

1 JUDGE CRUMLISH: I'm going to  
2 call to order the October 18, 2023 meeting  
3 of the Philadelphia County Board of  
4 Elections. As I always do, I emphasize that  
5 it is my duty and obligation to preserve  
6 order and decorum of these meetings.  
7 Everyone in attendance should be on notice  
8 that any interruptions of these ordinary  
9 proceedings will not be tolerated and those  
10 who violate that request will be asked to  
11 leave.

12 The Sunshine Act permits anyone  
13 attending a public meeting to object to a  
14 perceived violation at any time during the  
15 meeting. If you choose to do so, please  
16 succinctly (inaudible). An objection is not  
17 an opportunity for litigation or  
18 speechmaking.

19 Having said that, we'll now move  
20 to public comment. Commentors shall state  
21 their name, where they live, or if they are  
22 or are not a resident of Philadelphia and if  
23 they are a Philadelphia taxpayer. So public  
24 comment is not an opportunity, as I've said

1 before, for interrogation or dialogue or  
2 litigation. It's a public comment; a chance  
3 for you to tell us what you think.

4 The speaker shall be allotted  
5 approximately two minutes. However, I may  
6 extend this time at my discretion. All  
7 public comments must be relevant or germane  
8 to the Board business. Finally, it is my  
9 responsibility in this part of the  
10 proceeding also to preserve the order and  
11 decorum of these meetings so profane,  
12 slanderous, discriminatory, or personal  
13 attacks won't be tolerated.

14 Please note that we will be doing  
15 polling place changes later in the meeting  
16 so anyone wishing to be heard on a polling  
17 place change shall wait 'til that time. Is  
18 there anyone here for public comment?

19 MR. GARELLA: Good morning.

20 JUDGE CRUMLISH: Good  
21 morning.

22 MR. GARELLA: I have a public  
23 comment that I submitted last week. My name  
24 is Rich Garella from Protect Our Vote

1 Philly. I have a public comment I submitted  
2 last week that wasn't read out and I'd like  
3 to read it into the record. It might be a  
4 little over three minutes.

5 JUDGE CRUMLISH: I advise you  
6 that in the public meeting we identified the  
7 comment that you (inaudible) and it was made  
8 part of the record. It's been made part of  
9 the record already so you can use it to  
10 summarize at this point but it has already  
11 been established that it's in our record.  
12 Okay?

13 MR. GARELLA: That means it's  
14 in the transcript, the minutes?

15 JUDGE CRUMLISH: You can  
16 start now.

17 MR. GARELLA: Okay. So I  
18 just wanted to call your attention to the  
19 executive session that you announced after  
20 the fact, which is fine, on September 27th  
21 that took place before September 27th saying  
22 that the Board would be meeting in executive  
23 session to confer with counsel regarding the  
24 timing of the upcoming election as it

1 relates to the (inaudible) of the ballots  
2 and the certification of the machine  
3 process.

4           Having conducted that, by  
5 recommendation counsel did communicate with  
6 Commonwealth Court advising them of the  
7 deadline that we were facing that may be  
8 impacted by any ongoing litigation. The  
9 problem with this explanation is it was  
10 impossible to tell -- for the public to tell  
11 whether there is any ongoing litigation or  
12 not.

13           If there is, according to Reading  
14 Eagle versus Reading, it should -- that  
15 litigation should've been identified by the  
16 names of the parties, the docket number, and  
17 the court in which it was filed. If there's  
18 not litigation, then the nature of an  
19 identifiable complaint or threatened  
20 litigation should've been stated. That's  
21 the law that was set out by the Commonwealth  
22 Court in Reading Eagle versus Reading.

23           The goal of this Board should be  
24 to help the public understand the purpose of

1 the session and why it was excluded, not to  
2 obscure it or try to -- you know, or just  
3 sort of (inaudible) in some technical way  
4 that the Board thinks the law requires. So  
5 what we're requesting is that the Board take  
6 these words to heart, fulfill its legal  
7 obligations to the public, and reexplain the  
8 purpose of that executive session held  
9 between September 20th and 27th in a way  
10 that meets the requirements of Pennsylvania  
11 law.

12 And so we just are hoping that you  
13 would go ahead and do that. Whether there  
14 is litigation or whether there isn't, I  
15 think the public deserves to know the reason  
16 for that executive session in a way that we  
17 can understand. Thank you.

18 JUDGE CRUMLISH: Thank you.  
19 Judge Furlong, have we had any e-mailed  
20 public comments?

21 JUDGE FURLONG: Thank you,  
22 Judge Crumlish. All comments that were  
23 e-mailed by 9:45 a.m. were shared with the  
24 Members of the Board and the deputies by

1 10:00 a.m. and have been provided to each  
2 Member of the Board at the beginning of the  
3 meeting and are available at the public  
4 comment table.

5 We received one comment from Donna  
6 Ciafre. I've reviewed the comment and ask  
7 that it be moved into the record. It will  
8 be available on the public comment table.

9 JUDGE CRUMLISH: So that will  
10 be accepted. I have read and reviewed it as  
11 well as I said so it will be admitted into  
12 the public record. So having said that, are  
13 there any other e-mails that were sent to  
14 us, Judge Furlong?

15 JUDGE FURLONG: Nothing else.

16 JUDGE CRUMLISH: So now I'll  
17 move to old business. I'm going to ask  
18 Director Lynch to read the executive  
19 director's report, please.

20 MR. LYNCH: Good afternoon,  
21 Commissioners. Today's Sunshine report for  
22 October 18, 2023, the County Board of  
23 Election Report. The County Board of  
24 Elections is now accepting mail-in and

1 absentee ballot applications. Voters will  
2 need to complete and return their  
3 application to the County Board of Elections  
4 Office by 5:00 p.m. on October 31st to vote  
5 by mail for the 2023 general election.  
6 Voters may apply online at [vote.phila.gov](http://vote.phila.gov)  
7 rather than returning the paper  
8 applications.

9           As of yesterday, they have  
10 approved 98,086 vote-by-mail applications  
11 which is 3,939 added from last week's total.  
12 Of those, 59,455 are paper applications and  
13 38,631 are electronic applications. This  
14 includes civilian, overseas, and military  
15 voters. We have a total of 884 applications  
16 waiting to be processed. Of those, 457 are  
17 paper applications and 427 are electronic  
18 applications.

19           On Tuesday, October 10th, they  
20 opened the satellite office at City Hall in  
21 Room 130. So far, they have serviced 67  
22 walk-in voters. Voters can request a  
23 mail-in or replacement ballot in person and  
24 return it all on the same visit. Office

1 hours are Monday through Friday (inaudible).

2 - - -

6 MR. LYNCH: For the satellite  
7 office, I'm sorry. For the satellite  
8 office, strike that. I said Room 130. It's  
9 Room 140. Sorry about that.

10 JUDGE CRUMLISH: Thank you,  
11 Director. So now, Mr. Stroman, I'd like to  
12 move to present the polling place proposed  
13 recommendations. Is there anyone here who  
14 would like to speak on the polling places?

15 (No response).

16 JUDGE CRUMLISH: Hearing  
17 none, Mr. Stroman, could you present the  
18 polling place recommendations?

19 MR. STROMAN: Good morning,  
20 your Honor. The first three are in the 23rd  
21 Ward; the 5th Division, 6th Division, and  
22 7th Division moving out of Frankford Friends  
23 School at 1500 Orthodox Street to Unique  
24 Dreams at 4704 Leiper Street and that is all



1 due to a refusal.

2 JUDGE CRUMLISH: On  
3 recommendation of the professional staff, I  
4 move that we accept the proposed polling  
5 place changes. Do I hear a second?

6 JUDGE FURLONG: Second as to  
7 all three changes.

8 JUDGE CRUMLISH: All in  
9 favor?  
10 (Aye).

11 JUDGE CRUMLISH: The proposed  
12 relocations are accepted.

13 MR. STROMAN: Next one is in  
14 the 37th Ward, 13th Division moving out of  
15 Hartranft School at 720 West Cumberland  
16 Street to the Greater Impact Worship Center  
17 at 2431 North 6th Street and that's back to  
18 the original location.

19 JUDGE CRUMLISH: I move that  
20 we accept the proposal of the professional  
21 staff for the relocation in the 37th Ward,  
22 13th. Do I hear a second?

23 JUDGE FURLONG: Second.

24 JUDGE CRUMLISH: All in

1 favor?

2 (Aye).

3 JUDGE CRUMLISH: The proposal  
4 is adopted.

5 MR. STROMAN: Next two are in  
6 the 38th Ward, 5th Division and 6th Division  
7 moving out of EW Rhodes School at 2900 West  
8 Clearfield Street to the Shuler Rec Center  
9 at 3000 North 27th Street and that's back to  
10 the original location.

11 JUDGE CRUMLISH: I move that  
12 we accept the proposed relocation of the  
13 professional staff. Do I hear a second?

14 JUDGE FURLONG: Second.

15 JUDGE CRUMLISH: All in  
16 favor?

17 (Aye).

18 JUDGE CRUMLISH: So adopted.

19 MR. STROMAN: Next one is in  
20 the 40th Ward, 5th Division moving out of  
21 Greenway Presbyterian Apartments at 2001  
22 South 59th Street to Salt & Light at 5736  
23 Chester Avenue and that is due to a refusal.

24 JUDGE CRUMLISH: I move to

1 accept the recommendation of the  
2 professional staff. Second?

3 JUDGE FURLONG: Second.

4 JUDGE CRUMLISH: All in  
5 favor?

6 (Aye).

7 JUDGE CRUMLISH: It's been  
8 accepted.

9 MR. STROMAN: Next one is in  
10 the 46th Ward, 10th Division moving out of  
11 Victory Christian Center at 5220 Whitby  
12 Avenue to the People's Baptist Church at  
13 5037 Baltimore Avenue and that is moving it  
14 into its ward.

15 JUDGE CRUMLISH: I move that  
16 we accept the recommendation of the  
17 professional staff for the relocation of the  
18 polling place as stated. Do I hear a  
19 second?

20 JUDGE FURLONG: Second as to  
21 that change.

22 JUDGE CRUMLISH: All in  
23 favor?

24 (Aye).

1 JUDGE CRUMLISH: Moved and  
2 seconded based on professional staff and  
3 adopted.

4 MR. STROMAN: Last but not  
5 least in the 46th Ward in the 11th Division  
6 moving out of Christy Rec Center at 728  
7 South 55th Street to the People's Baptist  
8 Church at 5037 Baltimore Avenue and that is  
9 for voter convenience.

10 JUDGE CRUMLISH: I move that  
11 we adopt the recommendation of professional  
12 staff from the Commissioner's Office for the  
13 relocation. Do I hear a second?

14 JUDGE FURLONG: Second.

15 JUDGE CRUMLISH: All in  
16 favor?

17 (Aye).

18 JUDGE CRUMLISH: It is  
19 adopted. We will move on to the next matter  
20 of business. I'd like to propose a motion.  
21 The motion is that the County Board of  
22 Elections shall place fixed traditional  
23 dropboxes throughout the city with one  
24 additional box in each of the following

1 regions: Lower Northeast, North, River,  
2 Southwest, Upper North, and West.

3 I further move that the deputy  
4 shall arrange installation of the dropboxes  
5 and shall report the locations of the  
6 installations at the immediate next public  
7 meeting of the Board of Elections and shall  
8 publicize the dropbox locations when they  
9 are installed and ready to be opened for use  
10 to the general public on [vote.phila.gov](http://vote.phila.gov). Do  
11 I have a second?

12 JUDGE FURLONG: Second.

13 JUDGE CRUMLISH: All in  
14 favor?

15 (Aye).

16 JUDGE CRUMLISH: The motion  
17 is adopted. Second motion. I move that we  
18 authorize the deputies to schedule mobile  
19 van dropoff events. The information on the  
20 events shall be posted on [vote.phila.gov](http://vote.phila.gov) and  
21 be announced at the next public meeting of  
22 the Board following the announcement of the  
23 schedule. Do I hear a second?

24 JUDGE FURLONG: Second.

1 JUDGE CRUMLISH: All in  
2 favor?

3 (Aye).

4 JUDGE CRUMLISH: Motion is  
5 adopted. Judge Furlong, do you have any  
6 other items to be added to the agenda?

7 JUDGE FURLONG: No, Mr.  
8 Chairman.

9 JUDGE CRUMLISH: Judge  
10 Johnson, do you have any items to be added  
11 to the agenda?

12 JUDGE JOHNSON: No, Mr.  
13 Chairman.

14 JUDGE CRUMLISH: Thank you.  
15 Having no further business, I move that we  
16 adjourn from the call of the Chair. All in  
17 favor?

18 (Aye).

19 JUDGE CRUMLISH: Thank you.

Good afternoon. My name is Donna Ciafre and I am the Committee Woman in the 26th Ward, 5th Division. With such an important election coming up next month, and the terrible turn out in the primary, I have a lot of constituents utilizing the mail-in ballot process.
