUESTEIN: Second.

23 CHAIR SABIR: Does any commissioners have
24 any comments before we proceed to vote? There
25 are no questions. Secretary Bluestein, please

1 call the roll.

2 MR. BLUESTEIN: Vice Chair Deeley.

3 MS. DEELEY: Abstain.

4 MR. BLUESTEIN: I vote aye. Chairman
5 Sabir.

6 CHAIR SABIR: Aye. Motion passes. We
7 will now move to the next agenda item; polling
8 place changes. We'll hear from our Polling
9 Places Investigation Supervisor, Charlie
10 Stroman.

11 MR. STROMAN: Good morning,
12 Commissioners.

13 CHAIR SABIR: Good morning.

14 MR. STROMAN: Good morning, again.

15 MR. BLUESTEIN: Morning.

16 MS. DEELEY: Morning.

17 MR. STROMAN: The first two were in the
18 5th Ward, the 15th Division, and the 20th
19 Division 20, both moving out of St. John
20 Neumann Center, Fishtown, to the Rodriguez
21 Branch Library that is due to a refusal.

22 CHAIR SABIR: Having heard the
23 recommendation of professional staff, I move
24 that we accept the polling place change for
25 Ward 5, Division 15, and 20. Is there a

1 second?

2 MS. DEELEY: Second.

3 CHAIR SABIR: Secretary Bluestein, please
4 call the roll.

5 MR. BLUESTEIN: Vice Chair Deeley?

6 MS. DEELEY: Aye.

7 MR. BLUESTEIN: I vote aye. Chairman
8 Sabir?

9 CHAIR SABIR: Aye. Please proceed.

10 MR. STROMAN: Next one will be in the
11 14th Ward, the 1st Division, moving out of the
12 Simpson Midtown Apartments back to Arts and
13 Crafts Holdings. And that was due to a
14 management issue.

15 CHAIR SABIR: Having heard the
16 recommendation of the professional staff, I
17 move that we accept the polling place change
18 for Ward 14, Division 1. Is there a second?

19 MS. DEELEY: Second.

20 CHAIR SABIR: Secretary Bluestein, please
21 call the roll.

22 MR. BLUESTEIN: Vice Chair Deeley?

23 MS. DEELEY: Aye.

24 MR. BLUESTEIN: I vote aye. Chairman
25 Sabir?

1 CHAIR SABIR: Aye. Please proceed.

2 MR. STROMAN: Next one will be in the
3 23rd Ward, the 15th Division, moving out of
4 Harding Middle School back to the Carmella Rec
5 Center. And the rebuild's all complete, so
6 that's why we're moving back.

7 CHAIR SABIR: Having heard the
8 recommendation of the professional staff, I
9 move that we accept the polling place change
10 for Ward 23, Division 15. Is there a second?

11 MS. DEELEY: Second.

12 CHAIR SABIR: Secretary Bluestein, please
13 call the roll.

14 MR. BLUESTEIN: Vice Chair Deeley?

15 MS. DEELEY: Aye.

16 MR. BLUESTEIN: I vote aye. Chairman
17 Sabir?

18 CHAIR SABIR: Aye. Please proceed.

19 MR. STROMAN: Next two will be in the
20 24th Ward, the 9th Division, and the 14th
21 Division. Moving out of School of the Future
22 back to Clayborn and Lewis Community Center,
23 and that is due to a rebuild that just been
24 completed.

25 CHAIR SABIR: Having heard the

1 recommendation of the professional staff, I
2 move that we accept the polling place change
3 for Ward 24, Division 9, and 14. Is there a
4 second?

5 MS. DEELEY: Second.

6 CHAIR SABIR: Secretary Bluestein, please
7 call the roll.

8 MR. BLUESTEIN: Vice Chair Deeley?

9 MS. DEELEY: Aye.

10 MR. BLUESTEIN: I vote aye. Chairman
11 Sabir?

12 CHAIR SABIR: Aye. Please proceed.

13 MR. STROMAN: Next five will be in the
14 39th Ward, the 2nd Division, 11th Division,
15 13th Division, 16th Division, and the 24th
16 Division, all moving out of Seafarers Union
17 Hall to the Taggart School. And that is due
18 to the Seafarers Union Hall being sold.

19 CHAIR SABIR: Having heard the
20 recommendation of the professional staff, I
21 move that we accept the polling place change
22 for Ward 39, Division 2, 11, 13, 16, and 24.
23 Is there a second?

24 MS. DEELEY: Second.

25 CHAIR SABIR: Secretary Bluestein, please

1 call the roll.

2 MR. BLUESTEIN: Vice Chair Deeley?

3 MS. DEELEY: Aye.

4 MR. BLUESTEIN: I vote aye. Chairman
5 Sabir?

6 CHAIR SABIR: Aye.

7 MR. STROMAN: That's it.

8 CHAIR SABIR: Hey, as always, I'd like to
9 thank you, the polling place. I mean, I know
10 it's not easy. All the logistics, all of the
11 construction items, and everything else to
12 ensure that our polling locations are open and
13 great places for the voters. So thank you. I
14 appreciate that.

15 MR. STROMAN: You're welcome. You're
16 welcome.

17 CHAIR SABIR: This is our last item on
18 the agenda before we adjourn. Commissioner
19 Deeley, do you have any other business to be
20 raised at this meeting?

21 MS. DEELEY: Thank you. I have none.

22 CHAIR SABIR: Secretary Bluestein, do you
23 have any other business to be raised at this
24 meeting?

25 MR. BLUESTEIN: I just wanted to

1 congratulate Mark on his new role, and I look
2 forward to working with you.

3 CHAIR SABIR: Well, I'd like to
4 definitely congratulate Mark. Definitely like
5 to thank the staff. That position was vacant
6 for a few elections. And I know that staff
7 had came together to sort of fill some of that
8 vacancy. So we definitely thank you, and
9 definitely looking forward to working together
10 with Mark.

11 We also have Aubrey Powers and Gabby from
12 the managing director's office here. I know
13 we cannot get these elections done without the
14 support from the managing director's office
15 and the several staff. So we definitely thank
16 you, and we definitely like to work with you
17 in the upcoming election.

18 Okay. A motion to adjourn this meeting.
19 Is there a second?

20 MS. DEELEY: Second.

21 CHAIR SABIR: Secretary Bluestein, please
22 call the roll.

23 MR. BLUESTEIN: Vice Chair Deeley?

24 MS. DEELEY: Aye.

25 MR. BLUESTEIN: I vote aye. Chairman

1 Sabir?

2 CHAIR SABIR: Aye. This meeting is
3 adjourned.
