1 P R O C E E D I N G S

2 (4:30 P.M.)

3 CHAIRMAN SABIR: Good morning. Now I call to
4 order the meeting of the Philadelphia City
5 Commissioner's Board of Election for Wednesday,
6 October 30, 2024. This meeting is in compliance with
7 the Pennsylvania Sunshine Act. The Philadelphia City
8 Commissioners are a three-member bipartisan board of
9 elected officials in charge of elections and voter
10 registration for the City of Philadelphia.

11 Each Commissioner is elected to serve a four-year
12 term that coincides with the municipal election cycle
13 for Mayor and City Council. The Commissioner set and
14 enforced departmental policies to administer voter
15 registration and conduct elections in accordance with
16 federal and state voter registration and election
17 laws. The City Commissioners were created by the
18 Pennsylvania Assembly in 1711 with a focus on taxation
19 and held various regulatory powers throughout the
20 centuries.

21 The Commissioner started maintaining voter lists
22 in 1799 and took on more election-related
23 responsibilities, but didn't emerge in its current
24 form until the adoption of Philadelphia Home Rules
25 Charter in 1951. We will start off with public

1 comments. Before beginning their comments, commenters
2 shall state where they live or if they are not a
3 resident of Philadelphia and that they are a
4 Philadelphia taxpayer.

5 Public comment is not an opportunity for dialogue
6 or Q&A. It is public comment, a chance for you to
7 tell us what you think. Each speaker will have two
8 minutes to speak. However, I may extend the time at
9 my discretion. Public comment must concern matters on
10 today's meeting agenda.

11 Finally, it is my responsibility to preserve the
12 aura and decorum of the meetings. As such profane,
13 slanderous, discriminatory, or personal attacks will
14 not be tolerated. If you wish to make a public
15 objection to a perceived Sunshine violation, please
16 raise your hand and I will recognize you. Outbursts
17 will not be tolerated. Anyone wishing to offer public
18 comment, please step forward. Good morning.

19 MS. ROWE: Good morning.

20 CHAIRMAN SABIR: Please state your name for the
21 record.

22 MS. ROWE: My name is Debbie Rowe.

23 CHAIRMAN SABIR: Thank you, Debbie. I think it's
24 on.

25 MS. ROWE: Okay, commissioner. I, I voted for

1 you. And I know that you tried your best to do a
2 great job and that's why I came here because I know
3 you probably busy, but you assigned Khalif to me about
4 -- I would say three months -- I mean three weeks ago
5 and really nothing happened. And Khalif, you assigned
6 them to me the last Wednesday and he assigned me to
7 Vincent and nothing really happened.

8 And I'm really concerned, you know, for all
9 voters, Democrats, Republicans, we're having -- we had
10 six divisions that were supposed to vote at the Church
11 of the Advocate in the upcoming election. Now we have
12 seven divisions. It's a lot. So I'm trying to
13 prepare so that it be, you know, every voter will have
14 an opportunity to be serviced in a professional way.
15 And I am really getting in nowhere with them.

16 I tried to send a list of the small things like,
17 you know, could you tell me the divisions that are
18 going to be there because it might be more than seven
19 now. And so that signs can be created so I can set up
20 that those lines in a professional manner so they can
21 be escorted into the polling place so they can vote.
22 And just having like not asking for much, just asking
23 for opportunities to service the community.

24 And I'm having a difficult time along with them
25 putting a whole new board there that I absolutely have

1 no clue who's going to be there or if they're going to
2 show up on time. If I step up to the plate and, you
3 know, open the polls, which, you know, they kind of
4 kicked me out of there. But, you know, I'm saying I
5 want every voter to have an opportunity to vote in a
6 timely, professional manner. And I have some concerns
7 with that. That just has not been addressed.

8 CHAIRMAN SABIR: Sure. After the meeting, I'll
9 sit down, we'll go over a few things.

10 MS. ROWE: Thank you so much.

11 CHAIRMAN SABIR: But just for the record, you
12 know, Khalif and Vincent, they don't establish the
13 polling locations, they don't establish the election
14 boards.

15 MS. ROWE: Yeah, I know -- I know.

16 CHAIRMAN SABIR: Okay.

17 MS. ROWE: Khalif did try and put me in that
18 realm to give me a little bit more support in that
19 area, you know, but just still didn't get anywhere.

20 CHAIRMAN SABIR: Okay. Well, I'll be around
21 after the meeting. Thanks for coming up.

22 MS. ROWE: Thank you, sir.

23 CHAIRMAN SABIR: Are there any more other public
24 commenters? We will now move to report from Secretary
25 Bluestein. Are there any email public comments?

1 MR. BLUESTEIN: Thank you, Chairman. All
2 comments that were emailed by 9:45 a.m. were shared
3 with the commissioners and deputies by 10 a.m. and
4 have been provided to each commissioner at the
5 beginning of the meeting and are available at the
6 public comment table.

7 We've received two comments for this week's
8 meeting from Karen Silverman and Erica Wallace related
9 to accessing a polling place by 6 a.m. to set up for
10 the election and about mail-in ballot instructions. I
11 have reviewed the comments and asked that they be
12 moved into the record.

13 MS. DEELEY: I have also reviewed them and agree
14 that they should be moved into the record.

15 CHAIRMAN SABIR: I have also reviewed them.
16 Please move them into the record. We will now proceed
17 to old business. First, we have a report from our
18 directors of Election and Administration Operations,
19 Mr. Joseph Lynch, Ms. Stephanie Reed. Joe, we'll
20 start off with you.

21 MR. LYNCH: Morning, commissioners.

22 CHAIRMAN SABIR: Morning, Joe.

23 MR. LYNCH: This is our report for October 30th,
24 2024. In the election cycle to date, we have
25 processed 448,290 voter registration applications,

1 227,450 of those applications were paper. They are
2 working on processing 16,000 HAVA verifications and
3 will be mailing 38,000 ID cards later this week.
4 Delran Spring Garden is helping to process the mail-in
5 applications.

6 As of October 29th, a total of 228,777 vote-by-
7 mail ballots were sent out to the -- for the 2024
8 general election. Excuse me. We have approved vote
9 by mail and absentee applications, which is 32,603
10 added from last week's total. Of those, 117,590 are
11 paper applications and 111,187 are electronic
12 applications. This includes military, civilian, and
13 overseas, and federal voters. We currently have a
14 total of 2,087 applications waiting to be processed.
15 Of those, 850 are paper applications and 1,237 are
16 electronic applications.

17 ID verification letters have gone out to voters
18 that either did not include the required proof of
19 identification on our absentee/mail-in ballot
20 application or their proof of identification could not
21 be verified by the County Board of Elections Office.
22 Voters who have received this letter may submit their
23 proof of ID to the county board of elections via email
24 @phillyelections@phila.gov, fax, US mail, telephone,
25 or in person.

1 Voters have until 5 p.m. on November 12 to return
2 their proof of identification for the General
3 Election. The deadline for to apply for the mail-in
4 ballot was yesterday, October 29th. Voters can still
5 request a replacement ballot until election day,
6 Tuesday, November 5th. If an emergency comes up, you
7 may submit an emergency application to the County
8 Board of Elections Office. To receive an emergency
9 absentee ballot you must provide a valid emergency
10 reason on your application.

11 Voters who are over the age of 65 or living with
12 a permanent disability may also obtain an alternative
13 ballot if their polling place is not fully handicapped
14 accessible. The County Board of Elections Office will
15 remain open until Election Day. Office hours are
16 Monday through Friday, 9 a.m. to 5 p.m., Saturday and
17 Sunday, 10 a.m. to 4 p.m., and election day they will
18 be open from 7 a.m. to 8 p.m. Further information is
19 available on our website at vote.phila.gov.

20 The election board unit is working on confirming
21 board workers through calls and emails. We have
22 confirmed 8,689 so far, but 291 had declined. In the
23 general election training sessions 4,271 board workers
24 attended and 872 confirmed for scheduled training. We
25 have confirmed 1,226 board workers for online

1 training. Yesterday our 10 satellite election
2 officers served an estimated of 3,864 customers for
3 the mail-in ballot deadline day.

4 I would like to thank the staff to all -- for all
5 locations for working diligently to keep smooth flow
6 so that every customer was served in time for the
7 deadline. And I would like to add that I would like
8 to sincerely thank all the workers throughout the
9 department for their hard work and getting all the
10 voter registrations processed, the mail-in
11 applications processed, the online applications and we
12 couldn't have done it without the support of the
13 Managing Director's office. We appreciate that too.

14 And the satellite offices, they were very helpful
15 in doing daily work in between customers coming in to
16 get a mail-in ballot. So thanks and kudos to all and
17 good luck Tuesday. And also I'd like to thank all
18 three commissioners for your support for this. Thank
19 you.

20 CHAIRMAN SABIR: Thank you, Joe. Vice-chair
21 Deeley, do you have any questions?

22 MS. DEELEY: I have none. Thank you, Joe.

23 CHAIRMAN SABIR: Secretary Bluestein, do you have
24 any questions?

25 MR. BLUESTEIN: I do not. Thank you.

1 CHAIRMAN SABIR: I don't have any questions
2 either. Thank you, Joe. Stephanie?

3 MS. REED: Good morning, commissioners. I'm
4 pleased to address you today and share our final
5 update in advance of the general election on November
6 5th. I'd like to congratulate all of our staff who
7 contributed to standing up and running our 10
8 satellite election offices. This effort required
9 support from all of our teams and they did an
10 excellent job working together to provide this
11 expanded access for Philadelphia voters.

12 This past Friday we hosted a press walk-through
13 at our election warehouse. We had 34 media
14 professionals in attendance and were able to track
15 stories across all of the outlets in attendance. The
16 coverage was accurate and informative. Thank you,
17 commissioners, for your support and participation in
18 the event. We're now working on plans and schedules
19 to support communication needs on and around Election
20 Day.

21 I'd like to thank our communications colleagues
22 from the city departments who have been working with
23 us and will be supporting in person. And just this
24 morning we got out a press release announcing the
25 campaign that we are running. In human resources, our

1 total workforce stands at 226 employees with 188 in
2 civil service and 35 exempt. This includes 56 clerk
3 ones, 33 clerk twos, 17 clerk threes, 9 trades
4 helpers, 9 voting machine techs, and 43 temps. We're
5 continuing with the final new hire activities.

6 Our IT team has been providing technical support
7 for all satellite election offices. They've been
8 updating surveys and signup forms, posting notices,
9 and maintaining our website. They've also been
10 working on the Call Center, Asset Retrieval Center,
11 and Poll Worker Dashboard. The team tested the Call
12 Center Dashboard this past weekend and the test went
13 very well.

14 Please note for the public record that anyone
15 wishing to be present at our ballot counting facility
16 will need credentials. We will have extremely limited
17 parking, which will be on a first-come, first-serve
18 basis. We're encouraging people to carpool when
19 possible. Once our parking lot is full, street
20 parking will be available across Roosevelt Boulevard.
21 And for anyone who missed the mail ballot application
22 deadline or prefers to vote in person, you can check
23 your polling place on our website @vote.villa.gov.

24 We look forward to seeing you at the polls on
25 Tuesday and to all of our election workers, thank you

1 for showing up and getting it done. This truly is a
2 team effort and we couldn't do it without each of you.

3 CHAIRMAN SABIR: Thank you. Vice-chair Deeley,
4 do you have any questions?

5 MS. DEELEY: I have none.

6 MS. REED: Secretary Bluestein, do you have any
7 questions?

8 MR. BLUESTEIN: I have none. Thank you.

9 CHAIRMAN SABIR: Okay. Stephanie, I noticed I
10 didn't see anything with procurement. Just to be good
11 for procurement.

12 MS. REED: You know what? I just accidentally
13 deleted that line. Yeah, they're just processing
14 everything normally as they would be right now. I
15 don't know of anything that's a flag.

16 CHAIRMAN SABIR: Okay.

17 MS. REED: Yeah.

18 CHAIRMAN SABIR: As you know, let me know.

19 MS. REED: Yeah. Thank you.

20 CHAIRMAN SABIR: Sure. Thank you. This
21 completes our old business for today's meeting. We
22 will now proceed to new business. We will begin by
23 considering our first agenda item. The motion to
24 deputize and authorize the Philadelphia Board of
25 Election Staff to prepare for and conduct the pre-

1 canvas and canvas of absentee mail-in ballots for the
2 2024 general election. Is there a second?

3 MS. DEELEY: Second.

4 MR. BLUESTEIN: Second.

5 CHAIRMAN SABIR: Okay. I mean, I didn't read the
6 motion yet. It was fast. I'll read the motion.

7 Well, that was the motion. Oh. Anybody want any make
8 any comments before we proceed to vote?

9 MS. DEELEY: I have none.

10 MR. BLUESTEIN: I have no comments. Thank you.

11 CHAIRMAN SABIR: Secretary Bluestein, please call
12 the roll.

13 MR. BLUESTEIN: Vice-chair Deeley.

14 MS. DEELEY: I vote aye.

15 MR. BLUESTEIN: I vote aye. Chairman Sabir.

16 CHAIRMAN SABIR: Aye. Okay. That was the last
17 item on our agenda before we adjourn. Commissioner
18 Deeley, did you have any business to be raised at this
19 meeting?

20 MS. DEELEY: Yes, Mr. Chairman, if I may.

21 CHAIRMAN SABIR: Yes, you may.

22 MS. DEELEY: I would just like to say that today
23 being our last meeting in the month of October, I
24 would like to just take a moment to remember and
25 recognize all those who have been afflicted with

1 breast cancer. About every two minutes, somewhere in
2 the United States, someone is diagnosed with breast
3 cancer. Several years back, that someone was my
4 mother, who I am proud to say is cancer-free for
5 another year.

6 But I take this moment to just remind everyone
7 that early detection is key. And I have my pink on.
8 Just to remind everybody throughout the day that
9 October is Breast Cancer Awareness Month. And take
10 care of yourselves. Thank you, Chairman.

11 CHAIRMAN SABIR: Thank you. Secretary Bluestein,
12 do you have any other business to be raised at this
13 meeting?

14 MR. BLUESTEIN: Thank you, Chairman. I would
15 just like to reiterate our gratitude to Joe,
16 Stephanie, and the team for the amazing job and
17 Vanessa, the amazing job that you all did with the
18 satellite election offices yesterday. I know how much
19 went into preparing for this and there was a lot of
20 use by our constituents yesterday and everyone was
21 really, really grateful for all of the accessibility
22 that this department provided. So thank you.

23 CHAIRMAN SABIR: Thank you. I would also like to
24 thank all of our staff, and of course, you know, all
25 of the city. I mean, the mayor's office, managing

1 director's office, all the independent offices. Page 16
2 really is a true togetherness work in the city to get
3 this election done. So on that, I make a motion to
4 adjourn the meeting. Is there a second?

5 MS. DEELEY: Second.

6 CHAIRMAN SABIR: Secretary Bluestein, please call
7 the roll.

8 MR. BLUESTEIN: Vice-chair Deeley.

9 MS. DEELEY: I vote aye.

10 MR. BLUESTEIN: I vote aye. Chairman Sabir.

11 CHAIRMAN SABIR: Aye. This meeting is adjourned.
