

1 JUDGE CRUMLISH: Good
2 morning, everyone. I call to order the
3 October 4, 2023 meeting for the Philadelphia
4 County Board of Elections. I'll remind
5 those present that it is my duty and
6 obligation that we obtain order and decorum
7 during this proceeding. Therefore, please
8 be reminded that this meeting is governed by
9 the Sunshine Act and that anyone who wishes
10 to speak may object at any time during the
11 proceeding for violations of the Act.

12 So if you do choose to make such
13 an objection, please do so succinctly.
14 State your objection. And as a reminder, an
15 objection is not an opportunity for
16 speechmaking.

17 I'll now move to public comment.
18 Public comment is governed by, again, the
19 Act and the commentators shall state where
20 they live or if they're not a resident that
21 they're a Philadelphia taxpayer. And,
22 again, public comment is not an opportunity
23 for interrogation, dialogue, or questions
24 and answers.

1 It's truly a public comment
2 opportunity and a chance for you to be heard
3 and we will maintain a budget of about two
4 minutes. I may extend that time at my
5 discretion but I remind those present that
6 all public comments must be relevant or
7 germane to the Board's business.

8 Finally, again, it's my duty and
9 obligation to maintain order and decorum of
10 this meeting and therefore profane,
11 slanderous, discriminatory, or personal
12 attacks won't be tolerated. So please note
13 that there will be a dropbox and polling
14 place change later in this meeting so anyone
15 wishing to be heard on those changes should
16 wait until that time. Is there anyone here
17 for public comment?

18 MR. GARELLA: Yes. Good
19 morning. I would like to -- my name is Rich
20 Garella. I live in South Philadelphia and
21 I'm representing Protect Our Vote Philly.

22 I would like to express our
23 appreciation for a couple of changes that
24 were made over the past couple of weeks in

1 the conduct of these meetings. One was that
2 the secretary started to read out loud the
3 e-mailed public comments which I think is
4 important because otherwise they're not --
5 they weren't being included in the
6 transcripts of the meetings so there was no
7 real way for the public to see what those
8 were unless they showed up in person. So we
9 do appreciate that.

10 We also appreciate that the Chair
11 offered some explanation as to the reason
12 for the executive session that had been
13 announced at the previous meeting. We would
14 hope and encourage that to continue and we
15 encourage those explanations to be even more
16 detailed so that they could meet the
17 standard established by the Commonwealth
18 Court in Reading versus Eagle that the
19 intention of these explanations is so that
20 the public can (inaudible) and the public
21 had to be excluded.

22 So I think in the first place if
23 there's any ongoing litigation, those
24 referred to that litigation should at least

1 be named or the topic of possible litigation
2 should be made clear.

3 So thank you for those two
4 improvements and I would like to remind the
5 Board as well that it remains your
6 obligation under the Sunshine Act to
7 actually keep minutes of these meetings and
8 (inaudible) and minutes are really necessary
9 for the public to have an official record of
10 all of the actions of this Board. Thank you
11 very much.

12 JUDGE CRUMLISH: Thank you,
13 sir. We'll now move on to any e-mailed
14 comments that may have been submitted to the
15 Board. Judge Furlong?

16 JUDGE FURLONG: Thank you,
17 Mr. Chairman. As of 9:45 a.m. today, the
18 secretary is unaware of any e-mail comments
19 received by the Office of City Commission.

20 JUDGE CRUMLISH: So having
21 said that, we will now move on to old
22 business and I'm going to ask Director Lynch
23 to read the Executive Director's report.

24 MR. LYNCH: Good morning,

1 your Honor. The Sunshine Report for October
2 4, 2023, the County Board of Election
3 Report. The County Board is now accepting
4 mail-in and absentee ballot applications.
5 Voters will need to return (inaudible) to
6 vote by mail for the general election.
7 Voters may apply online at vote.phila.gov
8 rather than returning the paper application.

9 As of yesterday, we approved
10 20,497 vote-by-mail applications. Of those,
11 4,852 were paper applications and 34,645
12 were electronic applications. This includes
13 civilian, overseas, and military voters. We
14 have a total of 1,506 waiting to be --

16 (Whereupon there was a break

19 JUDGE CRUMLISH: That was a
20 technical glitch. I'm sorry, Director. You
21 can continue.

22 MR. LYNCH: The final appeals
23 to nominees waivers have expired. The
24 ballot is now finalized and the preparations

1 are underway. Mail ballots will be in the
2 mail at the end of the week. Dropboxes will
3 be unlocked the day after the ballots are
4 mailed.

5 Tuesday, October 10, 2023 we will
6 open our satellite office (inaudible). For
7 the Voter Registration Unit, the election
8 cycle to date we have processed 98,275
9 applications of which (inaudible).

10 - - -

11 (Whereupon there was a break

14 MR. LYNCH: Okay. For the
15 Voter Registration Unit, the election cycle
16 to date we have processed 98,275
17 applications of which 13,700 were paper
18 apps. Staff are currently processing
19 applications and stuffing provisional
20 envelopes.

21 The Election Board. As of October
22 2nd, the unit has trained 1,442 board
23 workers in person. Up to 3,000 people have
24 committed to working Election Day and 378

1 people have done the online training.

2 JUDGE CRUMLISH: Thank you,
3 Director Lynch. The Sunshine Report will be
4 made a part of the permanent record of the
5 Board.

6 I'll now move on to new business.
7 Is there anyone here to present an objection
8 or concern regarding the moving of the
9 dropbox that is presently before the Board
10 which is the Kingsessing Recreation Center
11 at 4901 Kingsessing Avenue to be moved to
12 the corner of Kingsessing Avenue at 50th
13 Street?

14 (No response).

15 JUDGE CRUMLISH: Hearing no
16 comment, Mr. Lynch, will you present the
17 move of the general election dropbox
18 relocation?

19 MR. LYNCH: Sure. The new
20 dropbox relocation. The dropbox at
21 Kingsessing Recreation Center which is 4901
22 Kingsessing Ave. is to be relocated to the
23 corner of Kingsessing and South 50th Street
24 which is right across the street due to

1 construction at the recreation center.

2 JUDGE CRUMLISH: I would move
3 that we accept the recommendation of
4 professional staff to move the 2023 primary
5 location as indicated by Director Lynch. Do
6 I hear a second?

7 JUDGE FURLONG: Second.

8 JUDGE CRUMLISH: All in
9 favor?

10 (Aye).

11 JUDGE CRUMLISH: So that
12 motion passes. Now I'd like to have the
13 polling place relocations. I'm going to ask
14 Mr. Stroman to present the polling place
15 relocations. Is there anyone here that
16 would like to speak to the moving of a
17 polling place?

18 (No response).

19 JUDGE CRUMLISH: Hearing
20 none, Mr. Stroman, you may proceed.

21 MR. STROMAN: Good morning,
22 your Honor. The first two changes are in
23 the 18th Ward, the 14th Division and the
24 15th Division moving out of Al Aqsa Islamic

1 Society at 1501 Germantown Avenue to the
2 Tajdeed residence at 250 West Oxford Street.
3 That is basically the same complex. It's
4 just across the street.

5 JUDGE CRUMLISH: I would move
6 that we accept the recommendation of
7 professional staff to move the 18th Ward
8 Division and 15th Division as recommended.
9 Do I hear a second?

10 JUDGE FURLONG: Second.

11 JUDGE CRUMLISH: All in
12 favor?

13 (Aye).

14 JUDGE CRUMLISH: You may
15 proceed.

16 MR. STROMAN: The next two
17 are in the 24th Ward; the 15th Division and
18 the 16th Division moving out of Calvary St.
19 Augustine Episcopal Church at 814 North 41st
20 Street to the McMichael School at 3543
21 Fairmount Avenue and they are both moving
22 into their own ward.

23 JUDGE CRUMLISH: I would move
24 that we accept the recommendation of

1 professional staff. Do I hear a second?

2 JUDGE FURLONG: Second.

3 JUDGE CRUMLISH: All in
4 favor?

5 (Aye).

6 JUDGE CRUMLISH: So moved and
7 accepted.

8 MR. STROMAN: Next one is in
9 the 41st Ward, the 11th Division moving out
10 of Holy Innocents St. Paul's Church, 7001
11 Torresdale Avenue to the Tacony Branch
12 Library, 6742 Torresdale Avenue and this is
13 due to a refusal.

14 JUDGE CRUMLISH: I would move
15 that we accept the recommendation of
16 professional staff to move as Mr. Stroman
17 has indicated. Do I hear a second?

18 JUDGE FURLONG: Second.

19 JUDGE CRUMLISH: All in
20 favor?

21 (Aye).

22 JUDGE CRUMLISH: That is
23 accepted. Mr. Stroman?

24 MR. STROMAN: The next two

1 are in the 41st Ward again; 17th Division
2 and the 21st Division. Again moving out of
3 Holy Innocents St. Paul's Church, 7001
4 Torresdale Avenue to Jack Costello Boxing
5 Club at 6846 Torresdale Avenue due to a
6 refusal.

7 JUDGE CRUMLISH: I would move
8 that we accept the professional staff's
9 recommendation to move these two polling
10 places. Do I hear a second?

11 JUDGE FURLONG: Second.

12 JUDGE CRUMLISH: All in
13 favor?

14 (Aye).

15 JUDGE CRUMLISH: The motion
16 carries and the changes have been accepted.

17 MR. STROMAN: Next two are in
18 the 46th Ward, the 5th Division and the 6th
19 Division moving out of Mastery Harrity
20 Charter School, 5601 Christian Street to
21 Boys Latin Charter School at 5501 Cedar
22 Avenue and that is back to the original
23 location.

24 JUDGE CRUMLISH: I move that

1 we accept the recommendation of professional
2 staff to move these two polling places as
3 recommended. Do I hear a second?

4 JUDGE FURLONG: Second to
5 both.

6 JUDGE CRUMLISH: All in
7 favor?

8 (Aye).

9 JUDGE CRUMLISH: That motion
10 carries. Judge Furlong, do we have any
11 other items to be added to the agenda?

12 JUDGE FURLONG: No, Mr.
13 Chairman.

14 JUDGE CRUMLISH: Judge
15 Johnson, do we have any other items to be
16 added to the agenda?

17 JUDGE JOHNSON: No, Mr.
18 Chairman.

19 JUDGE CRUMLISH: I'd like to
20 make a motion that we adjourn this meeting
21 to follow the Chair. All in favor?

22 (Aye).

23 JUDGE CRUMLISH: Thank you
24 very much.
