3	MR. SABIR: Good evening. I call to order the
4	meeting of the Philadelphia City Commissioners Return
5	Board from November 19th. This meeting is in
6	compliance with the Pennsylvania Sunshine Act.
7	The Philadelphia City Commissioners are a three-
8	member bipartisan board of elected officials in charge
9	of elections and have voter registration for the City
10	of Philadelphia. Each Commissioner is elected to
11	serve a four-year term that coincides with the
12	municipal election cycle for Mayor and City Council.
13	The Commissioners set and enforced departmental
14	policies to administer voter registration and conduct
15	elections in accordance with Federal and State Board
16	of Registration and Election laws. The City
17	Commissioners were created by the Pennsylvania
18	assembly in 1711 with a focus on taxation and held
19	various regulatory powers throughout the centuries.
20	The Commissioner started maintaining voter lists
21	in 1799 and took on more election related
22	responsibilities but didn't emerge into its current
23	form until the adoption of Philadelphia Homeland
24	Charter in 1951.
25	We will start off with public comments. Before
1	

- 1 beginning their comments, commenters should state
- 2 where they live or if they are not a resident of
- 3 Philadelphia, that they are a Philadelphia taxpayer.
- 4 Public comment is not an opportunity for dialogue
- 5 or Q&A. It is public comment, a chance for you to
- 6 tell us what you think. Each speaker will have two
- 7 minutes to speak. However, I may extend the time at
- 8 my discretion. Public comment must concern matters on
- 9 today's meeting agenda.
- 10 Finally, it is my responsibility to preserve the
- 11 order and decorum of the meetings. As such, profane,
- 12 slanderous, discriminatory or personal attacks will
- 13 not be tolerated. If you wish to make a public
- 14 objection to a perceived Sunshine violation, please
- 15 raise your hand and I will recognize you. Outbursts
- 16 will not be tolerated.
- 17 Anyone wishing to offer public comment, please
- 18 step forward. Seeing none, we will now move to report
- 19 from Secretary for email public comments.
- 20 Commissioner Bluestein, are there any email public
- 21 comments?
- 22 MR. BLUESTEIN: There were no email public
- 23 comments.
- MR. SABIR: We will now proceed to new business.
- 25 We will begin by considering the first agenda item

- 1 under New Business. The recent PA Supreme Court Order
- 2 in RNC v. 67 counties. Yesterday, the Supreme Court
- 3 issued an order directing all counties and
- 4 specifically including Philadelphia county not to
- 5 count undated and incorrectly dated mail ballots
- 6 submitted for the November 5, 2024 General Election.
- 7 At our November 13, 2024 meeting, this board
- 8 voted to count a total of 607 undated and incorrectly
- 9 dated ballots. In keeping with yesterday's
- 10 Pennsylvania Supreme Court order, I move that this
- 11 board does not count all categories of mail in ballots
- 12 with undated and/or incorrectly dated ballots. Is
- 13 there a second?
- MR. BLUESTEIN: Second.
- 15 MR. SABIR: Would any Commissioner like to make
- 16 any comments before we proceed to vote?
- 17 MS. DEELEY: Yes, Chairman, if I may.
- 18 MR. SABIR: You may.
- 19 MS. DEELEY: As you all know, I feel strongly
- 20 that these voters should be allowed to have their
- 21 voices heard. From a strictly moral position,
- 22 silencing voters, many of who are already the most
- 23 vulnerable in society because they got the date
- 24 incorrect is just wrong. Full stop. I mean, in the
- 25 primary, we threw out ballots because people did not

- 1 know what number month March is.
- I have been consistently in favor of counting
- 3 these ballots through generals and primaries. This is
- 4 not something I stumbled on recently and certainly not
- 5 to help any one candidate as some have implied. 1
- 6 would feel the same on the board of deep blue
- 7 Philadelphia as I would if I was on the board of deep
- 8 red Tioga County.
- 9 Though the Supreme Court has ordered us to not
- 10 count these ballots, they once again chose not to rule
- 11 on the constitutionality of disenfranchising voters
- 12 who failed to correctly date their declaration
- 13 envelope. This question remains an open issue. So
- 14 all the headlines -- all the headlines we have been
- 15 seeing the last few days about Pennsylvania election
- 16 boards defying court orders are disappointing.
- In fact, in Philadelphia, we had an unstayed
- 18 ruling from our Common Pleas Court to count them. But
- 19 we have now been ordered to discard these votes, to
- 20 silence these voices. It appears that our effort to
- 21 get these ballots to count in 2024 is at an end.
- 22 As I said in my statement yesterday, I will
- 23 continue to fight through every viable legal avenue
- 24 available to me, but I am out of avenues. Thank you.
- 25 MR. SABIR: Thank you. Secretary?

- 1 MR. BLUESTEIN: I have nothing to add. Thank
- 2 you.
- 3 MR. SABIR: Thank you. Please call the rule.
- 4 MR. BLUESTEIN: Vice Chair Deeley?
- 5 MS. DEELEY: I vote aye.
- 6 MR. BLUESTEIN: I vote aye. Chairman Sabir?
- 7 MR. SABIR: Aye. With that motion passed and in
- 8 compliance with the PA Supreme Court order, the board
- 9 will not include any of the 607 undated or incorrectly
- 10 dated ballots in its computation numbers.
- 11 We will now move to the second item of new
- 12 business on our agenda, results of the canvas and
- 13 computation. Dana, would you please read the results?
- 14 Thank you. And let the record reflect that Dana just
- 15 gave us a copy of the computation results that she's
- 16 about to read.
- 17 MS. ECKROADE: Hello, Commissioners.
- 18 MR. SABIR: Hey, Dana.
- 19 MS. ECKROADE: Okay. So for President and Vice
- 20 President of the United States, Kamala D. Harris and
- 21 Tim Walz, 567,871 votes. Donald J. Trump and J.D.
- 22 Vance, 144,154. Chase Oliver and Mike ter Maat,
