- 1 JUDGE CRUMLISH: Good
- 2 morning, everyone. I'm going to call to
- 3 order the public meeting for the Return
- 4 Board of the 2023 general and special
- 5 election and we have now reconvened.
- 6 As you recall, I will remind
- 7 everyone that it is my duty and obligation
- 8 to maintain order and decorum during these
- 9 proceedings and therefore abuse,
- 10 interruptions -- does permit anyone
- 11 attending a public meeting to object to a
- 12 perceived violation at any time during the
- 13 meeting. If you choose to do so, please
- 14 succinctly state your objection and I'm
- 15 reminding you that an objection is not an
- 16 opportunity for litigation, speechmaking, or
- 17 interrogation.
- 18 We will now move to public
- 19 comment. Commentors shall state where they
- 20 live, if they are not a resident of
- 21 Philadelphia that they are a Philadelphia
- 22 taxpayer, or since this is a Return Board,
- 23 which candidate they represent. Public
- 24 comment is not an opportunity for, as I've

- 1 said, speechmaking, dialogue, interrogation,
- 2 or questions and answers. It's a public
- 3 comment; a chance for you to tell us what
- 4 you think.
- 5 Each speaker shall be allotted two
- 6 minutes. However, I may extend that time at
- 7 my discretion. I remind everyone all public
- 8 comments must be relevant or germane to the
- 9 Board business. Finally, again, it's my
- 10 responsibility to preserve the good order
- 11 and decorum of this meeting and personal
- 12 attacks will not be tolerated and that
- includes profane, slanderous,
- 14 discriminatory, or personal attacks. If
- 15 such misconduct occurs, the parties may be
- 16 called to remove themselves from the
- 17 meeting.
- Now, do we have anyone who wishes
- 19 to make a public comment?
- 20 (No response).
- JUDGE CRUMLISH: Hearing
- 22 none, we will then proceed. Judge Furlong,
- 23 have we received any e-mail public comments?
- JUDGE FURLONG: No, Mr.

- 1 Chair. There were no public comments
- 2 e-mailed by 9:45 a.m.
- JUDGE CRUMLISH: Having said
- 4 that, we'll move on to new business. I'm
- 5 going to call on Ms. Eckroade to present the
- 6 mail ballot sufficiency determinations.
- 7 Good morning -- or good afternoon as it may
- 8 be.
- 9 MS. ECKROADE: So for blank
- 10 declaration envelope, we have 124.
- JUDGE CRUMLISH: And all of
- 12 my votes I believe are going to be
- 13 consistent with controlling Pennsylvania law
- 14 and the Election Code. And as to Item 1, I
- 15 would vote no for blank declaration
- 16 envelopes to be accepted. Do I hear a
- 17 second?
- JUDGE FURLONG: Second.
- 19 JUDGE CRUMLISH: All in
- 20 favor?
- 21 (Aye).
- JUDGE CRUMLISH: Those votes
- 23 will not be counted -- or those blank
- 24 envelopes won't be counted.

1	MS. ECKROADE: Missing
2	signature, we have 18.
3	JUDGE CRUMLISH: I would vote
4	no to accept return envelopes with missing
5	signatures. Do I hear a second?
6	JUDGE FURLONG: Second.
7	JUDGE CRUMLISH: All in
8	favor?
9	(Aye).
10	JUDGE CRUMLISH: You may
11	proceed.
12	MS. ECKROADE: Ballots not
13	enclosed in secrecy envelope, we have 966.
14	JUDGE CRUMLISH: I would vote
15	to not accept those ballots that do not
16	include the secrecy envelope. Do I hear a
17	second?
18	JUDGE FURLONG: Second.
19	JUDGE CRUMLISH: All in
20	favor?
21	(Aye).
22	JUDGE CRUMLISH: Next?
23	MS. ECKROADE: Signed by
24	another individual other than voter, we have

1	five.
2	JUDGE CRUMLISH: I would vote
3	to not accept these ballot envelopes that
4	are signed by somebody other than the voter.
5	Do I hear a second?
6	JUDGE FURLONG: Second.
7	JUDGE CRUMLISH: All in
8	favor?
9	(Aye).
10	JUDGE CRUMLISH: Please
11	reflect that all of the votes cast so far
12	have been unanimous by the Board. The next
13	would be the missing date.
14	MS. ECKROADE: Missing date,
15	we have 1,944.
16	JUDGE CRUMLISH: And I would
17	vote constant with Pennsylvania law
18	controlling Pennsylvania law that we not
19	accept the missing dated envelopes. Do I
20	hear a second?
21	JUDGE FURLONG: Second.
22	JUDGE CRUMLISH: All in
23	favor?
24	(Aye).

- 1 JUDGE CRUMLISH: The next
- 2 would be -- you may proceed. I'm sorry.
- 3 MS. ECKROADE: Incorrectly
- 4 dated, 385.
- 5 JUDGE CRUMLISH: Also
- 6 constant with Pennsylvania law, I would vote
- 7 no to accept incorrectly-dated ballot
- 8 envelopes. Do I hear a second?
- JUDGE FURLONG: Second.
- 10 JUDGE CRUMLISH: All in
- 11 favor, say aye.
- 12 (Aye).
- 13 JUDGE CRUMLISH: Being
- 14 projected now on the screen are what appears
- 15 to be voter registration envelopes or ballot
- 16 envelopes.
- MS. ECKROADE: These were
- 18 damaged by the post office.
- JUDGE CRUMLISH: As you can
- 20 see, the signature has been -- and/or date
- 21 has been destroyed or otherwise unreadable
- 22 as a result of the handling by the postal
- 23 department. I would vote yes to accept
- 24 those ballots as these are not the result of

- 1 the action of the voter but rather the
- 2 processing of the United States Postal
- 3 Department. All in favor?
- 4 (Aye).
- 5 JUDGE CRUMLISH: Next?
- 6 MS. ECKROADE: ID
- 7 verification, no Social Security or driver's
- 8 license on Shore file. So these voters sent
- 9 back a letter, however, there was no
- 10 information on their Shore record to verify
- 11 against. We have four.
- JUDGE CRUMLISH: Okay.
- 13 Having no other defects in the ballot, I
- 14 would vote to accept this category. Do I
- 15 hear a second?
- 16 JUDGE JOHNSON: I second.
- JUDGE CRUMLISH: All in
- 18 favor?
- JUDGE JOHNSON: Aye.
- JUDGE CRUMLISH: Is that a
- 21 dissent? That's fine. Judge Furlong by
- 22 dissent. The next, please?
- MS. ECKROADE: ID
- 24 verification, ID provided opposite of what

1	is on Shore file. We have ten.
2	JUDGE CRUMLISH: As it does
3	not appear to be the result of misconduct by
4	the voter, I would vote to accept these
5	ballots as preferred. Do I hear a second?
6	JUDGE JOHNSON: I second.
7	JUDGE CRUMLISH: All in
8	favor?
9	JUDGE JOHNSON: Aye.
10	JUDGE CRUMLISH: Judge
11	Furlong registers his dissent. That's what
12	I would describe as a strong nay. The next
13	category?
14	MS. ECKROADE: ID
15	verification, ID doesn't match Shore file.
16	We have one.
17	JUDGE CRUMLISH: I would vote
18	to not accept that ballot. Do I hear a
19	second?
20	JUDGE FURLONG: Second.
21	JUDGE JOHNSON: Second.
22	JUDGE CRUMLISH: All in
23	favor?
24	(Aye).

1	JUDGE CRUMLISH: Please
2	reflect the unanimous consent of the Board.
3	Next, please?
4	MS. ECKROADE: And lastly, ID
5	verification, no response. We have 324.
6	JUDGE CRUMLISH: I would vote
7	no to accept the ID verification, no
8	response category.
9	JUDGE FURLONG: Second.
10	JUDGE CRUMLISH: All in
11	favor?
12	(Aye).
13	JUDGE CRUMLISH: Again, a
14	unanimous consent of the Board. Do we have
15	any additional non-agenda items?
16	(No response).
17	JUDGE CRUMLISH: So having
18	said that and concluded all the business of
19	the Return Board, this Board and the
20	Commission will stand in recess until the
21	call of the Chair. Thank you very much,
22	everyone.
23
