4 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: Good morning. I  
5 call to order the October 12, 2022 meeting of  
6 the Philadelphia City Commissioners.

7 First, I will preserve the order and  
8 decorum of these meetings. Everyone in  
9 attendance should be on notice that shouting  
10 out or interrupting the proceedings will not  
11 be tolerated. Those who violate this will be  
12 asked to leave.

13 The Sunshine Act permits anyone  
14 attending a public meeting to object to a  
15 perceived violation at any time during the  
16 meeting. If you choose to do so, please  
17 succinctly state your objection. Objecting is  
18 not an opportunity for speech making.

19 We will now move to public comment.  
20 Commenter's shall state where they live or if  
21 they are not a resident of Philadelphia, that  
22 they are a Philadelphia taxpayer. Public  
23 comment is not an opportunity for dialogue or  
24 Q&A. It's public comment, a chance for you to

1 tell us what you think.

2 Each speaker shall have two minutes,  
3 however, I may extend this time at my  
4 discretion. All public comments must be  
5 relevant or germane to board business.

6 Finally, it is my responsibility to  
7 preserve order and decorum of the meetings.  
8 As such profane, slanderous, discriminatory or  
9 personal attacks will not be tolerated.

10 Please note we will be doing polling  
11 place changes later in the meeting. So anyone  
12 wishing to be heard on a polling place change  
13 should wait until that time.

14 Is there anyone here for public comment  
15 not pertaining to a polling place?

16 We will now move to Commissioner  
17 Bluestein for e-mailed public comment.

18 COMMISSIONER BLUESTEIN: There were no  
19 e-mailed public comments as of 9:45 a.m. this  
20 morning.

21 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: Thank you,  
22 Commissioner. We will now proceed with old  
23 business, and I'll call on Joe Lynch,  
24 Executive Director, for his report.

1 MR. LYNCH: Good morning,  
2 Commissioners.

3 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: Good morning.

4 MR. LYNCH: Today's Sunshine Report for  
5 October 12th, 2022. The County Board of  
6 Elections, they began mailing out their first  
7 shipment of mail-in absentee ballots on  
8 Monday, October 10th, 2022.

9 As of yesterday, the vote-by-mail  
10 center processed and mailed out 126,463  
11 mail-in and absentee ballots.

12 The unit will continue to do so on a  
13 daily basis. As of yesterday, they have  
14 approved 126,791 vote-by-mail applications,  
15 which is 8,756 added from the report from two  
16 weeks ago.

17 Of those, 82,990 are paper applications  
18 and 43,801 are electronic applications. This  
19 is including civilian overseas, military, and  
20 permanent ballot voters who applied in the  
21 primary.

22 Ballot application processing is caught  
23 up through Friday. There are approximately  
24 zero paper applications and 4,609 electronic

1 applications waiting to be processed. They  
2 sent out 1,113 UOCAVA ballots and of those 67  
3 have been returned.

4 The last day to register to vote is  
5 October 24th. And the last day to apply for  
6 mail-in ballots is November 1st.

7 Report from the Voter Registration Unit  
8 for the election cycle to date: They have  
9 processed 172,631 registration applications of  
10 which 70,100 were paper applications.

11 They have a backlog of 3,300 paper  
12 applications and 769 of those are double apps  
13 so it's registration and mail-in applications.

14 Both the DPU rooms are working on  
15 registrations. They received two shipments of  
16 street lists.

17 The Documents Unit is working on the  
18 mail, street lists -- sorry, strike that.

19 Documents Unit is working on the mail,  
20 street lists and time stamping all the  
21 incoming applications.

22 The Correspondence Unit is working on  
23 cancellations and assisting with voter  
24 registration applications. They printed

1 18,635 ID cards over the weekend. They will  
2 be shipping them today for a total of 112,455.

3 The drop box team started picking up  
4 yesterday for the mail-in ballots.

5 The Election Board confirmed numbers  
6 for working the polls is -- people working the  
7 polls is 5,484. There were 375 voicemails  
8 left. People that are saying they will not be  
9 working for this upcoming election is 1,725.  
10 Scheduled for upcoming training is 1,474.

11 And confirmed for taking in-person  
12 training is 1,434. Online training: There  
13 was 1,145 people trained online to date.

14 Okay, that's all I have, Commissioners.

15 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: Thank you, Joe.  
16 Thanks for a great job from you and your staff  
17 this weekend as well.

18 MR. LYNCH: Thanks.

19 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: We will now move on  
20 to new business. Charlie Stroman will come up  
21 about the polling place relocations.

22 But before that, is there anyone here  
23 who would like to speak on the moving of a  
24 polling place?

1                   Please step forward in the order in  
2                   which you came in. Ma'am. Good morning.  
3                   Thanks for being here. Please state your name  
4                   for the record.

5                   MS. LAVINE: Good morning to everyone  
6                   on this beautiful day. My name is Dee Lavine.  
7                   I am president of the Water Marks Residential  
8                   Council.

9                   I'm here today representing them today  
10                  along with my two colleagues, council members  
11                  Fran Hunter and Martin Gehlhaus. They are  
12                  council members and I am president of the  
13                  council.

14                  We have had in the past -- and I am a  
15                  resident of the Watermark for about almost 10  
16                  years. And we always have the voting polls in  
17                  our building, which makes it very convenient  
18                  when 60 percent, at least, of the residents  
19                  have wheelchairs, walkers and electrical  
20                  appliances that they have to use.

21                  We moved it because of the pandemic and  
22                  it's been at the meeting house of the Mormon  
23                  church. It's about a block away, a block and  
24                  a half away, and if you have two good legs

1           that can walk its a hop, skip and jump.

2                   For us it's a 10-mile hike.

3                   Many of our residents cannot get there  
4           at all because they're in wheelchairs, and if  
5           the weather is bad, they can't get out. It's  
6           an effort for some of us even to get dressed  
7           in the morning and come downstairs.

8                   We had several meetings there and we  
9           with the voting team we laid out the logistics  
10          of it. Very simple. The voters come in the  
11          door, the side door, right into the voting  
12          area where they cast their vote and exit  
13          through our main lobby.

14                  The flow of traffic -- Trevor was there  
15          and believed that everything was right.

16                  While Trevor was there, though, he did  
17          note that most of the residents at that  
18          particular time that were going out, were  
19          either with walkers, canes and aides.

20                  And he noted I can understand why you  
21          need these voting machines in your building.

22                  CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: Thank you.

23                  MS. LAVINE: To have it outside the  
24          building would be not only difficult, it would



1 be a hazard to have people who have canes and  
2 wheelchairs outside the building we're subject  
3 to falling, falling sometimes when no one is  
4 around to pick us up.

5 Voting is a privilege and a  
6 responsibility. It should not be made a  
7 hazard.

8 If we do not have the voting machines  
9 in our building, then you're creating a hazard  
10 for over 300 voters to have to go out of the  
11 building.

12 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: Thank you very  
13 much, Ms. Lavine.

14 MS. LAVINE: Thank you, appreciate you.

15 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: Is there anyone  
16 here to offer public comment? Please come  
17 forward, sir.

18 Good morning, sir. Thank you for  
19 coming down please. State your name.

20 MR. GEHLHAUS: Martin Gehlhaus and I  
21 live at the Watermark as well with Ms. Lavine  
22 and I'm also on the council.

23 And Dee made many valid points and I  
24 would just like to add to those that some

1 people may think well let them all just do  
2 mail ballots.

3 I have stood and helped watch some of  
4 our residents circle what they want for a meal  
5 and they have a hard time circling something  
6 let alone filling in little squares and  
7 address things and casting a vote and making a  
8 difference.

9 And as Dee said, many of these  
10 residents are with wheelchairs, walkers,  
11 canes. Some do have aides, but again to walk  
12 that far on a nice day is very difficult.

13 If we were to get a rainy day, then  
14 those individuals are unable to execute their  
15 right to vote. And even though in the  
16 Constitution, the original Constitution  
17 doesn't give anyone the right to vote.

18 It wasn't until 1870 Fifteenth  
19 Amendment that men were given the right to  
20 vote and we know how that's gone and has  
21 changed so it's a very fine line.

22 Dee referred to it as a privilege, a  
23 responsibility, which you can mean a right to  
24 vote. And I think by moving this across the

1 street back where it was strictly for the  
2 pandemic caused by COVID would be an unjust  
3 situation for those that want to exert their  
4 right to vote.

5 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: Thank you, sir.

6 MR. GEHLHAUS: Thank you.

7 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: Is there anyone  
8 here remaining that would like to comment on a  
9 polling place change?

10 Please step forward, sir. Thank you  
11 very much for being here. Please state your  
12 name for the record.

13 MR. CUMMINGS: My name is Ed Cummings.  
14 I'm a voting machine inspector for Ward 8  
15 Division 25. I have worked at that polling  
16 place for years and I have helped many of the  
17 residents at the Watermark with the logistical  
18 aspects of using the voting machines, which  
19 are new to some of them, and even helped some  
20 of them even walk in and out of the building  
21 so I'm very sympathetic to this point.

22 The reason for it's moving as was  
23 stated earlier, it's for because of COVID.  
24 And I'm still concerned about that aspect of

1 our pandemic, which is not over yet.

2 I'm going to read a very brief e-mail  
3 from someone who works with the Ward, Eileen  
4 Pherson (ph), and she says: "We are returning  
5 to the Watermark at the request of the  
6 residents. The residents recognized that  
7 moving out in 2020 was necessary during COVID,  
8 but now that things are just about back to  
9 normal, they ask to have the polling location  
10 return to the Watermark. After I discussed  
11 this issue with our ward leader and the city  
12 commissioners, they both approved to move the  
13 polling location back. I also spoke with  
14 Bishop Coursley (ph), at the LDS Latter-Day  
15 Saints, the Mormons, about the relocation and  
16 he also supported the move back."

17 So I question the purpose of this  
18 hearing if this decision has already been made  
19 without public input according to someone  
20 who's with the Ward. So I just wanted to say  
21 that.

22 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: Thank you. Is  
23 there anyone else here for public comment  
24 regarding a polling place change?

1           Seeing none, I will now move to Charlie  
2           Stroman with polling place relocations.

3           MR. STROMAN: Good morning,  
4           Commissioners.

5           CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: Good morning,  
6           Charlie.

7           MR. STROMAN: Just a little update on  
8           the polling places. We're still looking for  
9           two new places we have refusals for we hope to  
10          get that today so we're doing pretty good  
11          there.

12          All right moving to the changes. I'm  
13          going to jump to the 8th Ward for the first  
14          one that we just heard about. That would be  
15          moving from the Church of Latter-Day Saints  
16          Meeting House to the Watermark at Logan  
17          Square.

18          CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: Charlie, have the  
19          signs been placed?

20          MR. STROMAN: Yes.

21          CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: And what day?

22          MR. STROMAN: They were placed on  
23          Wednesday, Thursday or Friday because we have  
24          to have them placed five days in advance and

1 they were definitely all placed five days in  
2 advance.

3 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: Thank you. I  
4 motion that we approve the proposed move 8th  
5 Ward 25th Division, Church of Latter-Day  
6 Saints moving to the Watermark at Logan  
7 Square.

8 COMMISSIONER BLUESTEIN: Second.

9 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: Commissioner  
10 Bluestein, please call the roll.

11 COMMISSIONER BLUESTEIN: Commissioner  
12 Deeley?

13 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: Aye.

14 COMMISSIONER BLUESTEIN: I vote aye.  
15 Commissioner Sabir?

16 COMMISSIONER SABIR: Aye.

17 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: The polling place  
18 change 8th Ward 25th Division has been  
19 approved unanimously. Proceed.

20 MR. STROMAN: Okay. I'm going to move  
21 to the top of the page in the 2nd Ward in the  
22 2nd Division. A request to move Gloria Dei  
23 Old Swedes Church into the Mummers Museum.

24 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: I motion that we

1 approve the proposed move 2nd Ward, 2nd  
2 Division Gloria Dei Old Swedes Church moving  
3 to Mummers Museum.

4 COMMISSIONER BLUESTEIN: Second.

5 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: Commissioner  
6 Bluestein, please call the roll.

7 COMMISSIONER BLUESTEIN: Commissioner  
8 Deeley?

9 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: Aye.

10 MR. BLUESTEIN: I vote aye.  
11 Commissioner Sabir?

12 COMMISSIONER SABIR: Aye.

13 MR. STROMAN: The next change would be  
14 in the 7th --

15 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: Wait hold up,  
16 Charlie. Polling place change 2nd Ward 2nd  
17 Division has passed unanimously. Proceed.

18 MR. STROMAN: The next change will be  
19 in the 7th Ward in the 5th Division, moving  
20 out of the Salvation Army on Mascher Street to  
21 Villas Del Caribe on 167 W Allegheny Avenue,  
22 which that would be back into the division.

23 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: I motion that we  
24 approve the polling place move 7th Ward, 5th

1 Division Salvation Army to Villas Del Caribe.

2 COMMISSIONER BLUESTEIN: Second.

3 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: Commissioner

4 Bluestein, please call the roll.

5 COMMISSIONER BLUESTEIN: Commissioner

6 Deeley?

7 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: Aye.

8 COMMISSIONER BLUESTEIN: I vote aye.

9 Commissioner Sabir?

10 COMMISSIONER SABIR: Aye.

11 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: Polling place

12 change 7th Ward, 5th Division has passed

13 unanimously. Please proceed.

14 MR. STROMAN: Next one will be in the

15 8th Ward in the 15th Division moving out of

16 the Phoenix Apartments, which was a refusal,

17 into the Arch Street Presbyterian Church on

18 Arch Street, which is in the same division.

19 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: I motion that we

20 approve the proposed move 8th Ward, 15th

21 Division from the Phoenix Apartments to the

22 Arch Street Presbyterian Church.

23 COMMISSIONER BLUESTEIN: Second.

24 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: Commissioner



1           Bluestein, please call the roll.

2                   MR. BLUESTEIN: Commissioner Deeley?

3                   CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: Aye.

4                   COMMISSIONER BLUESTEIN: I vote aye.

5           Commissioner Sabir?

7                   CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: The polling place  
8           change 8th Ward, 15th Division has passed  
9           unanimously. Please proceed.

10                   MR. STROMAN: The next two I'm going to  
11           lump together in the 9th Ward. The 7th  
12           Division and the 8th Division moving out of  
13           Chestnut Hill United Church on Germantown  
14           Avenue to the Saint Paul's Episcopal Church on  
15           Chestnut Hill Avenue that would be 9/7 and  
16           9/8.

17                   CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: I motion that we  
18           approve the proposed move Ward 9, Division 7  
19           and Ward 9, Division 8 moving from Chestnut  
20           Hill United Church to Saint Paul's Episcopal  
21           Church.

22                   COMMISSIONER SABIR: Second.

23                   CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: Commissioner  
24           Bluestein, please call the roll.

1 COMMISSIONER BLUESTEIN: Commissioner  
2 Deeley?

3 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: Aye.

4 COMMISSIONER BLUESTEIN: I vote aye.  
5 Commissioner Sabir?

6 COMMISSIONER SABIR: Aye.

7 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: The polling place

17 approve the proposed move 11th Ward, 1st  
18 Division from G. Choice Funeral Home moving to  
19 Mt. Calvary Pentecostal Church.

20 COMMISSIONER BLUESTEIN: Second.

21 CHAIRWOMAN DEELEY: Commissioner
